The royal game of golf is unique among major sports in that more people play golf than attend golf tournaments. In 2023, 26.6 million people played golf in the US, 3.4 million for the first time. This far exceeds the numbers who attend golf tournaments or watched golf on television.

Our SGAA numbers are interesting in comparison to the national statistics. Consider the following:

1. We have 30 new members through September, with 2 others applications pending. This is far more than in any recent year.
2. We played about 6% fewer rounds through August 2024 than through August 2023.
3. BUT the average number of members per round increased by 16.5%.
4. New members and existing members played about the same average number of rounds per member after adjusting for the tenure of new members.
5. The recently completed annual tournament was a great success. Congratulations to the winners.
6. Through August 2024, 46 members have not played a round, compared with 45 who did not play through August 2023 mostly because of age or health issues.

In summary, most of the above data which is under our control is encouraging, but we must continue our efforts to improve participation and increase membership. Each member shares this important responsibility.

There's a lot of good news as we look forward to 2025. Jeff Hyland has completed arrangements with all of the courses we played in 2024 and has added one new course. Green fees, which have been relatively stable in recent years, are expected to increase by about 10% over this year.

The improvements to the Country Club of Gwinnett course are also encouraging. New carts have been added, buildings have been repaired, the kitchen reopened, and merchandise added. We have been told that cart paths and drainage will be improved over the next several months.

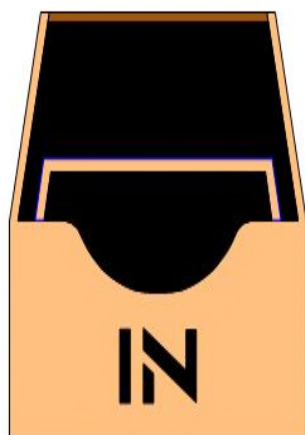
Come out and play often and help us wrap up a great 2024 and get a running start on 2025.

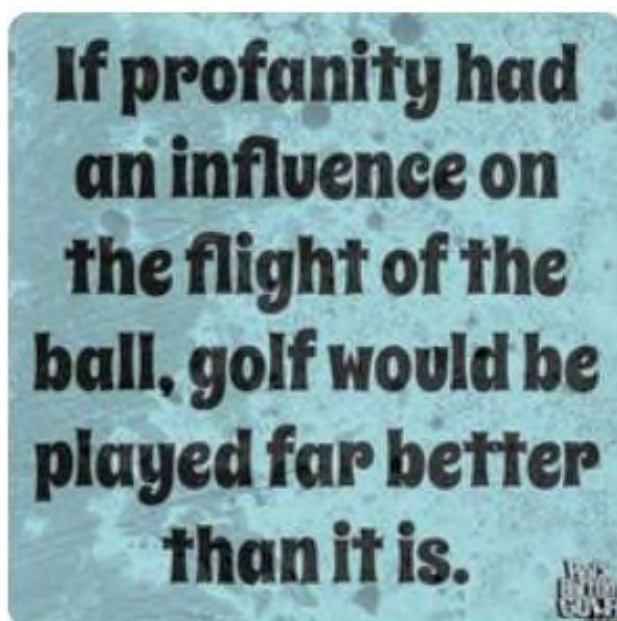

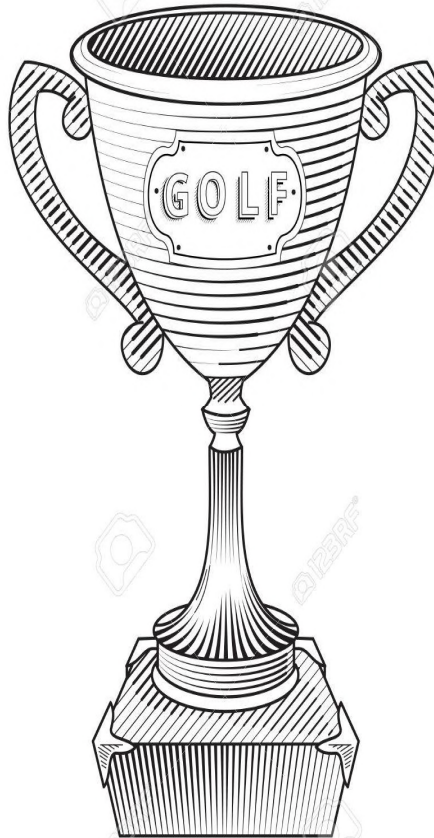
