

Expungement is the removal of a criminal case from your record. This factsheet outlines what cases likely are and are not expungeable in Maryland. **This is not legal advice**. Please consult an attorney about your particular situation. In Maryland, a person's criminal and traffic records can be viewed by the public through Judiciary Case Search (<u>http://casesearch.courts.state.md.us/casesearch/</u>). The public availability of these records may impact your ability to find employment, secure housing, and access other benefits.

Important note: Charges that resulted in a nolle prosequi, acquittal, or dismissal no longer appear on Maryland Case Search. However, these charges are not automatically expunged and could be discovered through a background search or fingerprint check. We recommend consulting with an attorney to determine what remains on your record and what can be expunged.

PROCESS

- Whether a case is expungeable is determined primarily on the dispositions you received in the case.
- You cannot expunge individual charges, only the case as a whole.
 If one charge in the case cannot be expunged, then the case as a whole cannot be expunged.
- Visit <u>MDexpungement.com</u> to generate your petition for free, or a MVLS attorney can help you if you qualify.
- You cannot file for expungement in any case if you have an active criminal proceeding.
- If you are not a US citizen, expungement may be detrimental to future immigration proceedings. Please consult an immigration attorney before filing.

BASIC GUIDELINE

- This is a GENERAL overview of expungement law. In certain circumstances there may be other factors that determine eligibility.
- If your guilty conviction is not listed as one of the eligible convictions on the back, then it is probably not expungeable.

 Probation Before Judgement (PBJ) <u>Waiting time:</u> 3 years, or the length of the probation, whichever is longer DUI/DWI are not expungeable If you were convicted of another non-expungeable crime within 3 years of this PBJ, the PBJ cannot be expunged 	 Guilty for Marijuana Possession <u>Waiting time:</u> 4 years from disposition date Amount of marijuana no longer matters
