10.10.25 Nursery read the Three Little Pigs!



The children in Conker class have been reading the story 'The 3 Little Pigs' this week. We began the week by learning a song about the story. The children then made pig and wolf masks and we used them to reenact the story in the Nursery garden. The children really enjoyed pretending to be the different characters, especially the big bad wolf! We also made three houses for the pigs. One made of straw, one made from sticks and one made out of bricks. The children used a fan to see what house would blow down first. We were all surprised that our house made from sticks was the first to fall down! Don't worry though, the house made from bricks was very sturdy and kept all of the pigs safe.

17.10.25 Reception read the Three Billy Goats Gruff!



In Reception we have been retelling the story of the Three Billy Goats Gruff and have made some puppets of the different characters! We found a funny song to help us act out the story with our puppets and we all enjoyed the ending when the troll is defeated. 10.10.25 pollinator Power in Year 1!



Year 1 had an exiting afternoon learning about the different habitats that we have at school and thinking about the habitat we are going to increase to support more pollinator at school. They learned about why pollinators are so important and why we are making a Pollinator Power garden!

10.10.25 Wonderful art and writing in Year 2!



Year 2 have had a very busy week! In Art, the children have been investigating what texture is. The children went on scavenger hunt to find things that feel different and then created rubbings. They really enjoyed exploring which materials make good rubbings and organised these in their sketch books for later use.

2 Chestnut were also busy writing their circular narrative about a river - we were impressed with all the expanded noun phrases they were using!

3.10.25 Amazing Cave Art in Year 3!



Year 3 have created animal drawings using charcoal, inspired by the Stone Age. Using the charcoal, the children were able to smudge and add detail. Can you spot which animals they have drawn?

10.10.25 Year 4 love reading!



Year 4 have had a fantastic week. A highlight was meeting the author Luke Temple, who inspired the children by sharing stories about his work and books. In History, they've been discovering what children did for fun in different historical periods, sparking lots of great discussions.

Meanwhile, in Computing, the pupils have been busy planning their very own websites all about their favourite animals – we can't wait to see the finished products! In Science, the children have been exploring food chains, learning how energy flows between animals and plants in different ecosystems. Well done, Year 4!

3.10 .25 Year 5 learn about fire safety

Year 5 had a very exciting visit from the London Fire Brigade. The children learnt all about how to keep themselves safe at home, including the importance of working smoke alarms, keeping cooking areas clear, and avoiding overloaded plug sockets.

They also became 'fire investigators', exploring everyday household scenarios and identifying potential fire hazards. The children loved putting on their detective hats and showed great awareness when discussing how to prevent accidents.

We were really impressed by their thoughtful questions and enthusiasm during the session. We hope they have already shared some of their new safety tips with you at home!

10.10 .25 More WW11 learning in Year 6



It has been a fortnight of assemblies for Year 6! Last week, 6 Elm kicked off with their Battle of Britain assembly and today 6 Hawthorn did their assembly about children and evacuation during World War Two. This is all based on our History topic, which has been learning about what the war was like for the people of Britain. Our visit to the RAF Museum also helped us understand the role of the RAF and also the contributions made by those from the Commonwealth and, as we have entered Black History Month, we will be looking at the contributions made by people from the Caribbean. We will also learn about scientists from Black and African-heritage backgrounds in our Science lessons. In History, we have already heard the story of Neil Flanigan who worked in avionics during the war (and we will look at other veterans of the war from Black backgrounds) and in Science we have also learnt about scientists Dr Alan Powell Goffe and Kayisha Payne who are specialists in microbiology and have developed vaccines to help fight disease. Kayisha Payne is also the founder of BBSTEM which is a network supporting Black students in STEM subjects.


