# Why we pray

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# Kingdom Insights

## Galatians 1

### 1. Rescued by Jesus

We are delivered from this present evil age by Jesus Christ—according to the will, purpose, and plan of God the Father (Galatians 1:4).

### 2. Warning Against False Gospels

Paul expresses shock and frustration that believers are turning to distorted gospels. Forming allegiances with false teachers. A false teacher is a teacher but he/she presents a gospel shaped by human invention rather than divine revelation (Galatians 1:6–9).

### 3. Revelation, Not Imitation

The true gospel is not man-made. Paul received it by direct revelation from Jesus Christ, not from human instruction (Galatians 1:11–12).

### 4. Pleasing God Over People

Paul emphasizes that if his aim were popularity with people, he could not truly be a bondservant of Christ (Galatians 1:10).

### 5. Relatable Redemption

Paul's past of persecuting the church shows that God uses even those who once opposed Him, redeeming and repurposing their lives (Galatians 1:13–14).

### 6. Set Apart by God

Paul was called and set apart from birth to know and reveal the Son of God. His calling was divine, not based on human validation (Galatians 1:15–16).

### 7. Unshaken Obedience

Paul did not seek approval or guidance from others before stepping into his assignment. His response was immediate and Spirit-led (Galatians 1:16–17).

### 8. God Gets the Glory

Despite persecution, Paul pressed into the commission. As a result, people glorified God because of the work in his life (Galatians 1:23–24).





# What destroys the Church

1.

## **Rejecting Freedom in Christ**

Ignoring our liberty in Christ nullifies the cross and the power of His blood.

2.

## **Pursuing Man's Favour Over God's Will**

Prioritising human approval leads to compromise and spiritual stagnation.

3.

## **Allegiances with False Teachers**

Agreement with those preaching a man-made gospel opens doors to confusion and deception.

4.

## **Delaying Obedience**

Seeking excessive counsel or validation can reveal a lack of trust in our identity and calling, delaying God's purpose.



# Kingdom Petitions

## **1. Liberty in Christ**

Lord, may we take hold of the freedom You purchased for us by the cross.

## **2. Discernment and Separation**

Help us break every allegiance that promotes a man-made gospel. Purify our hearts and our influences.

## **3. Courage to Obey**

Grant us the courage to step into Your commission, knowing we are chosen and set apart to reveal Christ.

## **4. Faithfulness Over Popularity**

Teach us to value Your approval above all. Make us faithful servants, not seekers of man's praise.

## **5. Alignment with God's Will**

May our "yes" to You silence every competing voice. Add to us the right relationships, resources, and direction.

## **6. Spirit-led Living**

Holy Spirit, lead us to become who we were created to be and do all that God has called us to do.

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# Kingdom Decrees

1.

**Christ purchased my freedom**

— I am released from condemnation. (Galatians 1:4)

2.

**Condemnation highlights my failures,**

Christ has freed me to reconcile with our Holy God.

(Romans 8:1, Galatians 1:4)

3.

**The law is fulfilled in Christ**

— I walk in joyful obedience to God's Word. (Matthew 5:17, Galatians 1:4)

4.

**I break every allegiance in my life that promotes a false gospel.**

(Galatians 1:6–9)

5.

**I say yes to God**

— I am a faithful servant of Jesus. I no longer seek man's approval. I live to please God alone. (Galatians 1:10)

6.

**I have favour with God and the right people.** (Galatians 1:24)

7.

**My focus is on God, not on man's inventions or patterns.**

— I receive the gospel revealed by Christ, not shaped by man.

(Galatians 1:11–12)

8.

**I am courageous.** (Galatians 1:23)

9.

**I am chosen and set apart to reveal Jesus.**

— God chose and called me before I was born, and I walk in that calling with boldness (Galatians 1:15–16)

10.

**I follow the Holy Spirit as He leads me to be who I was created to be and to do what God has called me to do.** (Galatians 1:16–17)

11.

**God is glorified in me as I walk in obedience to His revelation.**

(Galatians 1:24)



# *Galatians 2*



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# Kingdom Insights

## Galatians 2

### 1. Unity in the Gospel

Paul confirms his gospel with the apostles in Jerusalem, affirming that there is one true gospel for both Jews and Gentiles. (Galatians 2:1–2)

### 2. No Compromise on Liberty

Paul refuses to yield to pressure from false believers who wanted to enslave them with legalism. Our freedom in Christ must be guarded. (Galatians 2:4–5)

### 3. Grace, Not Rank

1. Though the apostles were pillars, they added nothing to Paul's message. God shows no partiality—grace is the standard, not position. (Galatians 2:6–9)

### 4. Accountability in the Kingdom

1. Paul confronts Peter publicly for hypocrisy—walking in fear of man rather than truth. In the kingdom, even leaders must be corrected in love. (Galatians 2:11–14)

### 5. Justified by Faith Alone

We are justified by faith in Christ—not by observing the law. Works of the law cannot save. (Galatians 2:16)

### 6. Crucified with Christ

We no longer live by our old nature. We live by faith in the Son of God who gave Himself for us. (Galatians 2:20)

### 7. Don't Nullify Grace

If righteousness comes through [observing] the Law, then Christ died needlessly. [His suffering and death would have had no purpose whatsoever. (Galatians 2:21)]





# What destroys the Church

1.

## **Legalistic Influence**

Submitting again to the law nullifies grace and undermines the finished work of Christ.

2.

## **Hypocrisy Among Believers**

Pretending to be something we are not, especially in matters of race or religion, damages unity and testimony.

3.

## **Fear of Man**

Allowing the opinions or presence of others to change our actions weakens our witness and hinders truth.

4.

## **Diluting the Gospel**

When we add conditions to salvation beyond faith in Christ, we present a different gospel altogether.



# Kingdom Petitions

## 1. **Guard Our Freedom**

Lord, help us not to submit again to the yoke of bondage. May we walk boldly in the liberty of Christ.

## 2. **Boldness to Confront**

Grant us courage and wisdom to confront falsehood and hypocrisy, even when it's uncomfortable.

## 3. **Faith Over Works**

Let our hearts be anchored in grace. May we rest in justification through faith, not our own efforts.

## 4. **Unity in the Gospel**

Keep us one in truth and in love—refusing to divide over law, culture, or preference.

## 5. **Living the Crucified Life**

Help us to live from our identity in Christ, dead to the old man, alive in the Spirit.



# Kingdom Decrees

1.

**I walk in gospel freedom**

— I do not yield to bondage again. (Galatians 2:4–5)

2.

**I am justified by faith, not works**

— I rest in Christ's finished work. (Galatians 2:16)

3.

**Christ lives in me**

— I no longer live by my own strength but by faith in Jesus. (Galatians 2:20)

4.

**I refuse to live for man's approval**

— I walk in truth, not fear. (Galatians 2:12–14)

5.

**I uphold the gospel of grace**

— I will not nullify the grace of God in my life. (Galatians 2:21)

6.

**I bring unity, not division**

— My life reflects the oneness of the gospel across every line of difference.  
(Galatians 2:6–9)

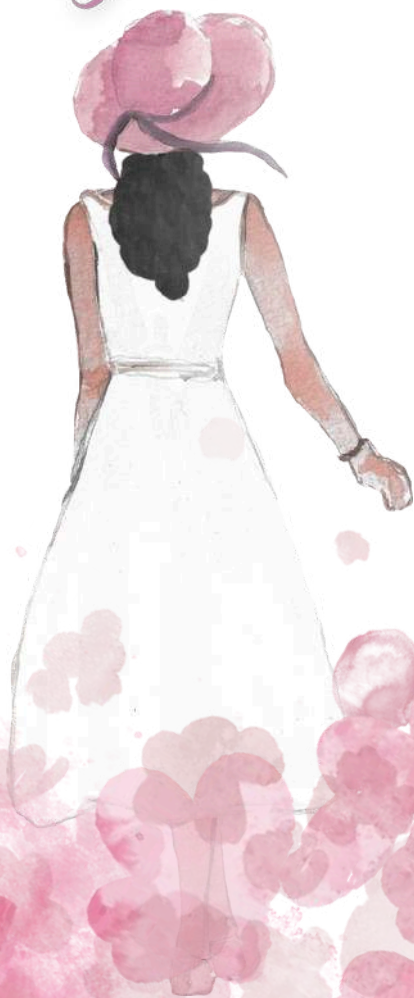
7.

# *Galatians 3*



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# Kingdom Insights

## Galatians 3

### 1. Faith, Not Works

Paul rebukes the Galatians for beginning in the Spirit but trying to finish in the flesh. Highlighting that righteousness comes by faith, not by law. (Galatians 3:1–3)

### 2. The Spirit Comes by Faith

Miracles and the gift of the Spirit are received through belief—not by keeping the law. (Galatians 3:5)

### 3. Abraham's Example

Abraham was justified by faith before the law even existed. Those who believe are his spiritual children. (Galatians 3:6–9)

### 4. The Curse of the Law

The law brings a curse because no one can keep it perfectly. Christ redeemed us from that curse by becoming the curse for us. (Galatians 3:10–13)

### 5. Blessing Through Christ

The blessing promised to Abraham is now available to the Gentiles through Jesus Christ. (Galatians 3:14)

### 6. Promise Over Law

The covenant God made with Abraham is based on promise, not law. The law, which came later, does not cancel the promise. (Galatians 3:17–18)

### 7. The Purpose of the Law

The law revealed sin and prepared us for Christ. It acted as a guardian until faith came. (Galatians 3:19–25)

### 8. One in Christ

Through faith in Christ, we are all sons of God. There is no Jew or Gentile, slave or free, male or female—we are one in Christ Jesus. (Galatians 3:26–28)

### 9. Heirs of the Promise

If we belong to Christ, we are Abraham's seed and heirs of the promise. (Galatians 3:29)



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# What destroys the Church

1.

## **Trying to Earn Salvation**

Depending on works instead of faith undermines the gospel and brings spiritual frustration.

2.

## **Forgetting Our Spiritual Identity**

Living as slaves when we are sons limits our authority and inheritance in Christ.

3.

## **Division in the Body**

Exalting cultural, social, or gender distinctions over our unity in Christ divides what God has made one.

4.

## **Rejecting the Spirit**

Relying on human effort rather than the Holy Spirit stifles supernatural life and power.





# Kingdom Petitions

## 1. **Faith to Believe**

Holy Spirit, restore a deep and simple faith in Your finished work—not in my own ability.

## 2. **Awaken Inheritance**

Help me live with the confidence of an heir, not the fear of a slave.

## 3. **Spiritual Unity**

Break every wall of division. May I honor and embrace all believers as one body in Christ.

## 4. **Embrace of Grace**

Father, help me release every legalistic mindset and take hold of the blessing through faith.

## 5. **Spirit-led Living**

Let my life be powered by Your Spirit, not by rules. I choose to walk in daily communion with You.

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# Kingdom Decrees

1.

**I live by faith, not by law**

— I began my journey with Christ in the Spirit and will finish in the Spirit.  
(Galatians 3:3)

2.

**I receive the Spirit by faith**

— I walk in supernatural power through belief, not performance.  
(Galatians 3:5)

3.

**I am a child of Abraham**

— I inherit the promise through faith. (Galatians 3:7, 29)

4.

**I am redeemed from the curse**

— Jesus took my place on the cross. (Galatians 3:13)

5.

**I receive the blessing of Abraham**

— The fullness of God's promise is mine in Christ. (Galatians 3:14)

6.

**I am covered by grace, not condemned by law**

— God's promise cannot be nullified. (Galatians 3:17–18)

7.

**I am a child of God through faith**

— I belong to Him and walk in His love. (Galatians 3:26)

8.

**I am one with the body of Christ**

— Every dividing line is broken in Jesus. (Galatians 3:28)

9.

**I walk as an heir of God's promise**

— My identity and destiny are secure in Christ. (Galatians 3:29)

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
