<p>CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.CCRA.L.3</p> <p>Apply knowledge of language to understand how language functions in different contexts, to make effective choices for meaning or style, and to comprehend more fully when reading or listening.</p>	<p>Take a scene of the play and improvise how it would change in a different context (characters are different ages, setting changes, etc). Taking ideas from the improvisations, students write their own scenes.</p>
<p>CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.CCRA.L.4</p> <p>Determine or clarify the meaning of unknown and multiple-meaning words and phrases by using context clues, analyzing meaningful word parts, and consulting general and specialized reference materials, as appropriate.</p>	<p>Prepare words that students will encounter in the play and words that would help them write/speak about the play. For example, if a play takes place under water, the word “marine” may not show up in the play, but would be a useful word (depending on age).</p> <p>Read books on playwriting/acting and facilitate activities in which students use the language of plays (appropriate to their age, possibly including <i>stage</i>, <i>blocking</i>, <i>stage directions</i>, <i>aside</i>, <i>monologue</i>, etc)</p>
<p>CCSS.ELA-LITERACY.CCRA.L.5</p> <p>Demonstrate understanding of figurative language, word relationships, and nuances in word meanings.</p>	<p>Use stills from the play to write descriptions that employ both concrete and figurative language.</p> <p>Introduce a range of adjectives (some known, some less familiar) to attribute to main characters of the play. Which words best match which character? Why? When?</p>

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
