Assistant Trailmasters: Sam Bulmer (West Side) Isaac Ruehl (East Side) Brad Hoskins (East Side) James Belanger (Winter) First and foremost, I'd like to once again extend a sincere thank you to all of our volunteers who continue to dedicate their time and energy to maintaining our trail system. Without your hard work, our club simply couldn't function at the level it does today.

As many of you know, earlier this season we lost access to a portion of trail leaving from the West side park-and-ride due to a landowner developing their property. While we fully respect and understand their decision, this change means we need to pursue a reroute. Documentation has been submitted and we are awaiting approval. A general inspection was recently completed, giving us an idea of the scope of work, and we're actively working on securing funding. This project will be a major undertaking, and once we have more details, we will share them with you. At that time, we will need as many helping hands as possible to make the reroute a reality.

In the meantime, our trail crew will also be focusing energy on preparing the East Side of our system for the upcoming Ride for a Cure cancer benefit ride on Saturday, October 18th. To get ready, we will be placing additional gravel and stone in areas that need reinforcement to withstand the high volume of traffic expected that day.

To accomplish this, we'll be holding a work party on Saturday, September 27 at 8:00 AM, meeting at the Eastside park -and-ride. If there are any changes to this plan, Jenny or I will send out an update via email.

Thank you again for your support, your time, and your commitment to the trails we all enjoy. Together, we'll keep moving forward.

Below contains pertinent information that everyone should be aware of when our trails do open.

Miscellaneous Information from the Trail Master

All of our ATV trails are operated on privately owned land, individuals damaging or abusing their property will result in the loss of all ATV trails for everyone. Landowner's have the right to stipulate what can and cannot be operated on the trails that use their property. If these stipulations are not followed the club will lose the use of that land owners' property. Individuals damaging or abusing their property will result in the loss of all trails for everyone. And remember that trucks and cars are not allowed on any ATV/ Snowmobile trails in the State of Maine without landowner permission.

And remember if a Landowner wishes to limit the use of their property either for a short window of time or for an extended of time, they have the right to do so. Any club in the state cannot do what they do without the support of their landowners. So please help us help you by respecting our landowners.

Permission is required. A person may not operate an ATV on the land of another without the permission of the landowner or lessee. Permission is presumed on designated state approved.

Operating an ATV in wetlands, marshes, rivers, and streams is illegal in Maine.

Please stay on established trails if not we could lose the use of the trails all together. Please use all marked bridges to cross wet, stream or marsh areas on the trails. Failure to do so will result in sections of the trail being CLOSED permanently by landowners.

Dirt bikes and UTV's over 65" wide are not allowed on CMP Property period. This is a CMP rule that the club has no control over. The following trails are on CMP property #1B, RACE TRACK, #1C, and #4 from RT.196 to RT.24. Any dirt bike or UTV over 65" caught on these trails will be charged with criminal trespass.

The Speed limit in residential areas like Bay Park and Topsham Crossing is 15MPH to help keep dust down and the noise to a minimum.

RESPECT LANDOWNER'S - STAY ON MARKED TRAILS AND ONLY MARKED TRAILS AND OBEY ALL POSTED SIGNS. USE IS A PRIVI-LEGE, NOT A RIGHT.


