

time supporter of the Arizona Agricultural Education/FFA Foundation. His involvement began in 2003 through an invitation by Foundation Board member, Heather Rayner. At that time, he was working with the FFA on both the state and national levels. George shared, "She suggested it would be fun." He served from 2004 - 2014 and worked with Presidents Ken Williams and Cliff Saylor over those years. He became president in 2010 and served until he retired from Arizona State University in 2014. Upon retiring from the board in 2014, George planned that his commitments in the agricultural industry would pull back but

through his passion for the industry, he has continued to stay involved in many capacities over the past six years.

Born and raised in Chicago, Illinois, George received his Bachelor of Science, Biology from Loyola University in Chicago, and his Master of Science and PhD in Food Science/Human Nutrition from Michigan State University. He served in the U.S. Army (1968-1970) and in Vietnam (1969-1970) with the 44th Medical Brigade and worked in the food industry in several capacities.

No stranger to FFA, he has been working with the FFA since the early 1980's when it all began for him through Dobson High School and the Mesa School District. "At this time, I became involved with the agriculture teachers and their association, the Arizona Agriculture Teachers Association. Because of them, the State Supervisor of Agricultural Education, William "Buddy" Diemler, now in Utah, suggested that Arizona propose some new contests for the FFA. Under his encouragement four ideas were proposed for national career development events. Three of them were adopted and remain national events: agricultural sales, agricultural marketing and food science," George shared.

One of the honors that George is very proud to have received, is the Honorary Life Membership in the Arizona Agriculture Teachers Association. "It was an honor to be considered one of them and to call them colleagues. This group made me an agricultural educator," George shared.

George is currently an Emeritus Professor of Agribusiness and Food Science in the Morrison School of Agribusiness in the W.P. Carey School of Business at Arizona State

University's Polytechnic campus in Mesa. He has served as associate dean of the Morrison School, and the director of the Division of Agriculture and helped originate the School of Agribusiness and Environmental Resources from the Division of Agriculture.

He has published numerous scientific articles, symposia, book chapters and he has written eight books, five in agribusiness and three in food science. He has been recognized as a teacher/mentor by several organizations over the years.

George served on the agricultural industry committee that established the legislation organizing and founding the Arizona Department of Agriculture (the only academic involved) and has served as liaison to the rector/president, Instituto de Tecnologico De Sonora through two presidents.

He is currently serving as President of Project CENTRL's board of directors and treasurer of the Agri-Business & Water Council of Arizona, Inc. He serves as a volunteer with many local organizations. He was elected as a member of the Agribusiness Roundtable of the Farm Foundation and serves on the National FFA Agricultural Sales Career Development committee. He serves the state as a member of Specialty Crop Block Grant program (USDA) committee and the BSE standing committee, among other state and regional committees involving food safety and agribusiness.

When asked what drives him to support FFA George shared, "The FFA is a leadership development organization. There has never been a greater need for leaders in our industry than today. Leadership is developed in the organization by allowing its members to demonstrate their leadership potential at the chapter level, then state and eventually the national stage. Leaders are prepared by experience. It can't be taught; it has to be experienced. To be a successful leader, you should not fear failure. You should learn from it. Winston Churchill said it best, "Success is not final. Failure is not fatal. It is only the will to continue that really matters." The FFA does this at all levels."

He and his wife Barbara have lived in Arizona for 40 years and have been married for 52 years. They have one son, Ilya, who is working in the film and television industry in Southern California. He would not be able to serve his community, the agriculture industry and the students he teaches without the support, dedication and strength of his wonderful wife Barbara.

"George serves as an example and inspiration for all of us who know him. George has touched the lives of so many people and his tireless service to the agricultural community will have a lasting impact for years to come. It has been a privilege to have served with George on several boards and congratulate him on this well-deserved recognition," Steve Goucher, Foundation Past President shared.

Heather Rayner, Foundation Board President shared "George Seperich is the ultimate FFA supporter. As the Associate Dean of Arizona State University's Morrison School of Agribusiness he made sure that the campus accommodated the several hundred Arizona FFA students for the winter conference each year and any other activities that were needed. George has brought in thousands of dollars to the Arizona FFA Foundation through his connections throughout the industry. He served on the Foundation board with distinction for many years, including as board president. All this passion and drive for the FFA comes from a man who never was in the FFA himself. The Arizona FFA Foundation is proud to bestow the Blue & Gold Gala award to George Seperich."

THE 2020 ARIZONA FFA AGRICULTURALIST OF THE YEAR:

RICHARD LUNT

ichard Lunt. an outstanding agriculturalist, community service leader and FFA supporter, is the recipient of the 2020 Arizona Association FFA Agriculturalist of the Year award. This award is given to a member of the agriculture community who has a strong spirit of leadership and has made a significant contribution to Arizona agriculture and the community. The Arizona FFA State Officers make the selection annually from nominations the FFA members submit from across the state.

Richard is a native of Greenlee County, Arizona and resides in Duncan. He was born while his family lived on the family farm. He grew up working on the farm, dairy and ranches. Richard attended Duncan High School where he was actively involved in FFA. He was recognized as Star Greenhand, Star Chapter Farmer and later in life became an Honorary Chapter Farmer. After high school he graduated from Eastern Arizona College and then went on to the University of Arizona where he received his bachelor's degree in Agricultural Education and Animal Science in 1979. In between college years, he served a mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in the Brazil North Mission. After graduating from the University of Arizona, he returned to the family farm where he managed the dairy part of the operation for 25 years. In later years he received his master's degree in Educational Administration from Northern Arizona University in 1991.

Richard has been a member of many associations and served in numerous leadership positions on the local, state and national level through the years. He decided to serve his community and go into politics where he is just beginning to serve his fourth term as Supervisor of Greenlee County. He served as a member and Western Interstate Region Board Member for the National Association of Counties Organization, Resource Advisory Council Member of the Bureau of Land Management, National Livestock and meat Board, National Cattleman's Beef Association, Arizona Electric Power Cooperative, Arizona Department of Agriculture, and the Arizona Beef Council just to name a few of his leadership experiences.

A few of the many honors and recognitions he has received over the years include: County Supervisor of the Year from the Eastern Counties Organization in 2020,

Distinguished Service Award from the Arizona Electric Power Cooperative in 2018, Distinguished Service Award from Project CENTRL in 2016

"I worked on the farm alongside my father, uncles and cousins. When my children were old enough, they worked alongside me as well. They were all involved in FFA, showed animals, held leadership positions and participated in competitions. FFA helped prepare them for their adult lives," Richard shared.

When asked what his fondest memory of FFA was, Richard shared, "I especially enjoyed having FFA classes come out to the dairy. I showed them things they had never done before and let them try them for themselves. I have also enjoyed watching their animals grow through the year and then helping them during the shows at the county fair and seeing their successes. I have enjoyed being a judge at state competitions and working with students from all over the state along with attending annual FFA Blue and Gold dinners and seeing the achievements of the students and the progress they have made during the year."

What drives Richard to support the FFA and youth in agriculture is his love for children. He has enjoyed working with them all his life. "I want them to have some of the same experiences that I had growing up. I want them to appreciate what agriculture does for each and every one of us. These students are our future," Richard shared.

Richard has been married to his high school sweetheart, Colleen for 44 years. They have 6 children and 16 grandchildren.

It is an honor to recognize him with this distinguished award both at the Blue & Gold Gala and the State FFA Leadership Conference in June 2021 for the significant impact he has made in the agriculture industry and supporting the FFA.






