

Each tool has a special purpose in the garden and does a particular job very well. I like using the garden fork in the beds of the garden to weed because it loosens the dirt around the weed and makes it easier to remove. After weeding we do some replanting or pruning. We recently bought some lettuce and replanted them into the raised beds. We also pruned the orange tree and lilikoi vine." We are currently deciding what else we should plant and how we can convert more of the plot space into raised garden beds. I felt like working a Transitional Employment (TE) position and when Goodwill Kaimuki reopened in 2022 I got cold feet. Going to work was a little bit scary. I didn't know if I'd be able to stick it out.
