MUSIC TUITION

We are changing the way you need to book your music lessons at Underhill.



Underhill is now set up online for booking music lessons through BEAT directly, for drums, guitar and piano lessons.

The Spring term is now open for booking, so if your child is interested in learning or wishes to continue with lessons please click on the link below as soon as possible.

Parents can enrol and pay for lessons directly by following this link https://beatrust.org.uk/enrol/school-based-instrumental-lessons/. There you will find details of the cost of lessons and the terms and conditions.

Once enrolled the pupil gets moved to a waiting list and then Beat move them across to a teacher. You will not pay anything until your child has been moved to a teacher and you can still decline the offer of a place if you change your mind at this point. If you are in receipt of pupil premium parents can still receive a £50 discount off one instrument per child they enrol. Teachers can contact parents directly through the app.

Please can we ask parents or grandparents who are picking up and dropping off children to school, to please be considerate and respectful in where they park.


We do realise and appreciate most of our parents do always park properly.
