

Below is a summary of the issue (as I understand it)

> Background: Pre-registration was proposed at the last BOD meeting as a way to help provide courses better information regarding how many SGAA members might be expected at their course (give or take) on a given day. This has become important for a limited number of courses we play, but it's anticipated that it will become more of an issue going forward. Courses have to try to appease their regular members when we come to play at their courses. It's thought that if we make it easier for the management of those courses, and perhaps more palatable for their members, that it may be more attractive for courses to allow us to play, and may position the SGAA more positively in the minds of both course management See you on the tee – and their members. Another bene-

fit from such a program includes the ability to arrive at courses later on play days. Registration would still be available the mornings of the games.

- Before this initiative can be officially implemented, a detailed proposal needs to be placed before the BOD for discussion (and subsequent approval or tabling) and a number of issues and concerns related to the issue need to be considered. Some "proof-ofconcept" testing of various elements of the proposed initiative will likely occur in the near future.
- You should feel free to contact any BOD member with your thoughts regarding this, or any, issue. As a reminder, while only BOD members vote on issues at the meetings, the BOD meetings are open and anyone can attend.


Rambling from Tee to Green

A SHORT COURSE FOR NEW MEMBERS AND A REFRESHER FOR OTHERS

- 1— Arrive at the golf course in plenty of time to check in with the Table. If you are the first in your foursome to arrive, complete the scorecards (no more than two players per card) for your group and turn them in with the table fee (currently \$5 per member) and await your hole assignment. No scorecards will be accepted without full table fees. [You must have at least three players in your group to turn your scorecards in to the Table for a hole assignment.]
- 2 After receiving your hole assignment immediately go to the pro shop and pay the appropriate green fees.
- 3 If carts have been designated by the course for a particular hole grouping put your clubs on the designated cart; if carts are not pre-assigned by the course select an empty cart.

Scoring is defined in the By-Laws and various "handicap" points are given for your score on each hole and is as follows:
