

### THE TRAILS ARE EXPECTED TO REOPEN MID MAY - EARLY JUNE DEPENDING ON WEATHER AND TRAIL CONDITIONS. THERE IS CURRENTLY NO SET DATE FOR THE TRAILS TO OPEN BECAUSE MANY FACTORS AFFECT THE TRAILS OPENING INCLUDING THE WEATHER, TRAIL DAMAGE, AND MOST IMPORTANT OUR LANDOWNERS.

If you see anyone on the trails or they appear to be getting ready to head out on the trail system please kindly remind them the trails are closed. It is important to note that the use of ATV's on a closed trail during mud season is considered felony trespassing. Reminder that if the trails are posted as closed and the entry way for the trail is blocked then the trails are closed to all motorized vehicles. Going around or through the barriers and riding the trails in anyway is felony trespassing and jeopardizes the use of all trails, all individuals caught doing so will deal with the Game Wardens.

As in the past I anticipate that our trails are going need a lot of work in order to prepare them for this upcoming season. To help with this I have scheduled out many trail work parties so please navigate to both our Facebook page and our website where the 207-319-5142 dates and times are listed. I also may need to add additional work parties as we begin working the trails and come across unplanned projects. For the upcoming month we have tentatively scheduled a work party for Saturday, April 8<sup>th</sup> and Saturday, April 23<sup>rd</sup> please check Facebook for updates

or call me with any questions. All are welcomed and encouraged to come and help work on the trails with me to prepare them for opening day.

Finally, during the last weekend of March TTR will be at the Maine Sportsman Show being held at the Augusta Civic Center. We will also be hosting an ATV safety course on Saturday, April 1st along with heading to the ATV Maine banquet in mid-April on April 15<sup>th</sup>. I hope to see you at these events.

### THINK AND DRIVE

- 1. Make sure your registration is up to date. Properly attach your Registration stickers.
- 2. Check your helmet. Invest in a new one if it's damaged by any dents or cracks.

3. Give your ATV a twice-over. Check that all equipment, including brakes, lights, engine, and tires are in good condition and functioning properly.

4. Familiarize yourself with local regulations and bylaws regarding ATV usage.

5. Get your emergency kit ready to go, including any or all of the following: blanket, snacks/food, waterproof matches, a whistle, insect repellant and sunblock, a flashlight, spare fuel, tea or coffee, water/water purification tablets, duct tape, signal mirror, tool kit, first aid supplies, rope, flares, spare keys, a sharp knife, and/or compass.

6. If your children want to ride, ensure they have completed the ATV safety course. If you haven't ridden

before or could just use a re-fresher, do the same. Don't let your children use adult-sized ATVs.

7. Consider taking a first aid course. It doesn't hurt to be prepared.

8. Get yourself in the mindset for a great riding season. Have fun! 8. Take an ATV Rider Course; to enroll call toll free (800) 887-2887.

Permission required. A person may not operate an ATV on the land of another without the permission of

Golden Rules for Safe ATV Operation

- 1. Always wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- 2. Never ride on public roads another vehicle could hit you.
- 3. Never ride under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- 4. Never carry a passenger on a single-rider vehicle.
- 5. Ride an ATV that's right for your age. The CPSC age/size guidelines are:
  - Age 6 and older Under 70cc Age 12 and older 70cc - 90cc
  - Age 16 and older Over 90cc
- 6. Supervise riders younger than 16; ATVs are not toys.
- 7. Ride only on designated trails and at a safe speed.

the landowner or lessee. Permission is presumed on designated state approved ATV trails or in areas open to ATVs by landowner policy. A landowner may limit the use of a designated state-approved ATV trail on that landowner's property through agreements with the State or an ATV club to address environmental, public safety or management concerns. Written permission of the landowner or lesse is required on cropland or pastureland or in an orchard. As used in this subsection, "cropland" means acreage in tillage rotation, land being cropped and land in bush fruits, and "pastureland" means acreage devoted to the production of forage plants used for animal production.

The registration number in the form of stickers issued by the commissioner must be clearly displayed on the front and rear of the vehicle. A registration is valid for one year commencing July 1st of each year, except that any registration issued prior to July 1st but after May 1st is valid from the date of issuance until June 30th of the following year. A person may not operate an ATV that is required to be registered under this section unless registration numbers are displayed in these spaces or as otherwise required by the department.

Dirt bikes are no longer allowed on Topsham trails this is permanent because landowners want the long-standing rule enforced. That is no dirt bikes allowed on their property.

Dirt bikes are not allowed on CMP Property period. The following trails are on CMP property #1A, #1B, RACE TRACK, #1C, #2, and #4 from RT.196 to RT.24. Any dirt bike caught on these trails will be charged with criminal trespass.

### UTV's over 65" wide are not allowed on CMP property.


To further simplify the width restriction regarding ATV trails which numerous people are misunderstanding:

- (1) Trail Width Restriction is NOT new.
- (2) Trail Width Restriction was NOT created by ATV Maine.
- (3) Trail Width Restriction was NOT created by ATV Clubs
- (4) Trail Width Restriction is NOT a law.
- (5) Trail Width Restriction is NOT statewide.
- (6) Landowners have requested that the EXISTING width restriction be enforced
- to gain control over what has been overlooked for MANY years. (7) Maine Warden Service will document any violations as Criminal Trespass,
- Title 17, Section 2806, a Class E crime.
- (8) ATV clubs are being contacted by the landowner(s) that this enforcement will affect

(9) ATV Maine has only shared this information to help educate those who will soon be on the trails! - This was NOT created by ATV Maine.
