It's no surprise that the golf industry is changing. Many traditional golf courses are being closed for other development, including housing. At least five courses in our area have closed since 2017 and others are in jeopardy. Inflation has affected the operating costs of courses, particularly the costs of chemicals and labor. Since the typical golf course covers 150 or more acres, marginally profitable or unprofitable courses are ripe for alternative development.

Many driving ranges have also been redeveloped in recent years. Driving ranges have traditionally been "place holders" for more profitable development. The large number of open acres covered by the typical driving range are attractive to developers and investors.

Top Golf was possibly the first organization to develop alternative nontraditional golf venues. Organized be twin brothers Steve and Dave Jolliffe in 2000 and acquired by Callaway in 2021, Top Golf features balls with microchips which facilitate automatic tracking and scoring and offers extensive food and drink menus. Top Golf markets to both experienced golfers and newbies, and provides a party-like atmosphere for participants.

Golfers may bring their own clubs or use clubs furnished by Top Golf. A number of automatically scored games are offered, including simulations of popular golf courses.


Top Golf has experienced rapid growth. There are now almost 100 locations in over ten countries, including two in the Atlanta area.

Another recently formed organization providing an alternative to the traditional golf course is GolfSuites. Only two locations are open, one in Lubbock, TX, and other in New Orleans, but two others are scheduled to open in 2025.

Unlike Top Golf, GolfSuites locations feature indoor simulators. GolfSuites also offer food and drink. The company has recently announced plans for CityClubs, a more upscale golf simulator lounge.

These golf alternatives are unlikely to replace the traditional game, but they may serve to increase the interest in the royal game.

And, finally, a joke, courtesy of Mark Padzur of Executive Golfer: Why do pros encourage you to keep you head down in the swing: So you can't see them laughing.
