As I write this article we are near the end of the 68th year of SGAA. It has been a successful year.

At the beginning of the year the board approved three priorities for 2024: Increase membership, increase participation in both play and administration, and increase the effectiveness of the committee structure.

We have been most successful in adding new members. Through October we added 33 new members, and 3 others have indicated that they plan to join in early 2025. All indications are that this momentum will continue into 2025.

Two major factors have contributed to our success. Most importantly, a number of incumbent members sponsored new members. Second, the link on our website enabling visitors to inquire about membership. Many inquired and most of those became members.


Participation is another matter. In-town rounds decreased by about 6% from 2023 despite the fact that fewer rounds were cancelled this year. This was influenced by the loss in 2023 of Cotton Fields, a popular venue. Out of town rounds decreased by about 17%. So participation must continue to be emphasized.

But there's some good news. After adjustment for date of membership, new members played almost 10% more rounds on average than incumbent members.

It has been my honor to serve as your president this year. While there have been some bumps in the road, it has been an enjoyable experience.

A long list of members made important contributions to our success this year. Larry Fauconnet, Mike Nobles and Dave Mueller head that list. They have offered invaluable advice and counsel and often saved me from myself. John Cyran responded immediately to my sometimes inchoate requests for information. The entire board has participated actively and has been a great support. Jeff Hyland worked tirelessly and effectively in making arrangements with the more than 20 courses we played. Larry Thomas, Dave Walters, Chris Curles and Rick Carrick arranged a great volunteer event. All of our committees worked very effectively. The table crews operated flawlessly. And I must apologize for not including many others who made important contributions.

Enjoy a few weeks off and have a Happy Holiday season. Let's get off to a fast start in 2025.





But that "go to club" we use around the green can be left without a second thought. So it would be a good idea to put our name and address on each of our clubs.



I agree, Ray's not just a pretty face; he a pretty smart fella too.



From Article 1 Paragraph D of the Bylaws

D. DUES: Each member is required to pay annual membership dues of \$25.00. A dues notice will be posted in the Newsletters at least 60 days prior to January 1. All dues and fees must be paid by January 1 or the member will be dropped from the membership rolls. Any member suspended for non-payment of dues may be reinstated by March 31st of the next year with a majority vote of the Board of Directors provided all monies (including a penalty of \$20) due SGAA are paid in full. (R13)
