IN THE TEXAS LEGISLATURE

A bill that would limit which college sports teams transgender athletes can join was passed by the Texas Senate on March 29. Senate Bill 15, filed by Sen. Mayes Middleton, R-Galveston, requires college students to compete on sports teams based on their sex assigned at birth, regardless of their gender identity. If the bill becomes law, transgender women would not be able to join women's sports teams, and transgender men would not be able to join men's sports teams. State senators approved SB 15 with a 19-12 vote. The bill now heads to the Texas House, where Republican lawmakers have expressed their support for similar legislation. Middleton's bill has been deemed the "Save Women's Sports Act." In the Senate chamber, Middleton said the bill would increase fairness in college sports. "If Congress won't stand for fairness, if our Department of Education won't stand for fairness, if the NCAA won't stand for fairness in women's sports, then the Texas Senate will," he said. The bill "addresses the inherent unfairness of biological males competing against biological females in competitive collegiate level athletics by banning athletes from competing on the team opposite of their biological sex," Middleton wrote in an analysis of his legislation. Also happening in Austin, Senate approves \$15 billion in property tax cuts. Texans would see the largest property tax cut in history under a set of bills approved unanimously by the Senate Wednesday. SB 3, by Houston Senator Paul Bettencourt, would raise the homestead exemption, letting homeowners write off \$75,000 of property value before assessments, which he says will take \$800 off the average property tax bill in Texas. "This is off-the-chart, incredible property tax relief for millions of Texas homeowners," said Bettencourt. For homeowners aged 65 or older, he added, savings could top \$1000 as the bill triples the special exemption the state provides for senior citizens, allowing them to exempt a total of \$100,000 of their home's value. Should it pass the legislature, it must still be approved by voters in November, but Bettencourt said he expects the proposal to pass with more than 90 percent of voter approval. The bill is retroactive to this year, so if voters approve it, homeowners could expect to see these savings on their next property tax bill.

VANDALS AT SAN LEON CEMETERY





Try wading the shoreline. Top water lures work well, just be patient and keep casting. If Black Drum are on your list, you might give the Texas City dike a try, mostly close to the end. Who knows, you might even catch a flounder. I find the best bait for drum is live crab cut in half. Be sure to use a heavy rod and reel as drum put up a real good fight.

Wind is the main factor when planning a fishing trip. When the wind blows it muddies the water. Keep all of your fishing gear in good condition and take a kid fishing with you next time you go.

Infrastructure Improvements

At last month's District meeting, the board members unanimously voted to petition the state regulatory agency to reallocate the budget surplus that was on hand as a result of last year's wastewater plant expansion coming in under budget. These funds will be used to perform much-needed repairs on the water line coming from Gulf Coast Water Authority (where the District and much of the county purchase pre-treated water) as well as begin the process of upgrading nearly 90% of the 2" water mains where the District has identified a critical need to upgrade to 6" water mains, permitting additional development as well as enabling hydrants to be installed in the future! Be sure to contact District Manager Andrew Miller with any questions you may have about this or other scheduled improvements to the water and wastewater infrastructure.

Upcoming Chlorine Maintenance

As part of routine system maintenance, Gulf Coast Water Authority will temporarily change its water disinfection process April 10th through the 24th. This annual practice allows GCWA and San Leon the opportunity to flush our water systems to prevent taste and odor problems that can occur during summer months. You may notice some water discoloration, cloudiness, or chlorine smell during the disinfection period; these conditions are harmless and temporary. Home dialysis patients should contact their machine manufacturers for instructions on properly treating their water before use.
