

He has invested more than a €100 million in telecoms in Ireland, mainly through his acquisition and expansion of Irish telecoms firm Enet, which he purchased in 2013 and recently sold to the State-backed Irish Infrastructure Fund.


He made his fortune from the sale of his US phone company, Corporate Communications Network, to WorldCom for \$14 billion (€12 billion) in the 1980s. World.com later went bankrupt.

He owns a number of other businesses in the UK and around Europe but insists his Irish operation is central to his plans.
