HELP KEEP OUR LAKE SAFE

- Boat traffic on Hooker Lake runs counter clockwise
- No wake after SUNSET and before 10 AM -7 DAYS A WEEK
 - No wake during times of high water which will be posted at the boat landings by the Village and are Available on the Village website.
- No wake within 200 feet of any pier, dock or floating raft
- PWC (Jet Skis) cannot make wake within 200 feet of shoreline or other watercraft
- When boating give the right of way to the boat on your right
- State Law requires children under the age of 13 to wear US Coast Guard approved PFDs
- Anyone born after January 1, 1989 and 16 years of age must complete a boater safety course.
- The laws are now posted on the signs at the boat landings.
- Boat safely as a good example.

Please inform your children neighbors and guests of the boating regulations.

To prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species and diseases Wisconsin law requires that you:

- Inspect your boat, trailer, & equipment
- Remove any attached aquatic plants or animals (before launching, after loading & before transporting on a public highway
- Drain all water from boats, motors and all equipment
- Don't move live fish away from a water body
- Buy minnows from a Wisconsin bait dealer

Purple Loosestrife

Do you have it on your shoreline? It looks pretty but it doesn't belong here. It's an invasive species that chokes out the good native plants.
