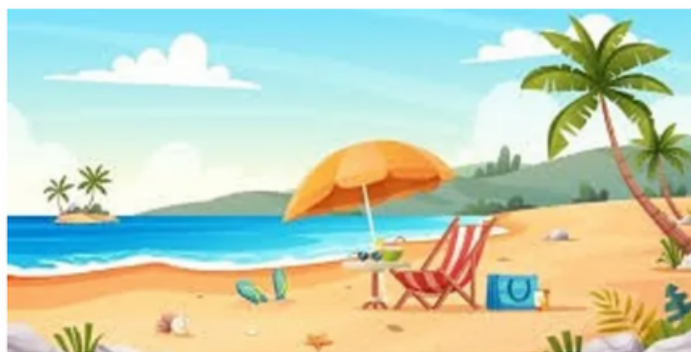

4.7.25 Reception Rockpools!



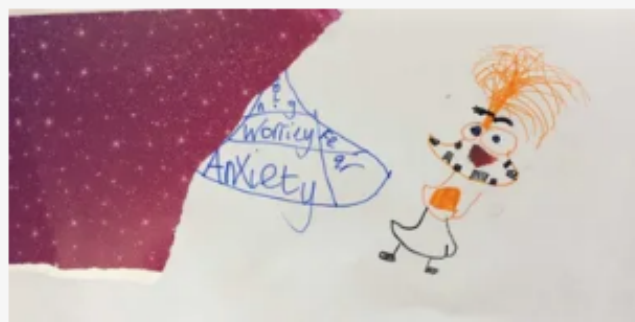

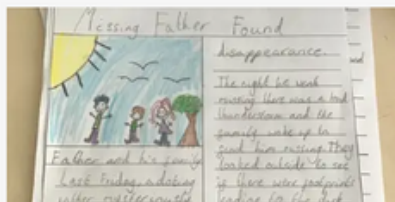
4.7.25 Busy week in Year 2

11.7.25 Year 3 are journalists!



This week during English, Year 3 have been journalists and have been writing newspaper reports about a father going missing.

This was based on the book 'Into the Forest' by Anthony Browne. Our writing is really impressive!

2.7.25 Y5 History and Geography Workshops



This week, eleven of our Year 5 pupils took part in a geography and history workshop at QE Boys School. The workshop offered a fantastic opportunity for the children to develop their thinking around real-world issues and historical strategy.

In the first half of the session, the focus was on sustainability in Barnet. The children were challenged to design a sustainable product, carefully considering its features and the impact it would have on the environment.

Their ideas showed great creativity and an impressive awareness of sustainable practices. The second part of the workshop introduced a hands-on history activity. The children took part in a strategic game where they were given a budget to build a medieval castle. They had to decide which parts of the castle to construct and justify their choices to earn points. Once the castles were complete, they were "attacked" in the game scenario, and points were lost depending on the effectiveness of their design choices. This part of the workshop sparked lots of enthusiasm and teamwork as pupils balanced cost, defence, and strategy.

Overall, it was a fun and educational experience, giving the children a chance to apply their knowledge in creative and interactive ways.

4.7.25 A busy week in Year 4!



Year 4 have been working hard to complete their final piece of writing this year...a biography. We have researched the fantastic Jacques Cousteau who was so curious about the sea and the creatures that lived there; he helped to invent the Aqua Lung (underwater breathing apparatus).

We have also been learning about rivers and the various parts of the river course. We've looked at where you find rivers, as well as the longest rivers in the UK and the world!

11.7.25 Lots of trips in Year 6



On the 2nd of July, Year 6 attended Junior Citizen in East Finchley. We were divided into groups and each took part in activities run by TFL, the ambulance service, the fire service and the council's road safety team. Everything we learnt will help us as we move on to secondary school and in our lives. Did you know you should be your body length away from the edge of train platforms, so you don't get pushed forward? If you're not sure how tall you are - you can stretch out your arms as your length is the same distance finger-tip to finger-tip!

On the 9th we went on our last trip of the year! Ark Pioneer school gave us 60 tickets to their show School of Rock. The cast were so talented - singing, acting and playing instruments!
