Now for some suggestions about New Year resolutions:


- 1. Forget about dieting. It never works out.



### Rambling from Jee to Green

Can you believe we're actually starting a new season already? The Pandemic and its lockdowns and social distancing seem like ancient history but it was only about a year and a half since it was officially declared over. Yet the blow the Senior Golfers Association of Atlanta took continues to linger and will take all of us working together to overcome the consequences.

Our name says it all: **Senior** Golfers Association of Atlanta. I can remember (barely) when I thought 55 was ancient; now I have children that age so it shouldn't come as a surprise that the Pandemic took a toll on our membership. Health issues became more prominent as we couldn't get out and socialize and enjoy the fresh air and sunshine on the golf course. I have read, albeit on the internet, that being able to socialize has great benefits for the well-being of everyone; especially the elderly. And you know if it's on the internet it has got to be true. So some of our members just haven't been able to get back out on the course and as a result are no longer active members of SGAA. And then again, some of those who have returned to the course just can't move as quickly as they did before and/or they don't hit the ball as far or as well. And that my friends can lead to slow play.

And with that we take up the double-edged sword. How do we reduce the length of our rounds without driving some of our long-time members away and at the same time add new members while we encounter what we perceive to be slow play? I wish there was a simple answer to this complex question, but alas there's not one.

But we can make the situation better if we work together. And it's going to take all of us.

I would like to think I'm not considered a slow player; but if you're behind my group as we approach the 5 hour mark of our round — everyone ahead of you is a slow player.

As I implied, since Covid many of us aren't moving as quickly as we did pre-pandemic. But there are things we can do to mitigate our lack of quickness and most importantly is to play **Ready Golf**! That means we overcome our lack of rapid mobility by using our heads. As you leave the tee box consider where your ball lies and **think** about what your next shot will be and when you arrive at your ball, choose your club, take your practice swing, and make the shot. Repeat this as you go around the course. And if by chance a player has to look for his ball, don't wait on him, play your shot and **then** help him find his (remember you only have 3 minutes to search). Don't stand on ceremony if you're ready to play your shot even though you're not "away" and not in the line of fire, go ahead and play your shot. Once on the green we know every putt is important but it shouldn't take five minutes to line up your putt. And once the hole is completed move off the green and record your score at the next tee box – again not taking all day to do it.

Along with ready golf a change in attitude might be in order. You're not the only one on the course so don't act like it. Not everyone is a scratch golfer so don't get upset if they make a bad shot. Remember, if we were as good as we think we should be; we'd be on TV on the weekends. Not only will you enjoy your round more you'll help others have an enjoyable time too; it just takes the right attitude.
