## Big Changes to Texas Vehicle Inspections: What It Means for Galveston County

### What Are the New Rules?

For most drivers in Galveston County, annual safety inspections will no longer be required. Instead, when you register your vehicle, the state will automatically add the \$7.50 replacement fee to your registration cost. This means you won't need to make that yearly trip to the inspection station unless your vehicle falls into specific categories. There are exceptions.

Commercial vehicles, vehicles with emissions requirements (which are less common in Galveston County but still apply in some areas), and certain trailers will still need inspections. If you're not sure about your vehicle's status, check with the Texas Department of Motor Vehicles or your local county tax office to avoid any surprises.

### **How Does This Affect Costs?**

For most folks, the out-of-pocket cost will stay about the same. The \$7.50 fee replaces the typical cost of an inspection, which usually ranged from \$7 to \$25 depending on the vehicle and location. The big difference is convenience—you won't have to schedule an inspection or take time out of your day to get it done. However, if you're in a county with emissions testing requirements, such as Harris County, and you regularly drive or work in those areas, you'll still need to get your emissions test done before registering your vehicle. This will mean an extra cost on top of the replacement fee.

### Impact on Local Inspection Shops

For many small businesses in Galveston County, this change could hit hard. Inspection stations have long relied on annual safety checks as a steady source of income. Without that, shops may see fewer customers coming through their doors. Some businesses might shift focus to emissions testing, oil changes, or other services to make up for the lost

### What It Means for Galveston County

Starting January 1, 2025, the way Texas handles vehicle inspections is changing, and folks in Galveston County need to be ready. The state is doing away with the annual safety inspection requirement for most personal vehicles. Instead, when you renew your registration, you'll pay a \$7.50 "inspection program replacement fee."

While this simplifies things for drivers, it's set to bring big changes to local businesses that have long relied on inspection services.

revenue. This change doesn't just affect the shop owners—it affects their employees, too. Many inspection station workers may find themselves needing to adapt or look for work elsewhere. Supporting these local businesses with other vehicle needs, like routine maintenance or repairs, can help them stay afloat during the transition.

### How to Follow the New Laws

Here's how to stay on top of the new rules in Galveston County:

**Know What's Required:** Most personal vehicles will only need the \$7.50 fee added during registration, but check to see if your vehicle falls under the exceptions.

Maintain Your Vehicle: Just because inspections aren't required doesn't mean you should skip safety checks. Make sure your brakes, lights, tires, and wipers are in good working condition to keep yourself and others safe on the road.

**Plan for Emissions Testing:** If you travel into areas like Houston that require emissions tests, make sure you're compliant to avoid fines.

**Support Local Shops:** Many inspection stations also offer oil changes, tire services, and other maintenance. Using their services helps keep local businesses running.

These changes might save you some time, but they come with new responsibilities.

By staying informed and proactive, you can navigate the new system while keeping your vehicle safe and roadworthy.

Don't let that be you—pay attention to your surroundings and any red flags.


### Where to Sell Your Stuff

# JEEP WEEKEND: Should Sheriff Fullen Pull the Emergency Brake?

Galveston County folks, we've got ourselves a heated debate. Sheriff Jimmy Fullen says Jeep Weekend on Bolivar Peninsula is causing too much trouble, and he wants it gone.

Some folks are all for it; others say it's a bad call. Let's break it down, plain and simple.









### Point: Sheriff Fullen Is Right – Jeep Weekend Is a Mess

Sheriff Fullen says Jeep Weekend is no longer a fun beach gathering—it's chaos.

"It's too violent," he said in a recent interview. "You've got officers getting hurt, civilians being hurt, and people getting sexually assaulted. It's just not good for the community."He's not wrong about the trouble.

Last year, 18 major accidents happened during the event, alongside dozens of arrests and hundreds of 911 calls. (Source: ABC13) That's a lot for our small community to handle. First responders have been stretched to the limit.


