Election Committee

Welcome to our TTR's 2025 annual meeting! It is during this meeting we will be conducting the elections for club officers and board positions. All of the positions (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer as well as the 5 Board Positions) received nominations during our last meeting. Before the elections are completed, I'd like to take a moment to remind everyone who the nominations are for each position, perhaps each of the nominees could raise their hand when their names are read.

Since there are positions with multiple nominees a ballot was created. In an effort to allow the committee enough time to count them the elections will be completed now at the beginning of the meeting and the results will be shared later during the meeting.

President's Remarks

During the meeting Jenny Little provided updates on the following:

Municipal Grant Update

We are still currently awaiting the arrival of the first round of reimbursement funds from the municipal grant. The state has approved the payment, and it is now with the accounting department for processing. Once those funds are received, we will pay Bursey and proceed with submitting our final reimbursement request.

Looking ahead, preparations for the 2026 grant cycle will begin in the coming weeks, and the process will look a bit different this year as we are now required to obtain additional quotations beyond just Bursey.

West Side Park and Ride

In early September, while fueling up at the Nouria gas station near our West Side Park & Ride, I noticed a "For Lease" sign posted at the entrance to the adjacent dirt lot—commonly used as our West Side Park & Ride. Despite attempts to contact the property owner for more information, we have not received a response. The Board is aware of the situation and is actively monitoring it. While the lot remains technically open, it's important for members to know that there is currently no access trail leading from that location.

West Side Reroute Update

Earlier this year, a landowner development project resulted in the closure of one of our trails departing from the West Side Park & Ride. In response, the club submitted the necessary paperwork to CMP and is currently awaiting a reply. Our trail coordinator has stressed the urgency of the matter, and a potential reroute—partially utilizing the old Trail #1—has been scouted and found to be viable, pending some maintenance work. While there are no new developments at this time, we are actively monitoring the situation and remain optimistic about a resolution.

Winter Meeting Location

Once again, a reminder to all that beginning with our meeting next month, our monthly meetings are being relocated to the Don Russell Board room located in the Municipal Building. I am merely mentioning this to get the location change on our radars! We will continue meeting the last Monday, of each month with the exception of December since we do not meet during this month.

Trail Closure Date

We're planning to keep the trails open until Sunday, December 15th, weather and conditions permitting. Please note that we may close them earlier if necessary for trail preservation, safety or landowner concerns. Be sure to check our website and Facebook page regularly for updates.

Maine ATV Coalition

I attended the Maine ATV Coalition meeting last night. The meeting featured one of the Landowner Relations Warden Officer who shared valuable information about how trail-related situations are being managed, including updates on progress and the ongoing discussion around the oversized weight project. The Warden Service continues to provide strong support to the ATV community despite facing staffing challenges, with approximately 16 current vacancies. Their efforts are greatly appreciated. Jenny also reported that MAC is actively monitoring legislative developments that may affect ATV clubs. Additionally, the Maine ATV Coalition plans to launch another Volunteer Appreciation initiative, with nomination details expected to be shared with clubs soon.

It was also mentioned that MAC will be forming a **nominations committee** in preparation for upcoming elections. If any club members are interested in participating or being part of that committee, please reach out to Jenny Little, who will connect you with the organization.

ATV Maine

Ron Carey provided the following update:

Ron Carey recently attended the ATV Maine meeting and provided an update. The group discussed upcoming executive board nominations: Dick Howlet for President, Lewis Conrad for Vice President, Karny Varney for Treasurer, and an open spot for Secretary. Additional nominations for Regional VP were mentioned. ATV Maine is working on improving their mobile safety trailer program and seeking more certified safety instructors. Their current equipment, including 20-year-old ATVs, is aging, and Polaris has offered to donate two new machines, with hopes that Can-Am will do the same. They are also pursuing grant funding for further purchases. Members were reminded that trail closures—partial or full—can be tracked via the interactive map. Discussions are ongoing with major landowners about including dirt bikes in future planning. Key upcoming dates include a Town Hall Q&A with the executive board on Monday, November 3rd (link available in the event), elections on December 13th in Central Maine, and the annual meeting scheduled for April 18, 2026. Lastly, ATV Maine continues to monitor legislative activity, including LD 557, which has not yet passed despite online claims, and they plan to address highway road access and weight recommendations.

TTR also got a shout out during the meeting about submitting our membership documentation to them electronically.

Reminder: Everyone who is a member of ATV Maine, or joins ATV Maine, is automatically covered under their insurance program. This coverage includes liability protection while participating in sanctioned events and activities, offering peace of mind and added value to membership.

Treasurer Report

Tim provided a printed treasurer report which will be attached to the minutes when they are sent out which is an update since our September meeting.

Trail Master

Tim Williams provided the following update:

East Side

Our East Side trail system is currently open, and we haven't received any reports of issues. We completed maintenance work at the end of September, and while there's always room for more improvements, we feel confident that the trails are in good shape—ready to go if the snow starts falling tomorrow.

West Side

All the trails that we have permission to use are still currently open and dry. Again, if you have an opportunity to ride the west side you should take the chance because it would allow you to see all of the work recently completed.

We are dealing with a few individuals who are accessing closed section of trails and are continuing to monitor it with the help of the Warden service. If things heat up again the club is considering purchasing concrete jersey barriers.

Charlie inquired what the plan was to remove all of the bridging/boardwalk that was removed from the Brigham trail. We will work on getting a planned created for this project. If not this season it will be added to next season's projects.
