\*\*The County Commissioners voted down (2-3) the sale of the excess property to developers as a means of raising money for course renovations. They are currently looking at renovating the golf course through other funding and keeping the extra land for future recreational use. There will be more to come on the project in the coming months.

\*\*With increased demand since the Pandemic, agronomy on this 32-year old course will remain challenging. Keep in mind we only close one day a year, so you see us at our best and also while we are doing scheduled maintenance. We strive to work through those periods with the least amount of

disturbance possible and hope that the result of those periods pays off with better turf conditions in the end. Some things you as players can do to help us keep the course in its best possible condition are:

**Sand and smooth your divot**

**Rake the bunker on your way out**

**Fix your ball mark and one other**

**Never take a cart closer than 30 feet from the green**

**Always keep carts on the cart path on par 3 holes**

**During wet periods, keep carts on paths when available and higher turf when not**

\*\*March 14th brings us Daylight Savings Time and spring forward. We will lose some tee times in the morning, but have increasing daylight in the afternoon in order for you to play later into the evening.
