#### Lots of learning in Year 3!




This week, Year 3 started their new English topic, which is a return narrative called Jemmy Button!

#### Space in Year 5





She took them on an inspiring journey through the Artemis program, which is gearing up to send astronauts back to the Moon by 2027. Even more exciting, this groundbreaking mission will make history by landing the first woman and the first person of colour on the lunar surface—what an amazing future to look forward to! As part of the Zoom, the children were tasked with designing their own spacecraft for the mission, incorporating the latest technologies and innovations to ensure a successful journey to the Moon.

#### 7.3.25 - Story writing in Year 4



This week in Year 4, we have been reading the book, 'Lost Happy Endings' by Carol Ann Duffy and Jane Ray. Using the text as inspiration, we have been learning how to write twisted fairy tales. We have been looking at contrasting descriptions of evil and good characters. Over the next week, we will write a traditional fairytale, WITHOUT a happy ending! The children have so many wonderful ideas and we can't wait to read their twisted stories!

#### Writing in Year 6



This week in Year 6 we began looking at our new book in English: The Ways of the Wolf. We have immersed ourselves in the text and learnt some new vocabulary. Do you know what 'outcrop', 'imminent' and 'heartrending' mean? We do! Next week we are going to begin planning our larger piece of writing which will be a documentary narrative (like a David Attenborough narrated documentary). To practise our skills, we wrote a short piece of text describing a hungry wolf pack attacking a hare. We made sure to use all the grammar we had rehearsed over the week including: expanded noun phrases (often with a prepositional phrase), dashes, semicolons and colons. Our teachers were very impressed with our writing - have a read for yourself!


