I want to make you aware of two changes that were approved in our August Board of Directors meeting that will go into effect in the 2026 season. The first only involves members with a handicap of less than 10 at the start of the season. Those members will be given the option to play from designated tees behind the tees that we currently play. If they choose this option, they must play from those tees for the full season. Several low handicap members had requested this option to make rounds more challenging and to allow them to use all the clubs in their bag. We want to continue to attract and retain low handicap members and this change will hopefully facilitate that.

The second change involves the Annual Tournament. Starting next year, it will be six rounds over two weeks rather than nine rounds over three weeks. Results will be based on the best three rounds out of a possible six rounds rather than the best four rounds out of a possible nine rounds like it is currently. We will capture and pay out closest-to-the-pin winners by flight just like we do in our other intown dogfight tournaments. We will not pay out birdies but will continue to pay out eagles (or better). This change was made to give us more options when choosing a site for our Annual Tournament.

We have had 31 new members join our ranks this year. According to Ted Pogue, this is the first time in several years that we have added more members through the year than we dropped off the roles at the end of the previous year. You are doing a great job of inviting your friends and their friends to join SGAA! I really appreciate your efforts and hope that you will continue to share the great story that we have to tell the senior golfers in the Atlanta area.

I am pleased to announce that George Shingler and Jim Goldsack have been appointed to the Board of Directors, effective August 18, 2025. They were approved by the Board to fill the unexpired terms of Bill Herbert and Steve Allen, who recently resigned. Please join me in congratulating George and Jim on their appointments—we look forward to their contributions and leadership in their new roles



Rambling from Tee to Green

Not all holes or moments in golf history involve sensational shots or championships. Ben Hogan stamped his name in First Coast golf history by making an 8-over-par 11 on a par 3 at Hyde Park in the 1947 Jacksonville Open.

Hogan was three shots off the lead in the third round, and tugged his tee shot into the pond on the left — which was larger than it is now. The ball was barely visible above the water and Hogan thought he could splash it onto the green.

He tried four times and finally took an unplayable lie. He hit his seventh shot to the top of the bank, and the ball rolled back down in the water.

After his penalty shot, he hit his ninth onto the green and two-putted for the 11. Hogan shot 79 in the round and came back the next day with a 68.

Points to Ponder

Do you struggle with par 3's like I do? For some reason I'm either terrible or terrific on these holes – the balance seems to lean toward the terrible side of the scale. I've told myself it's just an approach shot to the green. I don't usually have a lot of trouble with my final shot to the green so why does a par 3 approach shot (tee) psych me out?

Have you found the putting green isn't a true representation of how the greens roll on the course in many cases?

Why drives on the driving range are long and straight, but on the course they're short and lost? Why do putts that are straight and true stop one revolution short of the hole; but putts slightly offline roll ten feet past the hole?

Johnny Gilbert was a popular sports star as well as a 1989 graduate of Monroe Comprehensive High School in Albany, Georgia; a 1996 graduate of Albany State College (University) and a 2002 graduate of Cambridge College in Massachusetts.

Johnny was an All-Star SIAC quarterback who led the Albany State College Rams to three conference championships.

In 1996 he began his coaching career as the Quarterback Coach at Monroe Comprehensive High School where he assisted in building a winning program. During Gilbert's tenure, the Monroe Comprehensive HS Tornadoes played in the state play-offs and enhanced their record from 8-3 to 12-2. After two years at MCHS, Johnny moved to Atlanta, and became the Offensive Coordinator at McNair High School. The following year (1999), Gilbert assumed the role of Head Football Coach and led the Mustangs to the pinnacle of success by claiming the Region Championship in 2002. His overall team record was 39-7.

In 2007, Gilbert made the move to Christian education and was employed by Strong Rock Christian School (Locust Grove, GA), where he served as a Health and Physical Education teacher. He also coached basketball and track.

In 2011, Coach Gilbert joined the staff of Creekside Christian Academy (McDonough, GA) as a Health and Physical Education teacher, as well as the Quarterback and Defensive Coordinator for the varsity football team, and coach for the varisty and middle school golf teams. In 2013 and 2014, Gilbert's varsity golf team was named the GICAA State Champions. In 2013, Gilbert was named Head Varsity Football Coach and he served in that role until 2017. Additionally, in 2016, Gilbert was named Creekside Christian Academy Athletic Director and served in that position for three years.

In April 2019, Gilbert was named Head Varsity Football Coach at Dougherty Comprehensive High School, in Albany, Georgia.

Coach Gilbert is married to his college sweetheart, Shaneeka Gilbert, and they have two children, Johnny and Skyla.

2025 SGAA Annual Tournament

ANNUAL TOURNAMENT: This is a DOGFIGHT event and has 9 dates scheduled in September at the Panola Mountain Club Golf Course. It is stroke play based on gross score and limited to double bogey. Balls must be holed out on the

putting green up to one stroke less than double bogey. To determine net score, the player's dogfight handicap shall be deducted from his gross score.

YOU MUST HAVE AN SGAA ESTABLISHED HANDICAP to be eligible to play in this event and you must play a minimum of 4 rounds. You may play all 9 rounds as available on the schedule; but your best 4 rounds of the rounds played will determine your tournament score. Unlike other tournaments you pay a one time \$10.00 table fee on your first day of play and only pay green fees thereafter. If you opt to not participate in the Annual Tournament but want to join your friends to play golf, just notify the Table upon registration that you are not competing, and you will not pay

the \$10.00 table fee.

AN AWARD, DESIGNATED AS THE SGAA CLUB CHAMPION, with the Winner's name and the year of winning, engraved thereon, will be awarded to the player with the <u>lowest gross</u> score. This individual will be the 2025 SGAA Club Champion.



THERE WILL ALSO BE FOUR FLIGHT WINNERS (Flights A, B, C and D) and points will be awarded for each flight to the <u>lowest net</u> winner. The number of additional winners in each flight will be determined by the Tournament Committee and will be limited to the total prize funds collected for the tournament. In the event of ties, winners will be determined by the player having the lowest gross score

for the four rounds. If still tied, the one having the lowest gross round shall win. If still tied, their cards for the first round played of the four best rounds shall be compared as for match play and the one winning the first hole, under the rules governing match play, shall be the winner.

ANNUAL TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

Our Annual Tournament begins on Tuesday, September 2nd at Panola Mountain Golf Course. Tee time is 8:30 AM for all rounds of the tournament. There is a special one-time table fee of \$10.00 to be paid at the start of your tournament play. Green fees (\$32.00) are to be paid to the course before each round. There are 9 rounds scheduled for this tournament. You may play as many rounds during the tournament schedule as you like, but you MUST PLAY a minimum of 4 rounds to be considered as competing in the Annual Tournament. No matter how many rounds you complete during the Annual Tournament, your 4 best rounds will used to determine your tournament standing.

The standard pre-registration applies to the tournament. You do not have to enter the tournament to play. You may also just show up, notify the table of your intentions, get a hole assignment, and pay your green fee.

The following SGAA rules are provided as a refresher as we begin tournament play. Additional information may be provided by the Table Captains, or on the SGAA website, as the tournament progresses.

- 1. Rules of Play—USGA, PGA and local course rules shall govern play except as listed below. While SGAA Rules may seem to be very tolerant it is for the benefit of members of the Senior Golfers Association of Atlanta and to promote speedier play. Any member or members wishing to abide strictly by USGA and PGA rules are welcome to do so.
- 2. A PLAYER--May pick up to identify, clean or exchange a ball that comes to rest anywhere within the boundaries of the golf course and replace the ball one club length, or within one club length, no closer to the hole without penalty except on the green (see rule #3), or in a sand trap (see rule #4). The ball must be placed in the same general environment (1st cut, 2nd cut, rough, etc.) as it originally came to rest. If a ball cannot be played within one club length and still considered unplayable it can be moved any distance on a line of entry back towards the last point the ball was struck with a one stroke penalty.
- 3. ON THE GREEN—A player may mark the balls location and pick up to identify, clean or exchange his ball. Ball must be replaced at the mark where it was picked up.
- 4. SAND TRAP PLAY—If your ball is in a fairway bunker or greenside sand trap and lies in a foot print (human or otherwise), any untended sand marks from previous a player, or maintenance equipment, you can pick up your ball, rake the area of untended marks and replace your ball in the same spot without penalty. Also, any ball resting in water or mud can be pulled out and placed one club length no closer to the hole but still in the trap or bunker, without a penalty.
- 5. BALL OUT OF BOUNDS, UNPLAYABLE or LOST—When a ball is hit out of bounds, declared unplayable (see rule #2) or lost, after searching for a <u>maximum</u> of three (3) minutes, the player may place his ball any distance along the flight of the ball where the ball went out of bounds, is presumed lost or determined unplayable. A one (1)-stroke penalty shall be counted.
- 6. 14 CLUB RULE—Each player shall have no more than 14 clubs in his bag or face disqualification from that round.




