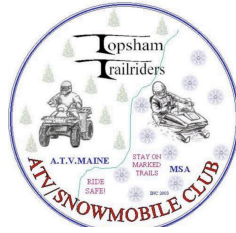

Secretary's Report

President's Remarks

During the meeting Jenny Little provided updates on the following:

West Side Reroute & East / West Side Reconnection

The West Side reroute and East–West trail system reconnection were discussed as related efforts. A portion of the West Side trail system remains closed; however, work is ongoing to identify a solution for reopening. Concurrently, efforts are focused on reconnecting the East Side (Park & Ride access area) to the West Side to restore continuous trail access between both sections.

A key component of this effort is regaining permission to utilize Route 201 to access the West Side. Progress continues, although the process remains gradual and requires coordination with multiple stakeholders.

To date, communications have consisted primarily of ongoing email correspondence and discussions with town officials. Town representatives, including Public Works, the Police Chief, and the Fire Chief, have met to review the request and have indicated support for allowing controlled access. In addition, discussions with the school administration, including the Superintendent, have taken place and approval has been granted at that level.

It is important to note that permission to utilize Route 201 has **not** yet been granted. Discussions remain ongoing; however, current feedback has been positive.

Completion of the West Side reroute project remains a critical dependency for full reconnection of the East and West trail systems. Due to the size and scope of the project, it is anticipated that this portion of the trail system may not reopen until late next year.

The matter has been placed on the agenda for a formal public meeting scheduled for **Thursday, July 16th**, which represents a critical step in the approval process. Strong member attendance is essential, as demonstrating broad community and club support will be an important factor in the outcome of the discussion.

East Side Trail Reroute Needed

Late last month, the club received a call from a newer landowner on the East Side near the first road crossing at Middlesex. The landowner advised that a portion of their property will be cleared and requested that the existing trail be relocated. This section of trail is currently being reviewed internally, and those directly involved in the process have been identified to ensure coordination remains efficient and manageable.

As part of this effort, coordination with an abutting property owner is required. Outreach is planned in the coming week to discuss a potential reroute and explore options that would accommodate all parties involved. This will require careful planning, as an additional reroute project may be necessary.

At this time, it is anticipated that the situation can be resolved through cooperation; however, if a suitable reroute cannot be secured, there is a risk of closure impacting a portion of the East Side trail system. Maintaining positive landowner relationships remains a priority, and updates will be provided as more information becomes available.

Pulpit Rock Trail Blazah's Autism Shirt Sponsor

Information was shared regarding the Pulpit Rock Trail Blazah's annual Autism Benefit Ride held in Waterford each August, which raises funds for Pine Tree Society and the Sunshine Camp. As part of their fundraising efforts, the organization offers sponsorship opportunities similar to the Topsham Trailriders' Ride for a Cure shirt sponsorships.

Motion was made by Dan Pellegrini to allocate \$50 on behalf of Topsham Trailriders to have our name added to the shirt.

Ron Carey provided the following update:

East and West Side Update

June has come and gone and even with two big out of town events we've still managed to get a few things done on our own trail system. Brush cutting parties have been hard at work on the east side and the trails look great. Our repairs of "the Crossing" from earlier this spring are holding up nicely. The rain has filled the few holes we have over there and it even caused one sinkhole that was repaired the day it was found, thank you Ashleigh and Brad for finding and fixing that damage. Aside from that, the east side has held up well this spring.

The west side looks good and with the recent rains, all the holes are full. The Honey Hole and Double Dare are overflowing their banks and ready for Kyle or some other unwitting stranger to enter and sink out of sight. Enjoy the riding but stay safe, a tug out of a hard spot could be hard to find. Our west side trail system has, of course, seen limited traffic, mostly local riders and

some club members. This is due to the lack of an official park and ride for that side of our divided system. Our goal this summer has been to makeover the new land that we've acquired for that purpose. With the gracious help of some of the Over the Hill Riders from next door in West Bath we were able to get that piece cut and now, partially surveyed to determine our next steps. Soon it will be all hands on deck as we begin the real work over there. Stay informed and check often to help out.

With all that said, please remember, we have a trail system because of the graciousness of our landowners. Their allowance of access is a gift to us, it is not a right. You can help us to respect our landowners by reporting any trail damage immediately, by remembering to carry in/carry out and also, by remembering to tread lightly, especially on hills or wet trails. Ride safe!

Tuesday Night Work Parties

Jenny Little provided the following update:

A reminder was provided that Tuesday night work parties recently began and have been well attended. Appreciation was extended to those who have consistently shown up to assist, including Mike L, Robyn, Michael S. John B, Dan C, and others who have contributed their time and effort. Members were reminded that participation is not limited to Tuesday evenings, and work completed on other days is also encouraged and valued.

It was emphasized that accurate and detailed reporting of volunteer hours is essential. Submissions should include start and end times, specific trail locations, work completed, and equipment used. General or incomplete information limits the ability to properly track and document efforts. Submissions may be sent via text or email. Contact information is available on the club website and information sheet, and submissions may also be provided to Mike for tracking purposes. Clear and consistent communication will support improved recordkeeping, and updates to the tracking worksheets will be made accordingly.

Upcoming Trail Work Parties:

Jenny Little provided the following update:

Tuesday, June 30th at 5:00 PM *(may have already occurred by the time minutes are distributed)*

- Location: Dirt parking lot next to Nouria gas station (Park & Ride access point)
- Focus: Clearing and maintaining the trail leaving the Park & Ride
 - Note: While this section is currently not accessible for riding, ongoing maintenance is still required
- What to bring:
 - Weed whackers/trimmers (area is heavily overgrown), chainsaws, clippers, or other hand tools if available
 - Some club-owned battery-operated equipment will also be on site
 - **No machines are required**
- Additional Notes:
 - Effort will be focused on general trail clearing and maintenance
 - Positive participation and teamwork is expected

Major Work Party – West Side / New ATV Park & Ride Preparation

- Date: Saturday, July 11th (Rain Date: Sunday, July 12th)

- Meeting Location: End of 68 Branch Road, Topsham
 - A one-day exception has been granted by the landowner for parking at this location
- Participation: This work party is open to all members and any volunteers interested in assisting provided they come with a positive attitude and willingness to help in any capacity.
- Arrival & Coordination:
 - Volunteers are encouraged to arrive well before 7:45 AM
 - Work may already be underway upon arrival
 - A brief coordination meeting will take place around 7:45 AM to review assignments and ensure work is organized efficiently
 - Volunteers should also be prepared to complete trail work documentation at that time
- Purpose / Scope of Work:
 - Preparation of the new ATV Park & Ride on the West Side
 - Additional maintenance across sections of the West Side trail system
- Planned Tasks Include:
 - Spreading large quantities of gravel/material
 - Post hole digging (perhaps at a later work party)
 - Site preparation for the new Park & Ride
 - Trail clearing (brush cutting, signage, and maintenance)
 - Clearing of the racetrack area, with limited access anticipated for work purposes during this event only
- Equipment & Needs:
 - Strong volunteer turnout is critical
 - At least one additional tractor is needed for material spreading (unless Mike's meeting went well today!)
 - Volunteers are encouraged to bring appropriate tools for trail and site work
- Important Notes:
 - This is a large-scale project requiring significant effort
 - West Side maintenance has been limited in recent weeks, increasing the workload

Label Machine

It was noted that during recent travel throughout the state, observations were made regarding the clean and consistent signage used by other clubs, often achieved through professionally printed labels or the use of label makers. To improve the appearance and readability of Topsham Trailriders' signage, a proposal was brought forward to explore purchasing a label maker. This would help ensure signage is legible, consistent, and professionally presented across the trail system.

- **Saturday, July 4th – West Paris to Rumford Ride** **Cancelled**
 - Due to the extreme heat forecasted for the holiday weekend, the ride coordinator and We ATV 207 have made the decision to cancel this event.
 - Rider safety remains the top priority, and the conditions are expected to make for an uncomfortable and potentially unsafe day on the trails.
 - Thank you to everyone who expressed interest in attending. We look forward to future opportunities to explore the West Paris and Rumford area when conditions are more favorable.
- **Saturday, July 25th – Newport / Central Maine Trail Blazers Ride**
 - Departure Location: Newport Park & Ride
 - Departure Time: 8:30 AM
 - Planned riding area includes Newport, Exeter, and Garland regions
 - This ride will be in collaboration with Central Maine Trail Blazers
 - Please bring a bag lunch and extra fuel if needed
- **Friday, July 31st – Monday, August 3rd – Machias Weekend Trip**
 - Out-of-town riding weekend in the Machias area

- o Light riding may occur Friday (time and participation dependent)
- o Full riding days planned for Saturday and Sunday
- o Return home scheduled for Monday

Other notes:

- June events averaged **60+ machines per ride**, reflecting strong participation and a positive trend
- With larger group sizes, all riders are expected to follow safe and responsible group ride practices
- Riders should:
 - o Maintain a steady pace with the group
 - o Watch for the machine ahead and behind to keep the group together
 - o Ride according to trail conditions at all times
 - o Speeding will not be tolerated
 - o Zero tolerance policy remains in place for drugs and alcohol during organized rides

Ride for a Cure

Jenny Little provided the following update:

A Ride for a Cure update is provided. Planning continues for the event scheduled for **Saturday, October 17**, to be held at the pulling ring at the Topsham Fairgrounds (32 Community Way, Topsham). The club is proud to partner with the Dean Snell Cancer Foundation, supporting patients receiving care through New England Cancer Specialists, and remains committed to this important cause.

Event Details (current planning):

- **Event Date:** Saturday, October 17
- **Location:** Pulling Ring, Topsham Fairgrounds
- **Registration:** 8:30 AM
- **Drivers' Meeting:** 9:30 AM
- **Departure:** 10:00 AM
- **Route:** Anticipated use of the east side trail system, with an alternate route under evaluation pending completion

Sponsorship efforts continue to gain momentum. As of this update, the club has secured 13 shirt sponsors, with additional commitments still pending collection, and a current total of \$1,255.02 raised for the Ride for a Cure. Continued outreach remains essential as the club works toward its goal of 40 shirt sponsors and aims to meet or exceed last year's sponsorship levels.

T-shirt sponsorships remain open to businesses, organizations, and individuals, including those wishing to contribute in honor or memory of a loved one. Additional fundraising efforts, including silent auction donations, are also underway, with more details to be shared as contributions are confirmed.

It is also noted that the next Ride for a Cure Committee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 30th at 7:00 PM and will be held electronically. Participation is open to anyone interested in assisting with planning, either now or in the future. Planning efforts are expected to increase in the coming weeks, including development of additional event features such as a potential obstacle course component to enhance the overall event experience.

Addiction Recovery Benefit Ride

Marie Carey provided the following update:

We had a great turnout for the Addiction Recovery Event on Saturday, June 20th.

We had about 80+ machines show up! With all of the vendors, riders, and others at the Oxford Park and ride, there were around 300 people at the event.

We had a goal to raise \$3,000, as this is the cost to put an addict through recovery through Operation Hope. With rider registrations, raffles, 50/50, and business sponsorships, we raised \$4,926.00. This does not include the apparel sales, as the digital store will remain open through July 3rd. Please buy a limited-edition Path to Recovery shirt if you haven't already done so and help us reach \$5,000!

Once we have a final number to include the apparel sales, we will present a giant check to Operation Hope in front of the Waterville Police Station.

Everything went well and we have heard many positive comments about this event. Path to Recovery will be planning another event for 2027. We hope you come along for the adventure!

Topsham Trailriders has access to the Exhibition Hall and other facilities on the Topsham Fairgrounds because of an agreement that we have with the Topsham Fair. The agreement is during the Topsham Fair we (TTR) cleans the grand stands, pulling ring, and the Exhibition Hall in exchange for using this hall for our monthly meetings. As a reminder the 2026 Topsham Fair is Tuesday, August 11th to Sunday, August 16th.

Thank you to the members who have already signed up to assist with fair clean ups your prompt reply is very much appreciated!

The reality is though even with a few early volunteers signing up we still have MANY MANY slots to fill. To help with this process we have set up an electronic sign-up sheet to help coordinate the scheduling for the Topsham Fair clean up because it allows us to reach ALL members. It is an added bonus that it also handles reminders too. If you are interested in helping and need

UPDATE: During the meeting, additional volunteer opportunities with the Topsham Fair were discussed. An update was provided regarding preparations for the Topsham Fair. The fair association has secured a storage location in close proximity to the Topsham Trailriders tent, eliminating the need for a trailer to store club materials during the event. The storage area will be located within a museum building that remains open throughout the fair, providing a convenient and secure location for supplies and event materials.

Topsham Fair – Wednesday Night Volunteer Nights

Jenny Little provided the following update:

The Topsham Fair has recently reached out to Topsham Trailriders with an opportunity for members to become more involved in supporting the fairgrounds. As many have seen on social media or heard through community conversations, maintaining the fairgrounds is an ongoing effort that includes a wide variety of projects, including picnic table repairs, painting, bleacher maintenance, replacement of damaged boards, stair construction near the pulling ring, upkeep of benches, and general grounds improvements. Many of these projects already have materials available and simply require volunteer assistance to complete.

Additionally, the museum building that will be used to store Topsham Trailriders' supplies during the fair could benefit from a general cleanup and preparation effort prior to fair week. Assisting with these projects would provide an opportunity for the club to give back to an organization that has consistently supported Topsham Trailriders and our events.

Topsham Trailriders is scheduled to participate in a fairgrounds work party on **Wednesday, July 8th**, beginning at **4:00 PM**. Volunteers will be provided a meal before work begins, and members are encouraged to attend. This is an excellent opportunity to give back to a community partner that supports the club throughout the year, and a few hours of volunteer time can make a significant impact.

In addition to the July 8th work party, discussion is requested regarding additional volunteer commitments the club may be willing to make. Potential options include dedicating one or more Tuesday night work parties or organizing a separate Sunday morning effort. The goal is to leave

this meeting with a clearer understanding of how Topsham Trailriders would like to support the fairgrounds moving forward so that an appropriate commitment can be communicated back to fair representatives.

Landowner Appreciation

Jenny Little provided the following update:

During a previous meeting, discussion took place regarding opportunities for Topsham Trailriders to give back to the landowners who make our trail system possible. Without the continued support and generosity of our landowners, the club would not have access to the trail network that members and guests enjoy throughout the year.

One idea that received positive feedback was the creation of a Topsham Trailriders calendar to distribute to landowners as a small token of appreciation. The concept would showcase photographs from throughout the trail system, highlighting the beauty of the trails, club activities, volunteers, and the positive impact of responsible trail use.

Further discussion is needed regarding how photographs should be selected. Options include soliciting photo submissions from members and selecting images through a review process, appointing a small committee to curate the calendar, or exploring a combination of both approaches. Feedback is requested so that planning can move forward and a final recommendation can be developed.
