without George King. George was without doubt the driving force behind Blackburn Leisure Astronomy Society, without whom our society and observatory probably would not have existed. He was fascinated by space, spaceflight and photography and always keen to show anyone how to take remarkable pictures of clouds, sunsets, night skies and of course honing his photography skills on the moon. Always excited to show young and old alike our place in the universe, George's dedication to our astronomy group and passion for unravelling the mysteries of the cosmos have left an indelible



mark on our collective journey. He was the man that made our observatory and what we have today a reality.



He transferred the skills acquired during his working life in aviation to the plans and reality of the observatory domes, without which we would be back to the days of meeting on dark hill sides. In his earlier life George was a firefighter who attended many very dangerous life threatening situations putting his own safety on the line to save others. George was always happy to chat into the early hours of the morning and listen to anyone. George was laid to rest at a poignant service at Haltemprice crematorium on 20<sup>th</sup> December. When the service ended the moon could be seen

between the clouds in the afternoon sky which reminded us all of the many hours George spent photographing our moon. I know George was looking forward to NASA's Artemis program which is set to make significant strides in 2024, with the planned return of humans to the lunar surface to lay the groundwork for future crewed missions to Mars. In short George was one of the most remarkable men anyone could wish to meet. The words "Thank you for everything" will never ever be enough. We are resolutely proud of everything you achieved and you can rest in peace in the knowledge that Astronomy at Brough will continue in your memory.

On the wall of our observatory is a picture of George shaking the hand of <u>Sir Patrick Moore</u> who prided himself in the belief that he was the only person to have met during his lifetime the first aviator, Orville Wright, the first man in space, Yuri Gagarin, and the first man on the moon, Neil Armstrong. I for one am proud to have shaken the hand of a man who shook the hand of all of the pioneering aviators. Rest In Peace George. Our deepest sympathies are with his beloved wife Hilary and his family.
