Our vision for Rowan County is that every child will receive the education, nurturing, and support needed to provide the foundation for them to grow into healthy, productive citizens.


our mission

Early Care and Education Availability and **Affordability**

Provides financial assistance with child care costs for eligible families, as well as enhancements to child care programs to support high quality early learning environments.

Programs Funded: Child Care Subsidy and Subsidy Services Support, Star License Enhancement (SLE)

179

Children (ages 0-5) received Smart Start child care subsidy assistance

Child care facilities and family child care homes, all 4 or 5 star, received monetary enhancements for participation in the SLE activity

program impact

100% of subsidized children were enrolled in regulated, licensed child care with the majority of those enrolled in 4-and-5-star facilities.



Early Care and Education Quality

Improves the quality of care for young

children in local child care facilities, family child care homes, Head Start programs, public schools, and church preschools. Programs Funded: Early Learning Resource Center (ELRC), Education in Action (EIA), Child Care Resource & Referral (CCR&R), NC Pre-K Quality Enhancement & Support (NCPK QE&S), Childcare Health Consultation (CCHC), WAGE\$

Child care facilities/family child care homes received technical assistance (Note: This is a duplicated count based on the type of technical assistance provided)

Technical assistance opportunities were provided to early childhood professionals

Trainings/workshops were offered to early childhood professionals

Childcare staff received higher education advising and/or completed college courses

Child care staff from 18 facilities/family child care homes utilized the Early **Learning Resource Center**

Teachers and directors received salary supplements through WAGE\$

program impact

Of all Rowan County WAGE\$ participants, 96% shared that the supplements help ease financial stress and 100% shared that the supplements help them feel more appreciated and recognized for their work.

Family Support, Child Health, Literacy, and **Systems Building**

Provides families with education, information, resources and support so their children can have the best start in life. Programs Funded: Assuring Better Child Health & Development (ABCD), Community Awareness & Education, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library (DPIL), Healthy Beginnings, Kaleidoscope Play & Learn (KPL), Program Coordination & Evaluation, Reach Out & Read (ROR), and Triple P

Young children participated in child health and wellness programs offered by 6 medical practices, including Rowan **County Health Department**

Parents/caregivers participated in family support programs, including one-on-one and group parenting support, as well as parent/child playgroups

8,976Children, age 0-5, received DPIL books

6,758

Books were distributed to children for parents to read at home, by 27 medical practitioners trained in the ROR program.

Total participants attended 3 large parent-child interactive community events hosted by Smart Start Rowan

95% of caregivers felt more confident with their parenting responsibilities after participating in the Triple P-Positive Parenting Program.


