One Friday afternoon recently, Mary, with Hillman's Seafood, posted a notice on Facebook explaining that they were unable to purchase catches from local shrimpers because freezers across the Gulf Coast were completely full. If their catches were not sold through the market, the shrimpers would be forced to stop shrimping. This is the peak of shrimping season when boats work for the majority of their income.

In an attempt to help them out, the Hillman girls (Sybil, Jo and Mary) decided to sell their catches at rock bottom prices. Well, within 10 minutes the phones began ringing off the hook like a seafood hotline.

The line at Hillmans started 20 minutes later. Several customers thought it was a hoax. Friends and family began sharing the post. When Sybil drove up to the business on Saturday morning, the parking lot was full and cars were parked down Hillman Drive. There was a line of people as long as a shrimp net standing outside with many sitting on their ice chests. Sybil realized she needed to get to work and help Mary Jo. The line continued throughout the day. Most of the customers waited for an hour or more. As soon as a boat unloaded, the shrimp were placed on the table and gone within a few minutes.

The girls husbands and children came to help. Martin, David, Eddie and Holden unload the boats. Neighbors also came in and helped answer the phones.

Jo even had to call their retired sister, Delores, to come in and assist. Ten year old, Kaleigh, and her four year old brother, Caleb, set up a water station for those waiting in the heat. A neighbor, Brandy, helped by stocking shelves.

Many people in line became friends while they waited. Some were from our local areas, but others came from as far away as, Crockett, Kingsland, Midland, Cleveland, Fort Worth and

places in-between. Mary began telling stories to entertain those in line. The patrons were very courteous and patient throughout the frenzy.

When the doors opened on Sunday, the line was back. This continued for 14 days and the phone is still ringing.

Needless to say, everyone was bone-tired and apologies were given to any customer that did not feel appreciated.

The love and support of the community was heartwarming. The girls were so overwhelmed, they had tears in their eyes much of the time.

It was so refreshing that there are so many Texans helping their neighbors. These Texans reached out to help fisherman that they had never met.

The fisherman were also overwhelmed and thankful for all of the people that supported them. They were in a frenzy to catch shrimp for all who were waiting.

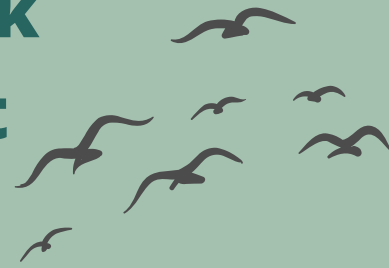

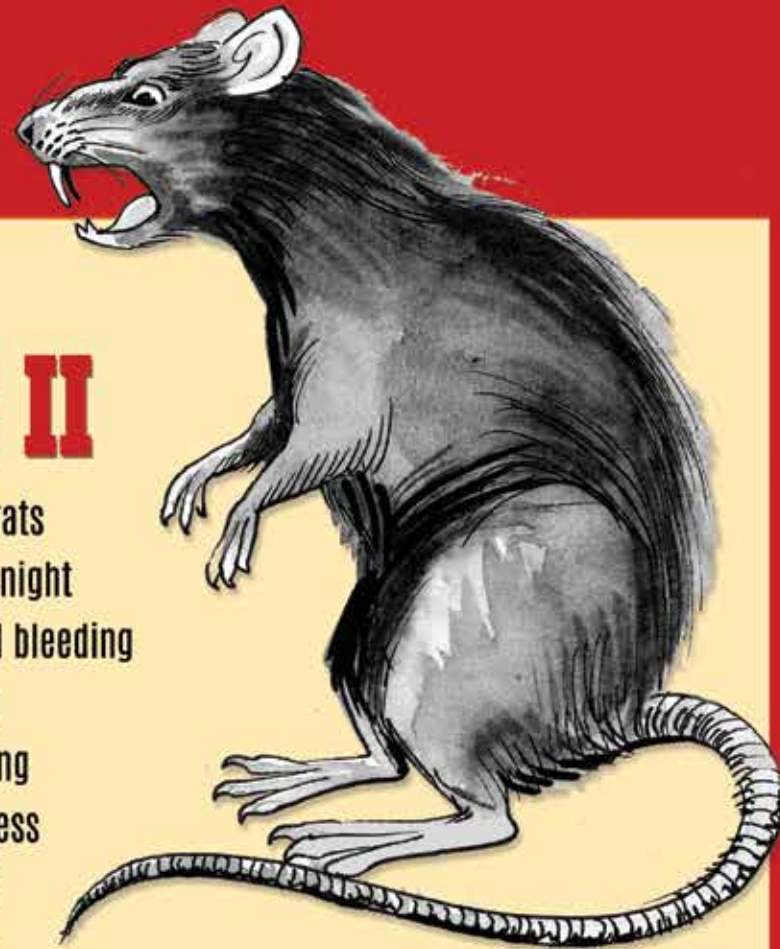

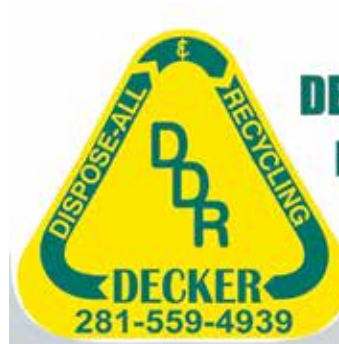

Property Address Reminder

Part of San Leon's rate order requires that all residential and commercial buildings in the district have the property address posted on the building. The letters and numbers used to mark addresses should be at least three inches high and should be placed on the building so they are visible from the street. This is to the residents' benefit as well since any EMS responders will be better able to locate your property with the address visible.

Galveston County Mosquito Control

Galveston County has a fleet of vehicles that are deployed throughout the county to spray for mosquitos. If you have any questions regarding spraying schedule or want to request spraying in your area, you can call them at 800.842.5622 or visit their website to see maps of the locations they've recently sprayed as well as where they intend to spray next.

Brush Bundling & Debris Removal

With hurricane season here, be sure to clean up your property, removing any debris that may block drainage or become projectiles in the event of high winds. While Galveston County is not responsible for picking up brush or debris, Texas Pride will pick up brush that's placed in clear, individual piles measuring no larger than 3' x 3' x 3' or tied and bundled and under 50 pounds.

I will start by reminding everyone that most fishing license expired on the last day of August, so be sure to check yours.

Fishing around San Leon has picked up since we have had a little cooler weather and a nice rain.

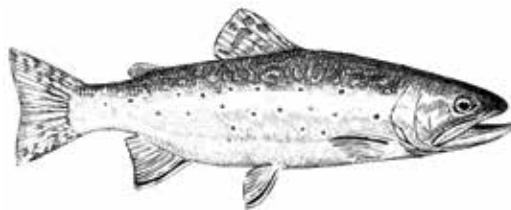
Some reports of catching spec's, you just have to find them and make sure they are legal. Reds and sheephead are plentiful around the rocks beside the ship channel or jetties. Try live shrimp under a popping cork about 4 foot down, you'll be surprised what you will catch!

I like fishing the North Jetty in the winter if the tide is not too low. Lots of flounder are caught there each year. There's a bait camp at the base of the jetty with bait and snacks. There is also a Porta Can in the area.

Fentanyl: One Pill Kills

What is Fentanyl?

Fentanyl is a powerful synthetic opioid that is up to 50 times stronger than heroin and 100 times stronger than morphine. Just 2 milligrams of fentanyl, equal to 10 to 15 grains of table salt, is considered a lethal dose.

Illegally manufactured fentanyl is found in heroin, cocaine, methamphetamine and in counterfeit pills. As a result, many people may not know they're ingesting fentanyl, leading to an accidental poisoning.

Criminal drug networks are mass-producing fake pills, falsely marketing them as legitimate prescription pills, and killing unsuspecting Texans, according to the Drug Enforcement Administration. Some counterfeit pills are made to look like prescription opioids like oxycodone (Oxycontin, Percocet), hydrocodone (Vicodin) and alprazolam (Xanax), or stimulants like amphetamines (Adderall).

Fake prescription pills that are widely accessible can contain deadly doses of fentanyl. They are often sold on social media and e-commerce platforms — making them available to anyone

with a smartphone, including teens and young adults. Texans should only take legitimate pharmaceutical medications prescribed by medical professionals and dispensed by pharmacists in the U.S.

Signs of an Overdose:

- Small, constricted "pinpoint pupils"
- Face is extremely pale and/or feels cold or clammy to the touch
- Body goes limp
- Fingernails or lips have a purple or blue color
- Vomiting or making gurgling noises
- Cannot be awakened or unable to speak
- Breathing or heartbeat slows or stops

HURRICANE SEASON ANIMAL PREPARATION

Your pets are an important member of your family, so they need to be included in your family's emergency plan. To prepare for the unexpected follow these tips with your pets in mind:

Make a Plan

If you have a plan in place for you and your pets, you will likely encounter less difficulty, stress and worry when you need to make a decision during an emergency. If local officials ask you to evacuate, that means your pet should evacuate too. If you leave your pets behind, they may end up lost, injured or worse.

Things to include in your plan:

Have an evacuation plan for your pet. Many public shelters and hotels do not allow pets. Know a safe place where you can take your pets before disasters and emergencies happen.

Develop a buddy system: Plan with neighbors, friends or relatives to make sure that someone is available to care for or evacuate your pets if you are unable.

Have your pet micro chipped. Make sure to keep your address and phone number up-to-date on their chip and include contact information for an emergency contact outside of your immediate area.

Contact your local emergency management office, animal shelter or animal control office to get additional advice and information if you're unsure how to care for your pet in case of an emergency.

Build a Kit for Your Pet

Just as you do with your family's emergency supply kit, think first about the basics for survival, such as food and water. Have two kits, one larger kit if you are sheltering in place and one lightweight version for if you need to evacuate. Review your kits regularly to ensure that their contents especially medicines.



Animal Emergency Kit:

Food: Keep several days' supply of food in an airtight, waterproof container.

Water: Store a water bowl and several days' supply of water.

Medicine: Keep an extra supply of the medicine your pet takes on a regular basis in a waterproof container.

First aid kit: Talk to your veterinarian about most appropriate items for your pet's emergency medical needs.

Collar with ID tag and a harness or leash: Include a backup leash, collar and ID tag. Have copies of your pet's registration information and other relevant documents in a waterproof container and available electronically.

Traveling: bag, crate or sturdy carrier, ideally one for each pet.

Grooming items: Pet shampoo, conditioner and other items, in case your pet needs cleaning up.

Sanitation needs: Pet litter and litter box if needed, newspapers, paper towels, plastic trash bags and

household chlorine bleach to provide for your pet's sanitation needs.

A picture of you and your pet together: If you become separated, a photo of you and your pet together will help to document ownership and allow others to help find your pet.

Familiar items: Put favorite toys, treats or bedding in your kit. Familiar items can help reduce stress for your pet.

Tips for Large Animals

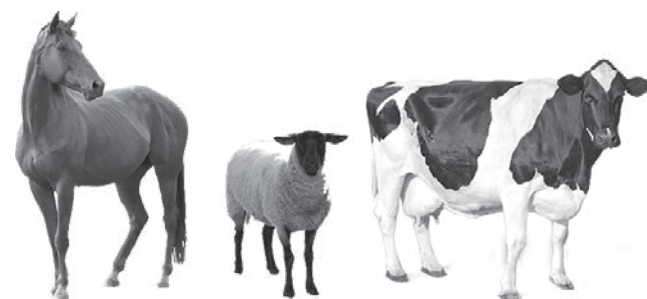
If you have pets such as horses, goats or pigs on your property, be sure to prepare before a disaster.

Ensure all animals have some form of identification. Evacuate animals earlier, whenever possible. Map out primary and secondary routes in advance.

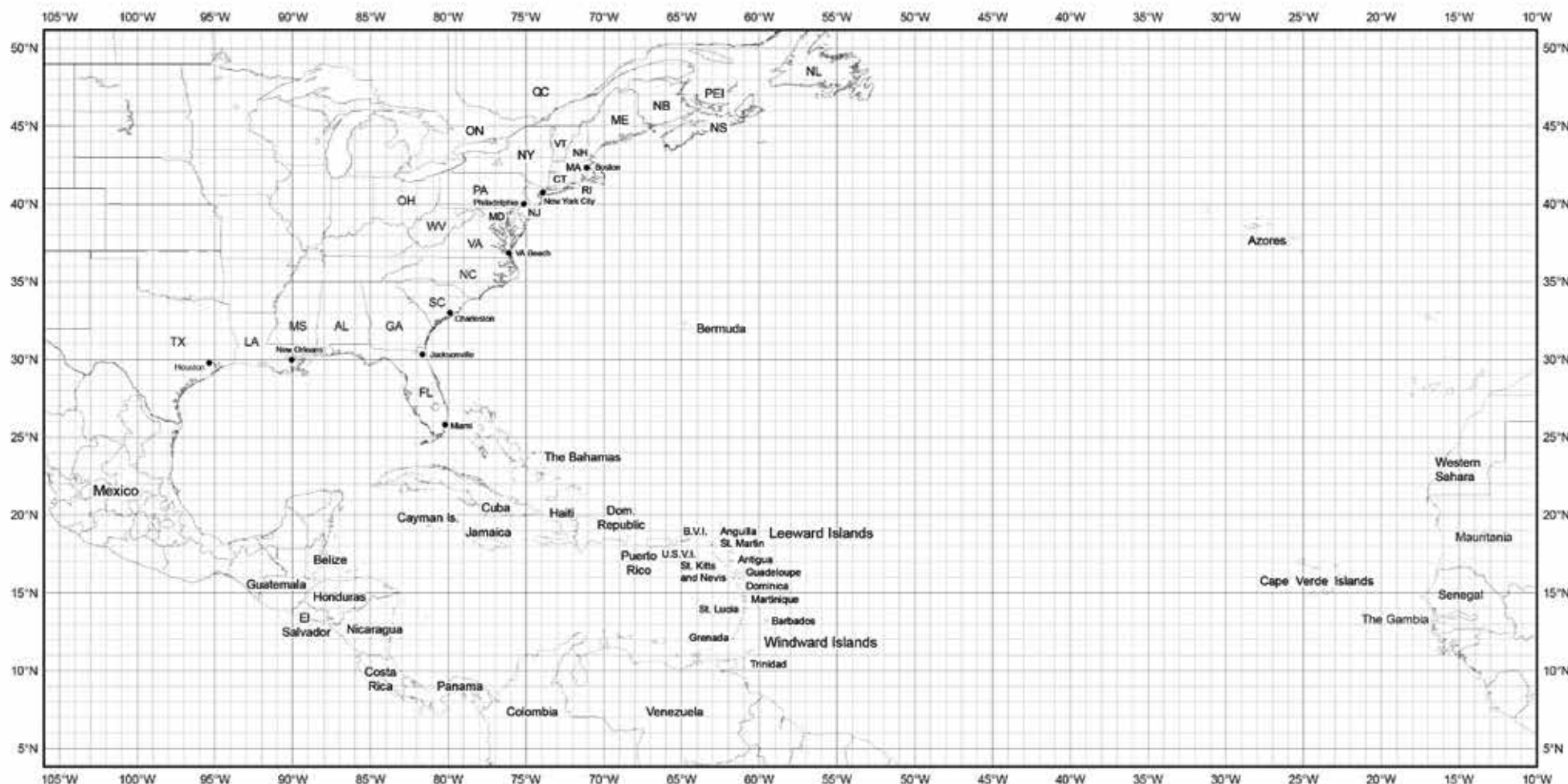
Make available vehicles and trailers needed for transporting and supporting each type of animal. Also make available experienced handlers and drivers.

Ensure destinations have food, water, veterinary care and handling equipment.

If evacuation is not possible, animal owners must decide whether to move large animals to a barn or turn them loose outside.

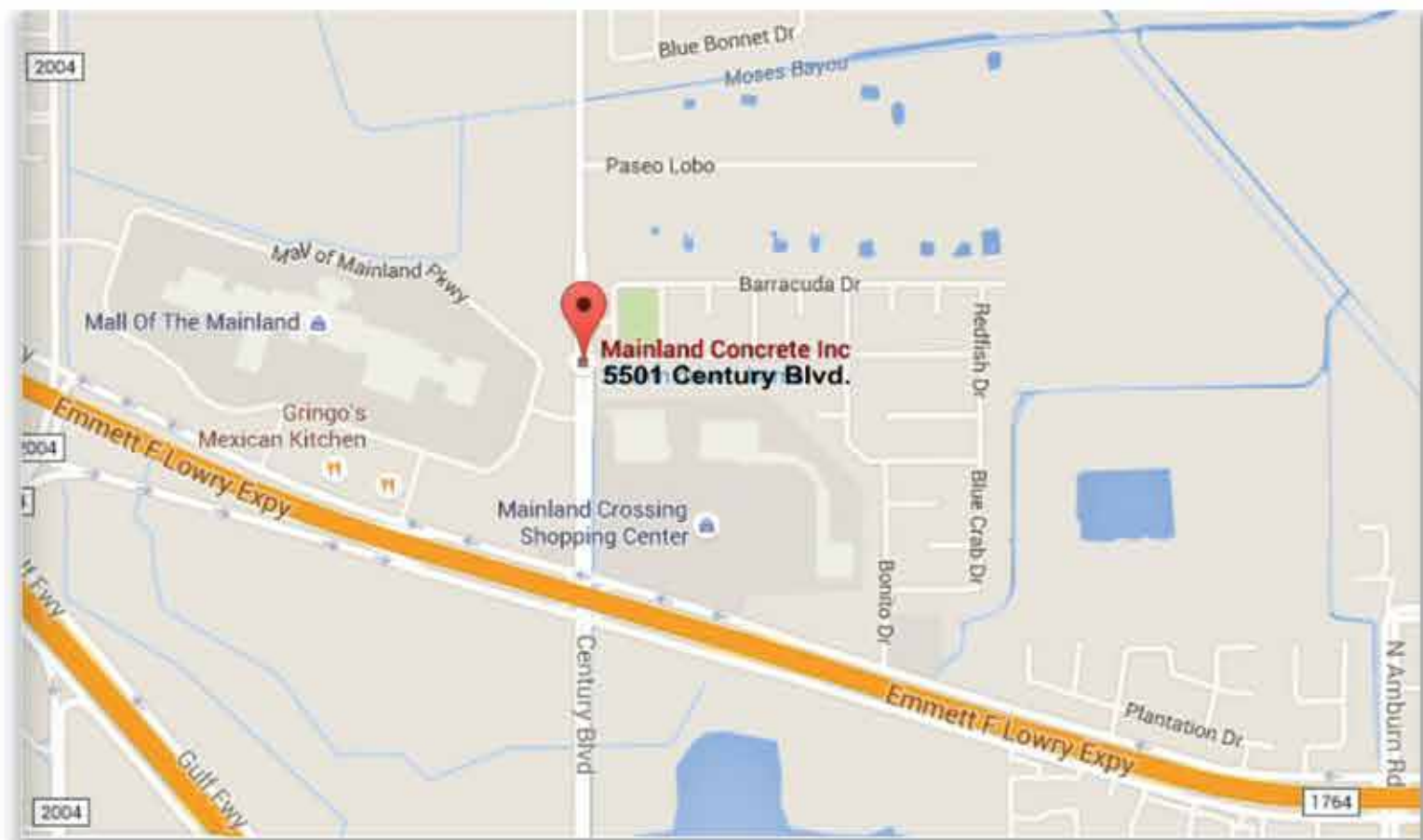
