Polish Hall History By Theresa Bonham

St Ladislaus Aid Society, aka Laddies Hall was established on May 1904, as "The Alliance of Polish Young Men Under the Patronage of St Ladislaus".

During the first few years of the society's existence, the only source of income was from the monthly member dues and meetings were held at St Adalbert's Hall and Jackson Street Hall. Later meetings were held at Sacred Heart of Jesus Catholic Church. As membership grew a bigger hall was needed; from 1916 - 1937 they rented space from Sacred Heart Society. Under the leadership of Alliance President Nicodemus Dominiak, the society incorporated into a non-profit organization. From 1937 to 1940 they rented rooms on Butterworth and Hogadone Ave until they purchased a former cigar factory, which is the building at their current location at 58 Lane Ave SW.

The members at Laddies Hall have always been active in sporting activities. In the late 30's when baseball was the most popular sport in the city, their baseball team won two city championships. In the late 70's their softball team won championships as well.

Over the years, many improvements have been made to keep up the appearance of the club: from new carpet, tables, chairs, air conditioning, new roof, and televisions to make it the inviting space it is today. Laddies hosts several events throughout the year, including a Lenten fish fry, golf outing, breakfasts, and its annual Polish meal which sells out every year.

St Ladislaus Aid Society has a family friendly atmosphere. If you are interested in becoming a member stop on in and ask the bartender for additional information.


Stand With Ukraine Update
