

Moorish National Republic of Peace Supreme Religious Council CODE OF ETHICS FOR CHIEF JUSTICE, ASSOCIATE JUSTICES, AND JURISTS



Pursuant to the Moorish National Republic of Peace Constitution (2025), Amendment XVIII, Section 3, wherein it states:

"The Moorish National Republic of Peace shall make all Laws which shall be necessary and proper for carrying into Execution the foregoing Powers, and all other Powers vested by this Constitution in the Government of the Moorish National Republic of Peace, or any Department or Officer thereof," there shall hereby be designated a Code of Ethics governing the conduct, duties, and responsibilities of the Chief Justice, Associate Justices, and Jurists of the Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP).

This Code of Ethics shall go into immediate effect

SECTION 1: PURPOSE AND JURISDICTION

The **Code of Ethics** serves as the guiding principles for all judicial officers within the Moorish National Republic of Peace. It ensures adherence to justice, fairness, impartiality, and moral integrity in all judicial proceedings and decisions.

- This Code applies exclusively to the Chief Justice, Associate Justices, and Jurists under the authority of the MNRP Supreme Court.
- Any violations shall be addressed by the Council of Justices and the Grand Vizier.

SECTION 2: CORE PRINCIPLES OF JUDICIAL CONDUCT

All judicial officers of the MNRP Supreme Court and Inferior Courts shall uphold the following principles:

- 1. **Integrity & Impartiality** Judges and Jurists shall remain impartial, free from bias, personal interest, and conflicts of interest in all legal proceedings.
- 2. Adherence to Law & Precedent All judicial rulings must adhere to the Constitution of the Moorish National Republic of Peace and applicable legal precedents.
- 3. **Respect for Human Rights** All rulings must uphold the fundamental rights of Moroccan Nationals, in accordance with **MNRP law, international human rights treaties, and customary legal principles**.
- 4. **Confidentiality & Judicial Discretion** Judges and Jurists shall not disclose confidential case information or engage in public discussions regarding pending judicial matters.
- 5. **Professionalism & Decorum** Judicial officers must conduct themselves with dignity, professionalism, and respect towards all parties in legal proceedings.
- 6. **No Abuse of Authority** Judges shall not misuse their authority for personal gain or engage in corruption, bribery, or favoritism.
- 7. **Independence from Political Influence** Judicial rulings must be free from political pressure, personal bias, or interference from external entities.
- 8. **Fair & Timely Adjudication** Cases must be handled in a fair, unbiased, and timely manner, ensuring due process is upheld for all parties.

SECTION 3: DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF JUDICIAL OFFICERS

(a) Duties of the Chief Justice



- The Chief Justice shall be the highest judicial authority within the MNRP Supreme Court.
- Shall oversee the administration and interpretation of MNRP constitutional law.
- Shall issue legal opinions, advisory rulings, and constitutional interpretations.
- Shall preside over cases involving constitutional disputes, treaty violations, and international legal matters.
- Shall appoint Associate Justices and Jurists subject to confirmation by the Council of Justices.
- Shall oversee the ethical conduct of all judicial officers within the MNRP judiciary.

(b) Duties of Associate Justices

- Shall preside over Supreme Court cases delegated by the Chief Justice.
- Shall interpret and apply MNRP law, international legal principles, and customary law in all cases.
- Shall serve on the Council of Justices, which is responsible for reviewing judicial misconduct allegations.
- Shall provide legal oversight in disputes involving **provinces**, **nationals**, **and governmental affairs**.

(c) Duties of Jurists

- Shall serve as legal scholars and advisors to the **Supreme Court** and **Inferior Courts**.
- Shall preside over lower court cases, including civil, commercial, and criminal disputes.
- Shall draft legal opinions, advisory reports, and constitutional interpretations for the Chief Justice.
- Shall conduct legal research on matters pertaining to **national sovereignty**, **treaty enforcement**, **and international legal disputes**.

SECTION 4: ACCOUNTABILITY AND DISCIPLINARY ACTION

Judicial officers who fail to uphold their ethical duties shall be subject to **disciplinary review** and sanctions by the Council of Justices.

(a) Grounds for Disciplinary Action

A judicial officer may face disciplinary action for the following reasons:



- 1. **Corruption or Bribery** Accepting bribes, engaging in favoritism, or using judicial power for personal gain.
- 2. **Dereliction of Duty** Failing to perform official duties, delaying cases without cause, or showing incompetence in legal rulings.
- 3. **Bias & Conflict of Interest** Rendering decisions based on personal bias or failing to recuse from cases with conflicts of interest.
- 4. **Abuse of Authority** Misusing judicial power to target individuals, suppress evidence, or interfere in political matters.
- 5. **Breach of Confidentiality** Unauthorized disclosure of case details, judicial deliberations, or classified legal proceedings.
- 6. **Judicial Misconduct** Engaging in unethical behavior, disrespecting court decorum, or violating constitutional law.

(b) Disciplinary Procedure

- The Council of Justices shall conduct investigations into allegations of misconduct.
- If misconduct is substantiated, disciplinary action may include:
 - o Censure or Formal Warning
 - Suspension from Judicial Duties
 - Revocation of Judicial Appointment
 - o Permanent Disqualification from Office
- Appeals may be heard by a **Special Tribunal** composed of senior justices.

SECTION 5: OATH OF OFFICE

All judicial officers shall take the following **Oath of Office** upon appointment:

"I, [Name], do solemnly affirm to uphold the Constitution of the Moorish National Republic of Peace. I shall administer justice without bias, fear, or favor, ensuring that the laws of the Republic are upheld in truth, equity, and righteousness. I shall conduct myself with honor, maintain the integrity of the judiciary, and preserve the rights of Moroccan Nationals under the laws of the Republic. So I affirm, under divine authority and solemn duty."

The oath shall be administered before the **Chief Justice** and recorded by the **Registrar of National Affairs**.



SECTION 6: SUPREME COURT AUTHORITY AND RECOGNITION

- The MNRP Supreme Court retains the highest judicial authority within the Republic.
- No external court, including courts of foreign governments, shall have jurisdiction over matters involving **Moroccan Nationals of MNRP**.
- All rulings by the **Supreme Court** shall be **final and binding** within the territories, provinces, and diplomatic missions of MNRP.
- The **Council of Justices** shall establish a **Judicial Ethics Review Committee** to monitor adherence to this Code.
