DRIVE SAFETLY ON TRAILS

Notes from the Ride Coordinator

We are quickly entering into the best part of riding season – Fall riding! August was jammed pack with riding but September is shaping up to be the same. In September, we have opportunities for out of town day trips but also in town trail work parties!

We begin September by heading to the Machias area. We will travel to Machias late in the day on Friday, September 1st and ride bright and early on Saturday and Sunday of that weekend before heading home on

Monday, September 4th. Please check the event on either our website or Facebook for lodging recommendations and additional details about the event.

Our next event is scheduled for Sunday, September 10th which is a very important in-town trail work party. We will be installing mats on the East Side. We will be meeting at 9 am at the end of Lovers Lane in Topsham. We will need as many hands to help with this major project. Updates for this work party will be posted on both our website and Facebook event.

Our next ride in September is scheduled for Sunday, September 17th when we head to the Central Maine Powersports Scavenger Hunt in Waterford. We will be leaving from the Topsham McDonalds at 8:15 am. For those who wish to meet us there they can head to 812 Waterford Rd in Waterford ME. The event is an all-day event but I am not planning on staying for the entire day.

We will also be hosting another in-town trail work party on Saturday, September 23rd beginning at 9 am. Charlie has not yet determined which side of our trail system we will be work on for this work party so please check on our website and/or the Facebook event for additional details.

Another event scheduled for late September is being held on Sunday, September 24th when we head to Bridgton to participate in Lakes Region annual Apple Orchard Ride. We will be leaving from the Topsham McDonalds at 6:30 am and heading to 66 Bragg Way in Bridgton ME. The cost to participate in this event is \$20 per machine. This event is a benefit ride for House in the Woods to I hope to see many folks there.

Our final event for September will be TTR's Ride and BBQ Fundraiser. The ride will depart from the Pulling Ring at 10 am and we will return to a BBQ around 12 pm. Please purchase your tickets during any of our meetings, events, or using the link in the event. The costs are \$20 per person or a family bundle is \$50 which includes 2 adults and 2 children. This is one of the club's largest fundraisers so I hope you will consider joining us.

The trail entrance to the west side trails is closed until further notice, this means no access to the trails on the west side from or to the gas station due to landowner construction.

The trails seem to be holding up reasonably well this year except for the Brigham trail with all the heavy rain we've had this summer and people not giving it time to dry out before riding. I would ask that you please lay off the gas on the trails because wet areas will only get worse the more people try to power through them so use 4-wheel drive and slow and steady power. There will also be construction starting on the west side trail 1C and 1D early in September month so please be cautious expect delays or blockages depending on the work being done.

We will have a trail work party on Sept 10th to finish installing mats on the hill on trail 4 on the East Side. The work party will begin at 9 am and we will be meeting at the end of Lovers Lane. We will need folks to haul trailers as well as working the hill with the mats. We also have another work party scheduled for Saturday, September 23rd. I have not yet decided if we will be working on our West Side or East Side so please check Social Media and the website for additional details. Please note that on September 30th we have our 2nd Annual Ride and BBQ happening.

We would appreciate it if you would please stay off the trails during any heavy rains as well as the day after any heavy rains. This cuts down on the damage that has cost our club a lot of time and money to keep the trails in fair share as well as keeping our landowners happy. Please ride safe out there on or off our trails, fun is to be had without getting hurt. Enjoy the ride this summer and always respect the land to which you ride on and the landowners which allow us to ride.

Operating an ATV in wetlands, marshes, rivers, and streams is illegal in Maine.

Please stay on established trails if not we could lose the use of the trails all together. Please use Marked Bridges to cross WET, STREAM or Marsh areas on the trails. Failure to do so will result in sections of the trail being CLOSED permanently by landowners.

Permission required. A person may not operate an ATV on the land of another without the permission of the landowner or lessee. Permission is presumed on designated state approved

ATV trails or in areas open to ATVs by landowner policy. A landowner may limit the use of a designated state -approved ATV trail on that landowner's property through agreements with the State or an ATV club to address environmental, public safety or management concerns. Written permission of the landowner or lessee is required on cropland or pastureland or in an orchard. As used in this subsection, "cropland" means acreage in tillage rotation, land being cropped and land in bush fruits, and "pastureland" means acreage devoted to the production of forage plants used for animal production.

THINK AND DRIVE

- 1. Make sure your registration is up to date. Properly attach your Registration stickers.
- 2. Check your helmet. Invest in a new one if it's damaged by any dents or cracks.
- 3. Give your ATV a twice-over. Check that all equipment, including brakes, lights, engine, and tires are in good condition and functioning properly.
- 4. Familiarize yourself with local regulations and bylaws regarding ATV usage.
- **5.** Get your emergency kit ready to go, including any or all of the following: blanket, snacks/food, waterproof matches, a whistle, insect repellant and sunblock, a flashlight, spare fuel, tea or coffee, water/water purification tablets, duct tape, signal mirror, tool kit, first aid supplies, rope, flares, spare keys, a sharp knife, and/or compass.
- 6. If your children want to ride, ensure they have completed the ATV safety course. If you haven't ridden
- before or could just use a re-fresher, do the same. Don't let your children use adult-sized ATVs.
- 7. Consider taking a first aid course. It doesn't hurt to be prepared.
- 8. Get yourself in the mindset for a great riding season. Have fun!

Golden Rules for Safe ATV Operation

Dirt bikes and UTV's over 65" wide are not allowed on CMP Property period. This is a CMP rule that the club has no control over. The following trails are on CMP property #1B, RACE TRACK, #1C, and #4 from RT.196 to RT.24. Any dirt bike or UTV over 65" caught on these trails will be charged with criminal trespass.

Landowner's have the right to stipulate what can and cannot be operated on the trails that use their property. If these stipulations are not followed the club will lose the use of that landowner's property. Individuals damaging or abusing their property will result in the loss of all trails for everyone.

The Speed limit is 5 MPH on the Trail behind Nouria shell, this is to help the trail stabilize due to soft soil.

The Speed limit is 15 MPH in the power line behind the shop on rte. 196, if this speed limit is not followed the trail will be closed permanently.

The Speed limit in residential areas like Bay Park and Topsham Crossing is 15MPH to help keep dust and noise to a minimum.

All ATV trails are operated on privately owned land, individuals damaging or abusing their property will result in the loss of all ATV trails for everyone.

TRUCKS AND CARS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON ATV/SNOWMOBILE TRAILS IN THE STATE OF MAINE WITHOUT LANDOWNER PERMISSION.

RESPECT LANDOWNER'S - STAY ON MARKED TRAILS AND ONLY MARKED TRAILS AND OBEY ALL POSTED SIGNS. USE IS A PRIVILEGE, NOT A RIGHT. RIDE AT OWN RISK.

While riding please wear proper protective equipment and keep speeds at a safe level. Ride Smart, Ride Safe. Ride Sober.

Again, if you're out on the trail please bring a pair of clippers or even a small saw to help cut back the new growth from the summer. Every snip helps.

Golden Rules for Safe ATV Operation

- 1. Always wear a helmet and other protective gear.
- $2.\ Never\ ride$ on public roads another vehicle could hit you.
- 3. Never ride under the influence of alcohol or other drugs.
- 4. Never carry a passenger on a single-rider vehicle.
- 5. Ride an ATV that's right for your age. The CPSC age/size guidelines are:

Age 6 and older Under 70cc Age 12 and older 70cc – 90cc Age 16 and older Over 90cc

- 6. Supervise riders younger than 16; ATVs are not toys.
- 7. Ride only on designated trails and at a safe speed.
- 8. Take an ATV Rider Course; to enroll call toll free (800) 887-2887.
