Supreme Religious Council Assembled PUBLIC LAW 111-04



TO ESTABLISH LAWS OF PROTECTION AGAINST ARSON

Pursuant to the Moorish National Republic of Peace Constitution, Amendment XVIII,
Section 3, wherein it states:

*"The Moorish National Republic of Peace shall make all laws necessary and proper for
carrying out the powers vested in its government, departments, and officers under this
Constitution,"*

there shall hereby be designated Arson provisions to serve this purpose. This Public Law
shall go into immediate effect.

TITLE I - CRIMINAL CODE

Section 1. Destruction of Property by Fire or Explosive

(a) Prohibited Conduct

Any Moroccan National of the Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP), or any individual who has voluntarily submitted to its internal governance, who knowingly and willfully:

- Sets fire to, burns, ignites, or causes combustion;
- Uses an explosive, flammable substance, or destructive device;
- Damages, destroys, or attempts to destroy by fire or explosion;

any of the following property lawfully owned, leased, held in trust, or controlled by the MNRP, its members, or affiliated entities:

- Buildings, structures, dwellings, or facilities;
- Vessels, vehicles, or transportation equipment;
- Machinery, tools, equipment, or materials;
- Agricultural land, crops, livestock enclosures, or food systems;
- Religious institutions, community centers, or administrative property;
- Storage areas, records, or operational infrastructure;

shall be deemed in violation of MNRP internal law.

(b) Internal Classification of Violation

Conduct under this section shall be classified as a **severe internal violation involving**:

- Destruction of property;
- Risk to human life and safety;
- Interference with organizational operations;
- Breach of trust and community security;

Such conduct may also fall within the definition of a **crime of violence** for internal classification purposes where risk to persons is present.

(c) Internal Measures and Sanctions

Upon a lawful finding through the MNRP Court of Justice or authorized tribunal, measures may include:

- Immediate suspension or permanent revocation of membership;
- Removal from all MNRP institutions, programs, and properties;
- Loss of rights, privileges, and standing within the MNRP;
- Removal from any office, authority, or position of trust;
- Financial restitution or contractual liability for all damages;
- Administrative restrictions or protective measures;

All proceedings shall comply with:

- Notice of allegations;
 - Opportunity to respond;
 - Presentation of evidence;
 - Impartial adjudication;
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(d) Mandatory Referral to Lawful Authorities

Where conduct involves:

- Fire-related destruction of real or personal property;
- Use of explosives or hazardous materials;
- Risk of bodily harm, injury, or death;
- Conduct recognized as arson or a criminal offense under applicable law;

the matter **shall be referred** to appropriate civil or criminal authorities for investigation and prosecution.

(e) Limitations

Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to:

- Establish independent criminal jurisdiction;
 - Authorize imprisonment, detention, or criminal sentencing by the MNRP;
 - Override federal, state, or local criminal law;
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Section 2. Aggravated Fire-Related Conduct (Internal Classification)

(a) Aggravating Circumstances

A violation under Section 1 shall be classified as an **aggravated internal violation** where the conduct:

- Places any person in danger of death or serious bodily injury;
 - Involves occupied structures or dwellings;
 - Targets emergency infrastructure, religious institutions, or community facilities;
 - Involves intentional or reckless disregard for human life;
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(b) Enhanced Internal Measures

Where aggravating factors are present, internal measures may include:

- Permanent expulsion from the MNRP;
 - Lifetime prohibition from participation in programs or institutions;
 - Heightened restitution obligations;
 - Classification as a highest-level internal offense;
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(c) Mandatory External Referral

Where the conduct results in:

- Serious bodily injury;
- Death of any person (including responders);
- Large-scale destruction or public danger;

the matter **shall be immediately referred** to lawful authorities.

(d) Limitations

The MNRP shall not:

- Impose criminal sentences such as imprisonment or death penalties;
 - Substitute its internal process for lawful prosecution;
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Section 3. Fire or Destruction with Intent to Defraud (Internal Fraud Standard)

(a) Prohibited Conduct

Any individual subject to MNRP governance who knowingly and willfully:

- Sets fire to or destroys property;
- Causes damage through burning or explosion;

with the intent to:

- Obtain financial benefit;
- Defraud an insurance provider;
- Defraud a financial institution;
- Defraud the MNRP or any internal program;

shall be deemed in violation of MNRP internal law.

(b) Internal Classification

This conduct shall be classified as a **serious internal violation involving**:

- Fraud and deception;

- Abuse of financial systems;
 - Breach of fiduciary or contractual duty;
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(c) Internal Measures

Sanctions may include:

- Revocation of membership;
 - Financial restitution and liability;
 - Disqualification from financial or administrative roles;
 - Internal adjudication and record of violation;
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(d) Referral to Lawful Authorities

Where such conduct constitutes:

- Insurance fraud;
- Financial fraud;
- Criminal arson;

the matter shall be referred to appropriate lawful authorities.

(e) Limitations

Nothing herein authorizes:

- Criminal prosecution by the MNRP;
 - Imprisonment or criminal fines;
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Section 4. Attempt, Conspiracy, and Facilitation

(a) Prohibited Conduct

Any individual subject to MNRP governance who:

- Attempts to commit any act described in this Chapter;
- Conspires, agrees, plans, or coordinates with others;
- Aids, abets, encourages, or facilitates such conduct;

shall be deemed in violation of MNRP internal law.

(b) Internal Classification

Such conduct shall be classified as:

- A serious internal violation;
 - A coordinated or premeditated act;
 - A threat to organizational safety and integrity;
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(c) Internal Measures

Sanctions may include:

- Suspension or revocation of membership;
 - Removal from positions of trust;
 - Administrative restrictions;
 - Financial liability where applicable;
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(d) Referral

Where the conduct constitutes criminal conspiracy or attempted arson under applicable law, the matter shall be referred to appropriate authorities.

Section 5. Due Process, Jurisdiction, and Enforcement Limitations

(a) Due Process Requirements

All proceedings under this Chapter shall include:

- Written notice of allegations;

- Identification of the conduct and applicable section;
 - Opportunity to respond and present evidence;
 - Impartial adjudication;
 - Written findings where action is taken;
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(b) Jurisdiction

This Chapter applies only to:

- Moroccan Nationals of the MNRP;
- Members and individuals voluntarily subject to its governance;
- Conduct occurring within MNRP property, programs, or operations;

This jurisdiction is:

- Internal;
 - Organizational;
 - Contractual;
 - Ecclesiastical in nature;
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(c) Limitations

Nothing in this Chapter shall be interpreted to:

- Establish independent criminal jurisdiction;
 - Authorize imprisonment or detention;
 - Replace or interfere with civil or criminal courts;
 - Exempt any person from applicable law;
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(d) External Law Compliance

All conduct described herein remains subject to:

- Federal law;
- State law;
- Local law;

The MNRP may:

- Preserve records;
- Protect its members and property;
- Conduct internal review;
- Refer matters to lawful authorities;

This Act shall take effect immediately upon lawful enactment, ratification, publication, and placement into the National Archives of the Moorish National Republic of Peace.
