Sheriff Fyock shared his stories with us about serving in the Army during Vietnam and, a very impressive milestone, being in law enforcement for 50 years! Our other neighboring table was the decoration table, where

children could decorate wooden tree cutouts with paint, glitter, stickers, glue, and....maybe transporting the trees home wasn't a concern on our priority list. But, we had fun pointing out all of the messy options to the kids when they would stop to decorate.
