
SUPPORT OLD GLORY






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San Leon Don's FISHING TIPS




Winter seems to be here and fishing should still be good, just be sure you pick the right tide as this is very important. Some things to note:

- Remember that the flounder season is CLOSED until December 15th.
- This is a good time to to fish the South Jetty.
- It's best to wait until the day after a cold front and you have a high tide.
- Best to wear warm clothes and take a chair.
- There's a bait camp on the location with bait when available, also snacks
- Several guides I spoke to said lots of fish are being caught around San Leon
- When fishing it's very important to find structure, like a pier or oyster reef and use a trolling motor to approach either one.

Be safe and courteous on the water, and remember to Take a Kid Fishing!
