Winter seems to be here and fishing should still be good, just be sure you pick the right tide as this is very important. Some things to note:

- Remember that the flounder season is CLOSED until December 15th.
- This is a good time to fish the South Jetty.
- It's best to wait until the day after a cold front and you have a high tide.
- Best to wear warm clothes and take a chair.
- There's a bait camp on the location with bait when available, also snacks and tackle.
- Several guides I spoke to said lots of fish are being caught around San Leon
- When fishing it's very important to find structure, like a pier or oyster reef and use a trolling motor to approach either one.

Be safe and courteous on the water,
and remember to Take a Kid Fishing!
