



Trailmaster's Notes All ATV trails in Topsham are open.

The trails are very wet and soft so exercise caution while riding. The weather has been flip flopping between warm, cold and rain. The water levels on the trails are very high, frozen water holes might seem safe but the ice is less than an inch thick it might support the weight of a person but will not support the weight of an ATV or UTV. Some of these water holes are over 3 feet deep and can cause your machine to get stuck in the ice or flipped sideways. ATV season is fast coming to a close, and the trails will be closing to ATV's/ŬTV's and snowmobile season will bégin after the first large snow fall. The trails will be closed to all ATV's/UTV's with the exception of tracked ATV's/UTV's registered as snowmobiles for snowmobile season. I hope everyone enjoys their holiday season. We will be looking for people to help with trail setup and grooming this snowmobile season. There are still other rides taking place this month around the state.

Dan Corey 207-751-6106 Snowmobiles are not allowed on Trail #1B as this is an ATV only trail. The Snow is coming so get you're riding in now before Mother Nature blankets us in white and its SNOWMOBILE season again. Do your part to keep the trails in good shape by taking it easy on the brakes and throttle. If you find a spot that needs work let us know. I hope everyone enjoys their holiday

The trail routing between Middlesex rd. and Bay Park dr has changed due to landowner requests so please pay attention to signs and stay on marked trail. Hunting season is in full swing so remember to **stay alert and wear orange when in the woods**. Please leave all hunting setups along as they are on private property and may belong to the landowner. Access between the East and West sides of town is not possible due to the trail being closed by the landowner several years ago. Access to and from Lisbon falls on trail #1C is not possible anymore due to a closed gate on the ward rd.

Please stay off the trails during and just after heavy rains. This cuts down on the damage that has cost our club a lot of time and money to keep the Landowner's happy. Please ride safe out there on or off our trails, fun is to be had without getting hurt. Enjoy the riding and always respect the land to which you ride on and the landowners which allow us

Operating an ATV in wetlands, marshes, rivers, and streams is illegal in Maine.

Please stay on established trails if not we could lose the use of the trails all together. Please use Marked Bridges to cross WET, STREAM or Marsh areas on the trails. Failure to do so will result in sections of the trail being CLOSED permanently by landowners.

Permission required. A person may not operate an ATV on the land of another without the written permission of the landowner or lessee. Permission is presumed on designated state approved ATV trails or in areas open to ATVs by landowner policy. A landowner may limit the use of a designated state-approved ATV trail on that landowner's property through agreements with the State or an ATV club to address environmental, public safety or management concerns. Written permission of the landowner or lessee is required on cropland or pastureland or in an orchard. As used in this subsection, "cropland" means acreage in tillage rotation, land being cropped and land in bush fruits, and "pastureland" means acreage devoted to the production of forage plants used for animal production.

Landowner's have the right to stipulate what can and cannot be operated on the trails that use their property. If these stipulations are not followed the club will lose the use of that landowner's property. Individuals damaging or abusing their prop-

erty will result in the loss of all trails for everyone.

The Speed limit is 5 MPH on the Trail behind Nouria Shell, this is to help the trail stabilize due to soft soil and to help keep dust and noise to a minimum. The Speed limit is 15 MPH in the power line behind the rehab complex on rte. 196, if this speed limit is not followed the trail will be closed permanently. The Speed limit in residential areas like Bay Park and Topsham Crossing is 15MPH to help keep dust and noise to a minimum.

- 1. Make sure your registration is up to date. Properly attach your Registration stickers.
- 2. Check your helmet. Invest in a new one if it's damaged by any dents or cracks.
- 3. Give your ATV a twice-over. Check that all equipment, including brakes, lights, engine, and tires are in good condition and function- 104 Main Street in Topsham, Maine ing properly.

 4. Familiarize yourself with local regulations and bylaws regarding ATV
- 5. Get your emergency kit ready to go, including any or all of the following: blanket, snacks/food, waterproof matches, a whistle, insect repellant and sunblock, a flashlight, spare fuel, tea or coffee, water/water purification tablets, duct tape, signal mirror, tool kit, first aid supplies, rope, flares, spare keys, a sharp knife, and/or compass.
- 6. If your children want to ride, ensure they have completed the ATV safety course. If you haven't ridden before or could just use a re-fresher, do the
- same. Don't let your children use adult-sized ATVs.
 7. Consider taking a first aid course. It doesn't hurt to be prepared.
- 8. Get yourself in the mindset for a great riding season. Have fun!

Golden Rules for Safe ATV Operation

- 1. Always wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- 2. Never ride on public roads another vehicle could hit you.
- Never ride under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- Never carry a passenger on a single-rider vehicle.
- 5. Ride an ATV that's right for your age. The CPSC age/size guidelines are:

Age 6 and older Under 70cc Age 12 and older 70cc - 90cc Age 16 and older Over 90cc

- 6. Supervise riders younger than 16; ATVs are not toys.

That is no dirt bikes allowed on their property.

7. Ride only on designated trails and at a safe speed.
8. Take an ATV Rider Course; to enroll call toll free (800) 887-2887.








UTV's over 60" wide are not allowed on CMP property. RESPECT LANDOWNER'S - STAY ON MARKED TRAILS AND ONLY MARKED TRAILS AND OBEY ALL POSTED SIGNS. USE IS A PRIVI-LEGE. NOT A RIGHT. While riding please wear proper protective equipment and keep speeds at a safe level. Ride Smart, Ride Safe, Ride Sober. Again, if you're out on the trail please bring a pair of clippers or even a small saw to help cut back the new growth from the summer. Every snip helps
