What We Do in Lessons:

- Through progressively difficult repertoire, we learn *musicianship* for life-long enjoyment: instrument technique, rhythm & flow, music literacy & history, composition/songwriting & improvisation, stage presence & focused listening, plus an abundance of additional life skills for young people: self-confidence, teamwork/independence, & discipline, for example. We use a variety of teaching materials based on student interest & goals.
- We will perform 2-3x each year at our own studio recitals & encourage you to think of your own places to share what you're working on: an open mic, talent show, church, family gathering, party, etc. We're happy to help you prep for those as well.
- Learning an instrument takes time months & years of committed practice. Like most things... The more you put into it, the more you'll get out of it! The more you do, the better you get.

Your First Lesson:

- Bring any music materials you've previously used. Check your email for your My Music Staff login information & add <u>noreply@mymusicstaff.com</u> as well as <u>info@ellensburgmusic.com</u> to your safe-sender list. Sync your Student Portal calendar with your regular calendar.
- In-person: We are located at 103 E. 3rd Ave., across the street from the post office. Families are always welcome to stay in the waiting room or in our studio rooms, & please note that most students work better with their teachers independently. We can record our lesson for your family to review later by request. No food or drink past the waiting room please.
- Online: log in at least 5 minutes early with the link provided by your teacher. You are always welcome to record your lessons to review privately later.

The Music School Model:

- With our collaborative business model, MME students & teachers get more, diverse
 opportunities for making music. You have access to a whole team of professional teachers &
 will likely work with multiple teachers throughout the year.
- We thoughtfully match our students to teachers, but let us know if you have a specific teacher you'd like to learn with either on a temporary or long-term basis. Contact Director Jan directly.
- Jan often works behind the scenes. For matters regarding adding or cancelling services, payments & charges, studio-wide events (including recitals), the studio space itself, or to provide teacher feedback, contact Jan directly. For music questions & individual lesson conflicts (for example), contact your teacher.



Monthly Payments:

- Payments are due on the first of each month for upcoming lessons. You will receive an invoice
 via email each month, or ask us to pay quarterly. This fee includes lessons, recitals, student
 appreciation events, & first access to all workshops & other opportunities. We do not offer
 refunds or discounts for missed lessons between October-June, though offer flexible scheduling
 from July-September. (See "Cancellations & Closures" below.)
- Methods of payment: Mail or drop a check (for "Make Music Ellensburg") at 103 E 3rd St., Ellensburg, WA 98926. You can also pay online with credit via a link in your invoice.
- One goal of Make Music Ellensburg is to support enthusiastic students regardless of ability to pay. Please ask about arrangements & scholarships or ask HopeSource for youth scholarship information (www.hopesource.us & 509-925-1448).

Cancellations & Closures:

- If you must cancel a lesson, please contact your teacher ASAP. Your teacher will send a video lesson with materials tailored just for you if we can't reschedule within 7 days. No-shows will not be offered make-up lessons or videos.
- For sick days, we are happy to accommodate by meeting online instead of in-person or by creating a tailored video lesson for you to work through at your convenience. Please be considerate to others & stay home if you are unwell. Any students showing signs of illness may be asked to wear a mask or be sent home.
- Teacher cancellations: We are proud that our teachers are performing artists as well. We try to
 minimize conflicts in their schedules & thank you for your flexibility on occasion. If a teacher is
 unavailable, you may be assigned a guest teacher at your regular lesson time, offered a
 reschedule, or given credit on your account.

Online Lessons Preparation for All Students:

- All of our students will have a virtual lesson from time to time for sick days, school-wide snow days, or just for your convenience. Here are how to get the most out of your virtual lessons:
 - o A strong internet connection is a must, & a large screen is very helpful.
 - Make sure you have plenty of light on you & are in a quiet location.
 - o Back up enough that your face, body, & instrument are all in the screen.
 - Optimize your sound options so your teacher can hear you better:
 - In Zoom: Click on "audio settings," lower or disable the "suppress persistent background noise" options. You may also need to uncheck the "automatically adjust microphone volume" option & in the advanced settings, select "Show inmeeting option to enable original sound."



Covid-19 Precautions:

 We are following the most current recommendations for preventing Covid-19 spread in our school. We are offering virtual lessons indefinitely & will continue to offer virtual or video lessons for any student with symptoms of illness. We have HEPA air cleaners in each room, masks & hand-washing available at all times, & our teachers are happy to mask in lessons when requested.

Practice Tips:

- Make practice part of your **daily routine**, & only practice on days you eat! Your ultimate practice goal is to build habits that you don't even have to think about. Habits are created by doing the same thing over & over again.
- A little bit every day is the best way. Elementary students do well with 5-15 minutes per day with guidance. Older students may look forward to 10-45+.
- Keep in mind that practice does not make perfect perfect practice makes perfect. Practice
 makes progress when you stay goal-oriented. Think: what is your goal for this practice session?
 What would you like to accomplish before your next lesson? Review your lesson notes & stay
 on track, then give yourself a few minutes explore & experiment on your instrument. Play is
 important, too!
- Participate in every recital. There's no better way to get you motivated to improve!
- Finally, don't stress out about practicing. You get better the more you practice & play, but we're here to help you learn & enjoy music. If you do not practice every day at home, you will still make some progress if you are consistent & try your best in every lesson. Children especially benefit from listening to, dancing to, & watching others make music, too. There are even music apps & games we can recommend to supplement your learning. Normalize making music in your family. Finally, if you need the extra motivation & guidance to meet your goals, consider scheduling longer lessons or schedule them twice a week.
