


NATIONAL SPORTS WEEK




VACANCY FOR RELIEF MEALTIME SUPERVISOR

Wild World Heroes takes you on a trip to Wilderville, with help from WWF, for a special nature-themed challenge that will inspire you to stand up for the planet. With amazing books, amazing rewards and lots of ideas for taking care of the environment, why not join us?

To complete the challenge, all children have to do is read at least six library books of their choice; collecting special stickers and other exclusive rewards along the way; and it's **FREE** to take part!

Signing up for the Summer Reading Challenge

When the challenge begins, parents can register their child for the challenge and pick up prizes from their local Barnet library *during staffed hours*. Alternatively parents will be able to **register online** and pick up their Wild World Heroes pack from the library during <u>self-service opening</u> if they are registered; or we can arrange to post the pack out if required.

We are very excited to offer our very first GROW weekly farm boxes, available from every Thursday.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

The GROW farm boxes will run from **June - October** for the year (the season will hopefully get longer next year as the farm develops).

All of our produce is grown using organic principles so is both super tasty and healthy. Everything is picked the day before we pack.

COLLECTION

All veg boxes will be available to pick up from the

GROW veg box shed (next to the main gates) from 12pm on Thursday until 4pm on Friday each week. Any uncollected veg will be made into preserves to help raise money for our projects or donated to families who need it.

If you are away, you can either choose to donate your veg box to a family in need (just email us) or we will refund you for the week you are away. You will need to let us know with one week's notice if you would like to cancel your box.

BOX PRICES

We offer two box sizes, small and medium. We offer a tiered pricing system to ensure everyone can access our produce, no matter their financial position. We work on a self reporting, trust basis and we do not ask people for proof of income. Please think carefully about what you can afford, and be honest!

Small box

The small box will include 3-4 portions of our finest organically grown veg.

'Regular' small box: £6 a week / £24 a month

'Pay it Forward' small box (pay an extra 20% donation to help someone on a low salary access a more affordable box): £7.25 a week / £29 a month

'Solidarity' small box (20% discount box for those unable to pay full price): £4.75 a week / £19 a month

Medium Box

The medium box will include 4-5 portions of our finest organically grown veg.

'Regular' medium box: £10 a week / £40 a month

'Pay it Forward' medium box (pay an extra 20% donation to help someone on a low salary access a more affordable box): £12 a week / £48 a month

'Solidarity' medium box (20% discount box for those unable to pay full price): £8 per week / £32 per month

+Add a monthly bunch of flowers to either box for £12 (£14.50 for 'Pay it Forward' / £9.50 for 'Solidarity')

HOW TO SIGN UP

Please register your interest here and someone will be in touch. Please note we have a limited number of farm boxes so they will be offered on a first come first served basis.

HOW TO PAY

We will collect payments on a monthly basis via direct debit. This will be set up once your box has been confirmed.







OUESTIONS



I'd like to sign up but I'm not sure what I would do with the veg?

We will send out a weekly email with simple tips and recipes of what to do with your veg. Signing up to a box scheme is a fantastic way to become a more adventurous chef and to eat more healthily. We are here to guide you through and are always available at our Thursday stall (from 3-6pm) to offer help and advice.

What kind of produce will be in the box?

We will put a variety of items in the box each week - we cannot always predict what will be in the boxes week to week because of the weather, but we promise that it will be the freshest produce possible, will all be grown using organic principles and will be picked the day before you pick up.

What if I'm not happy with the produce?

Please let us know by email if you're not happy with any of our produce. We will refund you for anything you're not happy with.



Why do you use plastic packaging?

We use as little plastic packaging as possible and provide all our veg boxes in natural, reusable tote bags. There are a few items (salads and leafy greens) that will last a lot longer in plastic packaging - unfortunately there is still not yet a better eco alternative. You can always reuse these bags and if you want, you can bring them back to us and we will reuse.
