- Access Transportation** (909) 379-7284
Provides equal access to public transportation for people who are physically or cognitively unable to use regular bus service. Access provides curb-to-curb service to complement the Omnitrans fixed-route bus system. The Access service area is defined as up to 3/4 mile on either side of an existing bus route. Application processes are now through the marketing dept. Application process takes up to one month.

Provides referrals for the elderly, mentally and physically disabled.
