Meeting minutes from April meeting reviewed and approved; John Lieverse motion to approve, Cole Thomson second.

- 1) Outstanding action item(s); Request made to invite RCMP, TDG, DOT to the WASP meetings, possibly to present at a future meeting. COMPLETE
- 2) Treasurer report: Balance \$21,252 less 2 cheques @ \$1200. New WASP membership invoices will go out after WASP AGM in September. Bob motion to accept, John second.
- 3) Water Wells That Last Presentation (AB Ag & Forestry website & AER Water Well Complaint)
 - a. Presentation style was conversational, no PowerPoint. Alberta Agriculture & Forestry website was shown live, demonstrating the useful tools available for free to the public, to better understand domestic water wells, how to maintain them, the importance in early shock chlorination and the risk to shocking an aged well that hasn't had treatment before. Handouts included (From the AB AG & Forestry website) How to Remove H2S from your Water Well and Shock Chlorinating Your Water Well. The AER provided a handout on the questions that would be asked of a landowner if they called the AER to report a water well complaint. Discussion was held throughout the presentation time.

- 4) Leanne asked if WASP would be interested in hosting a Water Wells That Last workshop in the fall? To be tabled for further discussion and decision at a later date. **ACTION ITEM**
- 5) Leanne suggested that an Oil & Gas Awareness Day be organized for the public members of WASP. A committee will be created to ensure all aspects of the tour are considered. Tour ideas include; a drilling rig with a frac, a TDL withdraw point with flat line hose, a battery or liquid hub, a gas plant a pipeline construction or tie in. Industry will cover the costs. To be planned for early October. **ACTION ITEM**
- 6) **Reminder:** June 12 is the WASP Community Information Night at the Wembley Rec Centre. Free to attend; includes dinner and presenters and opportunity for industry Meet & Greet which runs from 5:00 pm – 6:00pm. Dinner is from 6:00pm – 7:00pm, presentation from 7:00pm – 8:30pm and if time allows, additional time for industry and public meet & greet, 8:30pm – 9:00pm. - 8) A recognition and Thank you were also expressed to Tidewater. Some members of the public are feeling that Tidewater is listening to them and being responsive to what they are hearing.
- 9) Round Table (Highlighted Name indicates they attended meeting but did not provide an update in time for minutes to be posted on WASP website)
 - a. CNRL: We have a two well completion taking place off our 03-11-73-09W6 pad. This is 1 mile south of the Emerson trail on RR 92. They are currently fracking both wells. Water for the fracs has come from area landowners and has been pumped to the location. Expect to be complete In early June. Road bond with the county is in place for equipment moving into and out of location.

 - c. SemCAMs: we are still working towards solutions for the plant SOCs. We are also continuing our engagement efforts as they relate to the proposed Pipestone Pipeline. Aside from that we have no other changes or additional work planned at this time.

 - g. Genovus: In the past week we started acquiring pipeline right of way for pipeline on the West side of Saskatoon Mountain but the project may not go ahead.

 - i. Tidewater: Tidewater has applied to the AER for Phase 1 gathering system pipelines for the Pipestone Gas Plant at 12-35-70-9w6.
We have had minor activity in the area lately due to breakup and road ban conditions. Tidewater is planning on hosting a ditch cleanup day at the beginning of June where our employees and crews will be gathering up garbage along RR92, RR91, RR90, and RR85 from TWP Road 710 north to HWY 43. Full details will be released shortly.

 - l. CSV Midstream: CSV continues early engagement activities regarding a potential gas plant project with landowners, residents and community groups in the region.

 - 14-01-72-09W6 (RR 91& N of 720), Drilling Feb 28 – Apr 20 (3 wells)
 - 10-25-72-09W6 (RR 90 S of 720), 2 rigs drilling Mar 9 – June 11), 8 wells planned

Two completions activities on 2 pads currently

- 04-31-71-08W6 (RR 90 S of 720), Mar 10 – mid May. Water Source: (11-13-71-9 & 7-33-70-9)
 - 11-13-71-09W6 (RR 91 S of 43) Mid-April till mid-July with a break in the middle.
Water Source: reservoir on site
Planned drilling/completions left in 2018
 - 6-6-72-8W6 (RR 90 N of 720), Mid-June till the end of July
 - 10-09-71-08W6 (RR 83 & 712), 1 well in August
 - *Completions follows drilling activity and lasts 40-50
 - Liquids Hub 04-07-073-08 W6 (RR 90 - S of Emerson) construction is underway with Q3/Q4 on-stream target
 - Water Injection Facility 16-27-72-09 W6 (RR 92 – S of 730), produced water injection. consultation and acquisition underway with Q3 build target. Currently dealing with an objection
 - Fuel Gas Compression 15-30-72-08 W6 (RR 85 – S of 730), consultation and acquisitions underway with Q3 build target
 - Liquids Compression Expansion 14-30-71-08 W6 (RR 90 – N of 724), licensed and under construction
 - Processing Facility SW-07-73-08W6 / Acid Gas Injection Well 09-21-73-09W6 (RR 90 - S of Emerson / RR 93 – N of landfill), consultation and acquisitions underway. Proposed Q1 2019 start building, Q1 2021 on-stream
 - Associated Pipelines (from processing facility to injection well), consultation and acquisitions underway. Proposed Q3 2019/20 build
 - Encana 2018 Pipelines - Installing additional lines along existing corridor 16-34-70-09 to 08-27-74-09W6
 - Segment 1: 04-07-73-08 to 8-27-74-09W6M (Hythe Line Riser)– Consultation and acquisition underway
 - Segment 2: 15-30-72-08W6M to Liquids Hub– Consultation and acquisition underway
 - Segment 3: 14-30-71-8 compressor to 15-30-72-08 junction– Construction underway
 - Segment 4: 16-34-70-9 comp to 14-30-71-8W6M comp – Construction underway
 - Segment 5: 15-30-72-8 to 16-27-72-9 well – Licensed
 - Other tie-ins in the area ongoing
