PSED

Children's personal, social and emotional development (PSED) is crucial for children to lead healthy and happy lives, and is fundamental to their cognitive development.

In Reception this year we will be teaching lessons related to the following topics;

- My Feelings
- Special Relationships
- Taking on challenges
- Listening and following instructions
- My family and friends
- My wellbeing



Assessments and SeeSaw

In Nursery we will be making observations of your child during their play and learning. Each child will have two Spotlight Months during the year (these months occur in relation to where their birthday falls) During these months we will be observing them closely and will share these observations with you on SeeSaw.

We will use these observations to assess your child's development and progress.

We will share this information with you during the parent consultations that will happen during the year in a rolling programme.



Messy/Sensory Play

In Early Years there are lots of activities that we provide for children to explore that can be messy that help them develop important skills. Children are of course supervised by adults but they can get very messy when they are playing in the mud kitchen or with sensory materials!

Reading in Nursery



We want to develop a love of reading in our children so you can support this by reading with your child everyday.

 Library books - The children will choose a book to bring home and share with you every Wednesday

FRED - Families Reading Every Day (at home)



Children need to read at home every night.

This can be any book that children enjoy reading (they will get one from the school library every week).

Parents need to initial the FRED bookmark after their child has read for 10-15 minutes.

Bring this to school every week and show to class teacher.

If home reading is not happening, a class teacher or Reading Lead will be in contact. When children collect 'reads', they will get a reward.

Each week on a Thursday on SeeSaw we will send home learning activities to support the children's learning in;

The School Day

The Reception day starts at 8.40 a.m. and finishes at 3:20 p.m.

We will collect the children in the Reception drop off zone, please enter the playground by the gate opposite the main office.

Please be on time for dropping off and picking up your child.

Saying goodbye in the morning...



Please do say a prompt goodbye and leave your child in the line.

Please don't wait to wave to your child as it can unsettle them and the other children. Please leave the school premises as soon as you can.

Please do get on with your day and be proud that you got your child to school on time!

Collecting your Child

If you are going to be delayed please let the school know as soon as possible- please note charges may be applied for late collection.

If you need someone else to pick up your child please let the office or the teacher know as soon as possible. The person collecting will need to know the password that you have created.

We will dismiss the children in the same area as the morning drop off zone. Please allow us time and space to get the whole class outside before we start dismissing the children. We will hand your child to you so please be patient while you are waiting.

If your child bumps their head at school, it is our policy to phone you to let you know. Please do not worry as this is just our procedure.


