TO ESTABLISH GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR CRIMINAL CODE

Pursuant to the Moorish National Republic of Peace Constitution, Amendment XVIII, Section 3, wherein it states:

"The Moorish National Republic of Peace shall make all laws necessary and proper for carrying out the powers vested in its government, departments, and officers under this Constitution,"

there shall hereby be designated General Provisions for the Criminal Code to serve this purpose. This Public Law shall go into immediate effect.

TITLE I

TITLE I

CRIMINAL CODE

CHAPTER 1 - GENERAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 1: PRINCIPALS

- (a) Any individual who commits an offense against the **Moorish National Republic of Peace** (MNRP) or aids, abets, counsels, commands, induces, or procures its commission shall be deemed a principal and shall be subject to prosecution under the jurisdiction of the **MNRP** Court of Justice.
- (b) Any individual who willfully causes an act to be done, which if directly performed by them or another would constitute an offense against the MNRP, shall be held accountable as a principal. The enforcement and adjudication of such matters shall be exclusively governed by the **National Security Forces and MNRP Court of Justice.**
- (c) No foreign entity or external government shall have jurisdiction over any matter arising under this section, as all legal proceedings shall be handled solely within the **sovereign jurisdiction of the MNRP.**

SECTION 2: ACCESSORY AFTER THE FACT

- (a) Any individual who, knowing that an offense has been committed against the **Moorish**National Republic of Peace (MNRP), receives, relieves, comforts, or assists the offender in order to hinder or prevent their apprehension, trial, or punishment shall be deemed an Accessory

 After the Fact and shall be subject to prosecution under the jurisdiction of the MNRP Court of Justice.
- (b) Unless otherwise expressly provided by the **National Government of the MNRP**, an accessory after the fact shall be subject to imprisonment for no more than **one-half the maximum term** of imprisonment or fined no more than **one-half the maximum fine** prescribed for the punishment of the principal, or both.
- (c) If the principal offense is punishable by **life imprisonment or death,** the accessory after the fact shall be subject to imprisonment for a period not exceeding **15 years.**
- (d) **No foreign entity or external government shall have jurisdiction** over any matter arising under this section, as all legal proceedings shall be handled solely within the **sovereign jurisdiction of the MNRP.**

SECTION 3: MISPRISION OF FELONY AND MISDEMEANORS

- (a) Any individual who, having knowledge of the actual commission of a felony, including but not limited to the use of slave brands such as Black, Negro, Colored, or African American after Nationality has been stated and verified, which shall be considered evidence of denationalization and the dealing of Chattel Slavery, and fails to report the same to an official of the MNRP Court of Justice or the MNRP National Security Forces, shall be subject to prosecution. The penalty for such concealment shall include a fine under this title or imprisonment for fifteen to twenty years, or both.
- (b) Any individual who, having knowledge of the actual commission of a misdemeanor, including but not limited to the use of slave brands such as Black, Negro, Colored, or African American after Nationality has been stated and verified, which shall be considered evidence of denationalization and the dealing of Chattel Slavery, and fails to report the same to an official of the MNRP Court of Justice or the MNRP National Security Forces, shall be subject to prosecution. The penalty for such concealment shall include a fine under this title or imprisonment for up to ten years, or both.
- (c) **No foreign entity or external government shall have jurisdiction** over any matter arising under this section, as all legal proceedings shall be handled solely within the **sovereign jurisdiction of the MNRP.**

SECTION 4: MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE DEFINED

The term "Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP)", as used in this title in a territorial sense, includes all lands, waters, airspace, and jurisdictions recognized as part of the sovereign territory of the MNRP, whether continental or insular. This shall include all provinces, protectorates, and allied territories subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the MNRP.

Exclusion: The Canal Zone and any territories not expressly designated as under MNRP governance shall not be considered within the jurisdiction of the MNRP.

SECTION 5: DEFINITIONS

- (a) "Department" The term "Department" refers to any of the **governing bodies established under the MNRP Constitution**, including those overseeing legislative, judicial, security, commerce, and administrative functions. If the context suggests otherwise, it may refer to the governing structure of the **MNRP National Government.**
- (b) "Agency" The term "Agency" shall include any **Department, Mission, Independent Establishment, Commission, Administration, Authority, Board, or Bureau** operating under the governance of the **MNRP National Government**. It also includes any **corporate or financial entity in which the MNRP holds a proprietary interest**, except where the term is used in a more limited sense.

- (c) "Authority" Any entity granted legislative, judicial, or executive authority under the MNRP National Government to enforce laws, manage national affairs, and oversee the protection of Nationals and Citizens.
- (d) **Jurisdiction** This title and all its provisions shall apply strictly within the **sovereign domain of the MNRP** and shall not be construed to imply any submission to foreign governance or external regulations.

SECTION 6: MARITIME AND TERRITORIAL JURISDICTION OF THE MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE

The term "maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the Moorish National Republic of Peace", as used in this title, includes the following:

1. High Seas and Admiralty Jurisdiction

- All high seas and any waters falling under the admiralty and maritime jurisdiction of the MNRP, which are beyond the authority of any specific state.
- Any vessel wholly or partially owned by the MNRP, its Nationals, or a corporate entity established under MNRP law when operating in international or MNRP waters.
- Vessels registered, licensed, or enrolled under MNRP law traveling on the Great Lakes, connecting waterways, and the Saint Lawrence River, particularly where it constitutes an international boundary.

2. Territorial Lands and Infrastructure

- All provinces and lands defined within the MNRP Constitution as under its sovereign authority.
- Any land, fort, arsenal, dockyard, or infrastructure obtained or developed for MNRP governmental purposes.
- o Any islands, rocks, or keys containing **natural resources or strategic assets**, which may be designated under MNRP jurisdiction.

3. Aviation and Space Jurisdiction

- o All **aircraft** registered under MNRP jurisdiction when in flight over the **high seas** or within MNRP-controlled airspace.
- Any spacecraft or orbital vehicle registered to the MNRP, governed by international treaties concerning space exploration, celestial bodies, and interplanetary jurisdiction.
- Vehicles launched and controlled under MNRP registration and international agreements, including missions within the global aerospace framework.

4. Diplomatic and Consular Authority

 Any MNRP diplomatic, consular, or security mission operating in foreign territories, officially recognized under international agreements. Any property, facilities, or premises designated for MNRP government operations abroad, including the Moorish Science Academy International Mission, L.EYE.P International Missions, and the Moorish Science Temple of America.

5. International and Foreign Jurisdiction Considerations

- Any area outside the jurisdiction of a foreign nation where an offense is committed by or against an MNRP National, which warrants diplomatic or legal intervention.
- Foreign vessels departing from or arriving in MNRP-controlled waters, subject to MNRP law concerning acts committed by or against its Nationals.

6. Treaty Considerations

 Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to override treaties or international agreements officially ratified by the MNRP.

SECTION 7: OBLIGATION OR OTHER SECURITY OF THE MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE

The term "obligation or other security of the Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP)" includes, but is not limited to, all financial instruments, legal documents, and certified records issued under the sovereign authority of the MNRP National Government. These instruments are recognized as lawful and enforceable representations of value within the jurisdiction of the MNRP and subject to its exclusive economic and legal governance.

1. Recognized Obligations and Securities

The following are included under this definition:

- **Bonds & Certificates of Indebtedness** Instruments confirming national financial commitments.
- National Bank Currency & Reserve Notes Legal tender issued under the MNRP financial system.
- National Reserve Bank Notes & Treasury Notes Official financial instruments recognized within MNRP jurisdiction.
- Gold & Silver Certificates Asset-backed instruments confirming national reserves.
- **Birth Certificates & Social Security Cards** Official records documenting Nationals and their rights.
- **Province Identification & Driver's Licenses** Lawful identification instruments issued by the MNRP.
- **Vehicle Certificates of Titles & Registrations** Documentation proving rightful ownership of property within MNRP jurisdiction.
- **Contracts & Elector Cards** Lawfully binding agreements and voter identification instruments.

- **Property Deeds & Fractional Notes** Real estate ownership certificates and fractional investment documents.
- Certificates of Deposit & Bills of Exchange Recognized financial securities within the MNRP economy.
- Checks & Drafts for Money Instruments drawn by or upon authorized MNRP financial officers.
- MNRP Stamps & Canceled Stamps Official endorsements, revenue stamps, or financial seals issued under national authority.

2. Sovereign Financial Jurisdiction

- All **obligations and securities issued under MNRP law** are strictly governed by the **MNRP National Financial System** and cannot be regulated by external entities.
- No **foreign government, banking institution, or corporate body** has authority over financial instruments recognized under MNRP jurisdiction.

SECTION 8: VESSEL OF THE MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE

The term "vessel of the Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP)" refers to any watercraft, ship, or marine transport that falls under the jurisdiction of the MNRP, including:

- 1. Any vessel wholly or partially owned by:
 - o The Moorish National Republic of Peace (MNRP) Government
 - o Any MNRP National or Citizen
 - o Any corporation or entity established under MNRP law
 - Any Province, Territory, or Possession recognized by the MNRP

2. Registration & Recognition:

- All MNRP vessels must be registered under MNRP maritime laws to be recognized as part of its sovereign fleet.
- Such vessels remain under the exclusive jurisdiction of the MNRP, regardless of their location on international waters.

SECTION 9: INTERSTATE AND FOREIGN COMMERCE

1. Interstate Commerce:

- o The term "interstate commerce" includes trade, exchange, and transportation between:
 - One **State, Province, or Territory** within the MNRP and another.

• Any Possession or District recognized under MNRP jurisdiction.

2. Foreign Commerce:

- The term "foreign commerce" refers to commercial activities conducted between the MNRP and any foreign nation.
- Such commerce shall be regulated by the MNRP Economic Authority, ensuring adherence to national trade policies.

SECTION 10: FOREIGN GOVERNMENT DEFINED

1. **Definition:**

- The term "foreign government" includes any nation, state, political faction, or insurgent body operating outside MNRP jurisdiction.
- This definition applies **regardless of whether the MNRP formally recognizes** such entities as sovereign.

2. Non-Interference Doctrine:

- The MNRP reserves the right to engage in diplomatic relations only at its discretion.
- No foreign government shall impose laws, statutes, or regulations upon MNRP Nationals or its sovereign institutions.

SECTION 11: MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE POSTAL SERVICE

1. Definition & Authority:

- The Moorish National Republic of Peace Postal Service (MNRP Postal Service) is the official mail delivery and communication system established by the MNRP Government.
- It shall operate **independently of foreign postal services**, handling all **official correspondence**, **document authentication**, and **sovereign communications**.

2. Jurisdiction:

- All officers, employees, and representatives of the MNRP Postal Service are bound by national law, whether or not they have taken an oath of office.
- The security and integrity of MNRP postal operations fall under the exclusive authority of the MNRP Government.

SECTION 12: LAWS OF STATES ADOPTED FOR AREAS WITHIN NATIONAL JURISDICTION

- (a) Any individual who commits an act or omission within **Moorish National Republic of Peace** (**MNRP**) **jurisdiction**, as defined in **Section 7 of this title**, which, while not explicitly punishable under MNRP law, would be considered an offense under the laws of a **Province**, **State**, **Territory**, **or Possession**, shall be guilty of a like offense and subject to equivalent punishment under the authority of the **MNRP Court of Justice**.
- (b) Regulations Concerning the Operation of Motor Vehicles
- (1) Any judicial or administrative punishment imposed by a Province, State, Territory, or Possession for operating a motor vehicle under the influence of drugs or alcohol shall be recognized and enforced within the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the MNRP, subject to MNRP laws and regulations.
- (2) Additional penalties shall apply as follows:
 - If a minor is present in the vehicle at the time of the offense, an additional **term of imprisonment of up to one (1) year** shall be imposed.
 - If the offense results in **serious bodily injury of a minor**, the imprisonment term shall be **up to five (5) years**.
 - If the offense results in **the death of a minor**, the imprisonment term shall be **up to ten** (10) **years**, with additional fines determined under MNRP law.
- (c) Any territorial waters of the MNRP that lie outside the jurisdiction of any Province, State, or Possession, including airspace, seabed, and artificial structures, shall be deemed to fall under MNRP jurisdiction, with enforcement under MNRP national laws.

SECTION 13: OBLIGATION OR OTHER SECURITY OF A FOREIGN GOVERNMENT DEFINED

The term "obligation or other security of any foreign government" includes, but is not limited to, uncanceled stamps, financial instruments, or other documents of value issued by a foreign state, whether or not they are demonetized or still in circulation.

SECTION 14: CRIME OF VIOLENCE DEFINED

A "crime of violence" is defined as:

- 1. An offense involving the use, attempted use, or threatened use of physical force against an individual or their property.
- 2. Any **felony offense** that, by its nature, presents a **substantial risk** that force may be used **during the commission of the crime**.

SECTION 15: INSANITY DEFENSE

AFFIRMATIVE DEFENSE: It shall be an **affirmative defense** in any **MNRP criminal prosecution** that, at the time of the alleged offense, the defendant, due to a **severe mental disease or defect**, was **incapable of understanding the nature or wrongfulness of their actions**. However, mental disease or defect **shall not constitute a defense** in any other context.

BURDEN OF PROOF:

• The defendant bears the burden of proving an insanity defense by clear and convincing evidence before the MNRP Court of Justice.

SECTION 16: ORGANIZATION DEFINED

For the purposes of this title, the term "organization" refers to any legal entity other than an individual, including but not limited to:

- Corporations
- Associations
- Partnerships
- Sovereign Institutions
- Trusts
- Any other legally recognized collective body operating under MNRP jurisdiction.

SECTION 17: PETTY OFFENSE DEFINED

The term "petty offense" shall include:

- Class B Misdemeanors
- Class C Misdemeanors
- Infractions

A petty offense shall be defined as an offense where the maximum fine does not exceed 10,000 Noble Dollar, or as otherwise prescribed under MNRP Public Law

SECTION 18: FINANCIAL INSTITUTION DEFINED

The term "financial institution" as used in this title refers to any entity engaged in banking, lending, monetary transactions, or financial contracts, including but not limited to:

1. Depository Institutions

- Any insured depository institution recognized under the MNRP National Banking System.
- Credit unions with accounts insured by the National Credit Union Share Insurance Fund.
- o Any National Reserve Bank or a member of the National Reserve System.

2. Lending & Investment Institutions

- Any National home loan bank or member of the National home loan bank system.
- o System institutions under the MNRP Farm Credit System.
- o **Small business investment companies** operating within MNRP commerce.
- Mortgage lending businesses, including individuals or entities engaged in financing real estate transactions.

3. Private Financial Contracts & Foreign Banking

- Any private contract between two parties for the exchange of a benefit, service, or item of value.
- Any organization operating a branch or agency of a foreign bank within MNRP jurisdiction.

SECTION 19: STOLEN OR COUNTERFEIT PROPERTY IN CRIMES

- (a) In this title, an offense shall be considered a **crime of property fraud** when:
 - Any item, document, or financial instrument has been **embezzled**, **robbed**, **stolen**, **converted**, **taken**, **altered**, **counterfeited**, **falsely made**, **forged**, **or obliterated**.
 - The **defendant had knowledge** that the property was unlawfully acquired or altered.

(b) Official Representation:

• An **official representation** is any **statement, verification, or declaration** made by an **MNRP National Security Officer or other authorized official** confirming the nature of the property in question.

SECTION 20: COURT OF THE MOORISH NATIONAL REPUBLIC OF PEACE DEFINED

The "Court of the Moorish National Republic of Peace" includes all judicial bodies established under the MNRP Constitution. All MNRP courts shall be considered Supreme

Courts, with the authority to adjudicate matters pertaining to the national government and its laws.

The **Supreme Religious Council** shall have the power to **create and establish specialized courts**, including but not limited to:

- Consular Courts Handling diplomatic and foreign affairs cases.
- Common Law Courts Exercising civil and criminal jurisdiction.
- International Criminal Courts Addressing violations of international treaties.
- Bankruptcy Courts Managing cases of insolvency and commercial disputes.
- Small Claims & Chancery Courts Handling monetary disputes and equity matters.

SECTION 22: NATIONAL HEALTH CARE OFFENSES

- (a) A National Health Care Offense includes violations or criminal conspiracies related to medical fraud, malpractice, or abuse within the MNRP health care system.
- (b) Definition of Health Care Benefit Program:
 - Any **public or private health care plan** affecting **commerce**, under which any **medical benefit, item, or service** is provided.
 - Includes all providers and entities participating in such plans.
- (c) Vaccination Prohibition:
 - No MNRP National or Citizen shall be forcibly vaccinated.
 - Any act of vaccination shall be classified as poisoning and punishable as attempted murder, carrying:
 - o A 10-year sentence, a 1,000,000,000 Noble Dollar fine, or both.

SECTION 22: USE OF MINORS IN CRIMES OF VIOLENCE

- (a) **Definitions:**
 - A **crime of violence** is as defined in **Section 16**.
 - A minor is any person under 18 years of age.
 - Uses refers to any act of employing, hiring, persuading, inducing, enticing, or coercing a minor in criminal activity.

(b) **Penalties:**

- First Conviction The offender shall receive twice the maximum prison sentence and fine authorized for the crime.
- Subsequent Convictions The offender shall receive three times the maximum penalty for the crime.

SECTION 23: SEAPORT DEFINED

A seaport refers to any pier, wharf, dock, or similar maritime structure within MNRP jurisdiction where vessels may be secured.

The definition includes:

- All land, water, and infrastructure associated with such facilities.
- Buildings, equipment, and materials stored within these structures.
- Jurisdiction over maritime trade, navigation, and vessel security.

SECTION 24: MORTGAGE LENDING BUSINESS DEFINED

A mortgage lending business refers to:

- Any entity engaged in **financing or refinancing debt secured by real estate**.
- Includes private mortgage companies and their subsidiaries.
- Any individual who enters into a private mortgage contract for the exchange of property, goods, or services.
