School Uniform

Dear Parents and Carers,

We all love seeing the children in our school uniform. It really creates such a great impression when walking around the school to see the children looking so smart and well presented. We have noticed however, that with some children, standards in school uniform have slipped and we just want to update you about school uniform expectations.



Our school uniform is:

- **Black** trousers/pinafore/skirts/shorts/culottes (this does not include leggings or tracksuit bottoms)
- **Yellow** polo shirt
- **Black** sweatshirt or cardigan with Underhill logo
- **Black** shoes or trainers
- **Black** tights

Our PE Kit is:

- **Yellow** T shirt with logo
- **Black** PE shorts
- **Black** jogging bottoms
- Trainers

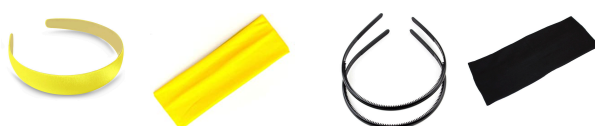
Labelling school uniform:

Please label **all** items so that if they do get lost they can be returned to their correct owner.

- Headscarves are to be **plain** and not in bright colours
- No jewellery is to be worn in school with the exception of stud earrings if necessary or for religious purposes with permission.
- Nail varnish or false nails/acrylic nails are not allowed.
- Hair bands and Headbands: Children are able to wear hair bands and headbands to school but these must be plain black or yellow with no bows, ribbons or large adornments. They can wear for example:



- Beads - hair beads can be worn in the school colours and white.
- School shoes must be black with no large logos on them. They can wear for example:



- Football shoes: On football days, children are allowed to bring their football trainers to school in their PE bag and change into them at lunchtime. They are **not** allowed to wear them to school.
