HURRICANE HANNA GOES SOUTH

If you are reading The Seabreeze, most of you live on the Gulf Coast (with the exception of the Rubber Knife Gang in Sikeston, Missouri). This time of year, we all sit on pins and needles every time a storm enters the Gulf of Mexico. Not only do we worry about the hurricanes destroying a whole community like we had seen in Ike, but we also have to watch out for coastal flooding.

Hurricane Hanna started as a Tropical Storm on July 24th and became the season’s first hurricane early on July 25th. The eye of the hurricane passed over Port Mansfield, Texas later that day as a high-end Category 1 hurricane. Port Mansfield is 360 miles away from San Leon, but the Galveston Bay area began seeing tidal surges two days before landfall. At the North Jetty on the Bolivar Peninsula, the tide almost covered the jetty and the boat ramp was completely underwater. In San Leon, the tidal surge could also be seen at boat ramps, ditches, and submerged piers. The right side of a hurricane is always considered the dirty side of the storm. The dirty side of the storm contains rain and thunderstorms known as outer bands. The outer bands can range from a few miles to tens of miles wide and 50 to 300 miles long.

There’s nothing like coastal living, but we must be vigilant during hurricane season. A storm hundreds of miles away can still affect us.

ATTEMPTED ATTACK ON SAN LEON MONUMENT

An attack on the monument to the San Leon Black Ninja dog was narrowly averted by some quick-thinking members of the American Legion last month. On July 22nd, the good folks at our American Legion were serving their dinners benefitting the Sons of the American Legion as they do every Wednesday night. At approximately 7:30 p.m. one of the members, we’ll call him Jody Ward, stepped outside to get some fresh air. As he stood on the balcony looking at the American flag that flies out front and thinking about what a mess our country is in right now, he heard a commotion downstairs. Mr. Ward cautiously went down the stairs and was astonished to see a large number of agitators surrounding the Black Ninja Dog statue. The mob had tied ropes and straps around the tail and neck and were heard to be shouting, “Bring it down! Bring it down!” Mr. Ward then went to alert the Commander of the Legion. The Commander rallied the men and urged those with a License to Carry to go to their trucks and get ready to defend the Black Ninja Dog. As the bad luck would have it, the men had recently had an outing to the firing range and upon retrieving their firearms, discovered they had no ammo. As there has been a shortage of ammo in stores lately, they called upon Carla, a/k/a High Sheriff for back up.

High Sheriff Carla was well supplied with ammo, but was working at the Sunset Lounge selling beer TO GO. Goose and Nanner, being the patriots that they are, told High Sheriff Carla to take off and resupply the men. By the time High Sheriff Carla arrived with provisions, the men of the American Legion had been able to disperse the mob by waving work boots and job applications at them. This seemed to really scare them and they took off never looking back.

The statue commemorates the death of the notorious Black Ninja Dog that plagued our community for many years by darting out in front of vehicles, usually very late at night, and causing the vehicle to end up in a ditch. Fortunately, no fatalities and very few serious injuries were associated with the Ninja Dog’s nefarious activities.

It’s a shame that other statues and monuments don’t have a community like San Leon that will protect the importance of a tribute to something, even if they don’t agree with it. Vandalism and destruction of property is never the answer.

The weather has been so undecided it's hard to plan a fishing trip but if you can stand the heat and dodge the rain, there are fish to be caught.

Vibrio vulnificus is in the warm water and usually around marinas - stagnate water. If you have any cuts or scratches, stay out of the water as vibrio is very dangerous and moves fast as it is a flesh eating bacteria.

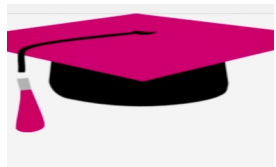

San Leon MUD Update



Update on 2" Water Mains

Nearly half of the 50 miles of infrastructure in our water distribution system is 2" lines. These lines are restricted on the number of taps we can have based on State statutes, which sometimes puts us between a rock and a hard place when residents want to develop in an area that's already at capacity. However, we're in the process of applying existing funds from our 2017 bonds towards improving those lines, so we'll soon be able to address some of the areas where we've been receiving multiple requests for service!

Property Address Reminder

Part of San Leon's rate order requires that all residential and commercial buildings in the district have the property address posted on the building. The letters and numbers used to mark addresses should be at least three inches high and should be placed on the building so they are visible from the street. This is to the residents' benefit as well since any EMS responders will be better able to locate your property in a timely fashion.

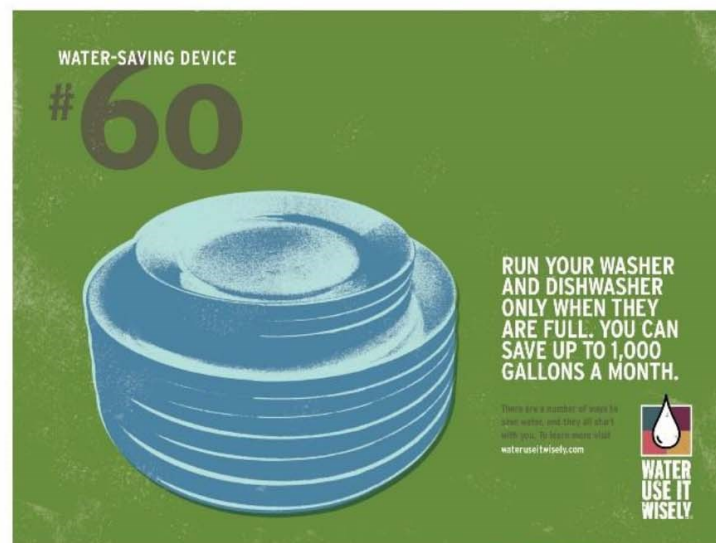

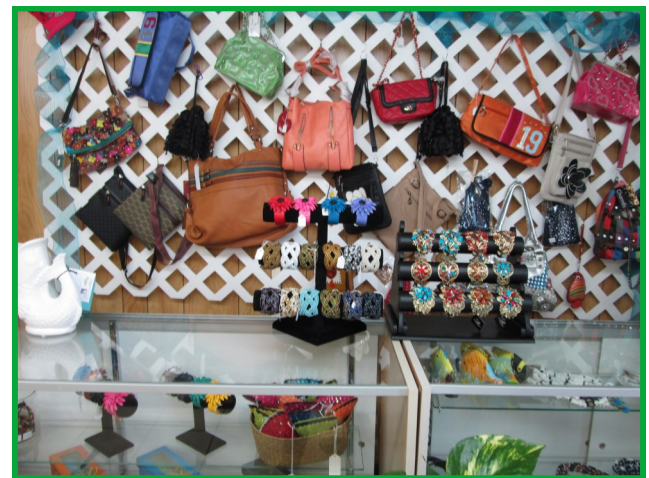

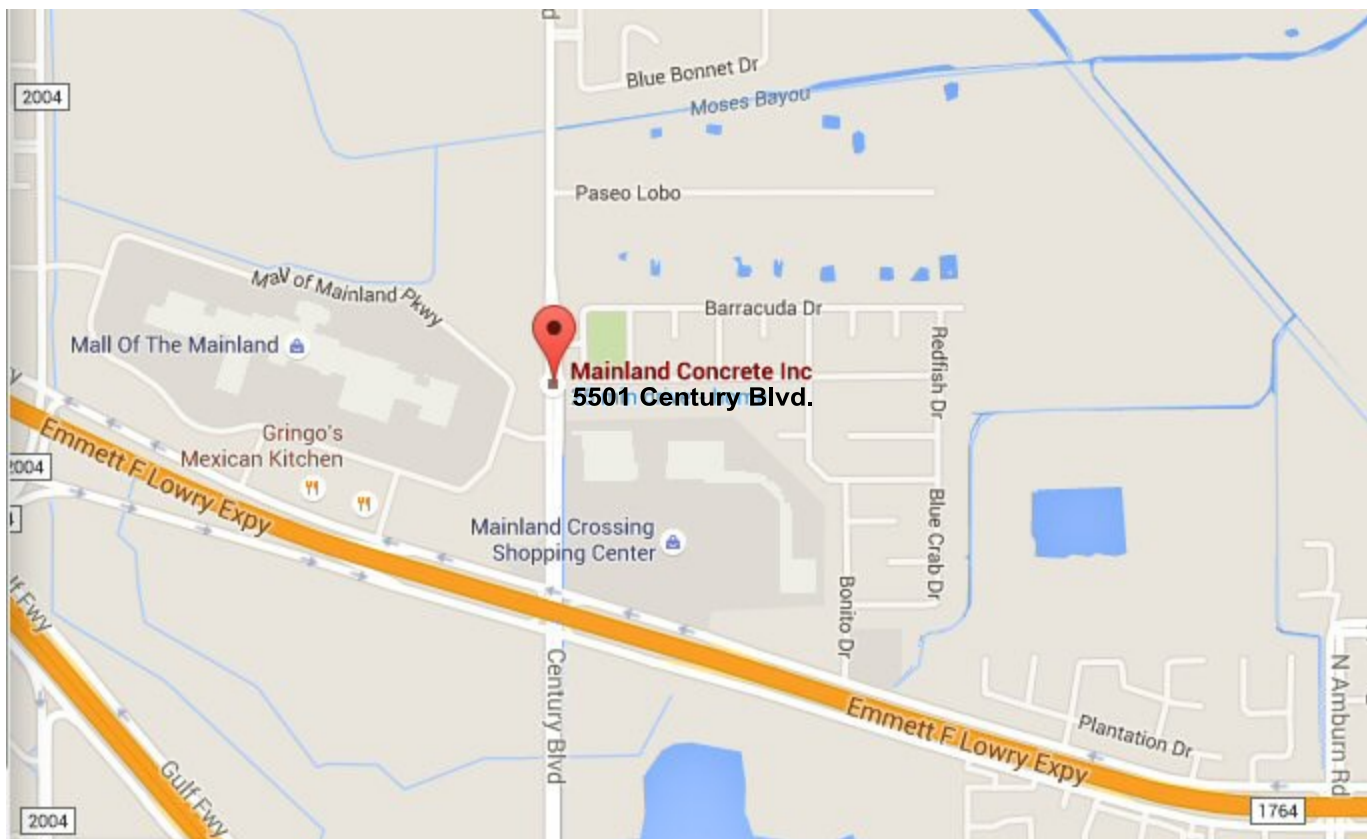

UPDATE FROM SAN LEON MUD

In early June, it came to our attention that a complaint was filed against the San Leon MUD with the Galveston County Sheriff's office. As the investigation has recently concluded, we wanted to inform the community of the allegations and the facts surrounding them.

On May 26th, Phillip Haskett and David Jetelina filed a complaint alleging the District was complicit with manipulating a government record and using public funds for personal advertisement. We fully cooperated with the GCSO, providing all relevant documents to them and meeting with the Criminal Investigation Division detective several times throughout the course of the investigation.

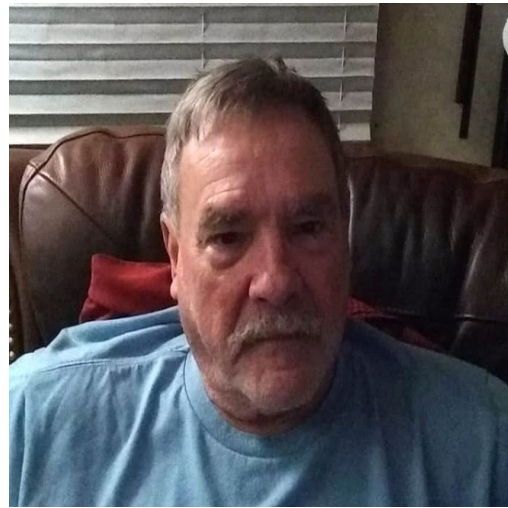
After extensive investigation, the CID detective met with the Assistant District Attorney to review the details of the case on July 16th. The ADA advised there was no evidence of a criminal offense or any evidence to suggest a criminal offense was committed. The ADA then advised that, as there were no charges to file, the case should be closed.

In the interest of transparency, we wanted to provide the public with some additional disclosure and discussion of the facts surrounding the allegations.

Public meetings are required to have their agenda posted in the public at least 72 hours in advance. The District initially posted the agenda for our May 20th regular meeting on May 13th. We amended the agenda to include "Discuss Pending or Threatened Litigation" under Executive Session and reposted it on May 15th at our regular locations in the community as well as with Galveston County. The county confirmed the amendment via email and maintained the original certification date in their files, a common practice per the Galveston County Deputy Clerk.

The second charge pertained to a Letter to the Editor authored by Joe Manchaca as well as one of the Community Updates the District publishes monthly. Both publications addressed factually some concerns that had been brought up by the community. While the District did pay for the Community Update, no political sway was leveraged, and by the very nature of Letters to the Editor no funds were expended in the publication of the letter.

The District remains committed to open and fair governance. We have compiled the public documents from this investigation into one document for the benefit of the community; it can be viewed on our website, <https://slmud.org/>, under "Agenda, Documents & Info". Any concerns or questions can be brought to the District Manager or voiced during the Public Comments portion of our monthly meeting.

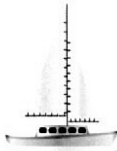

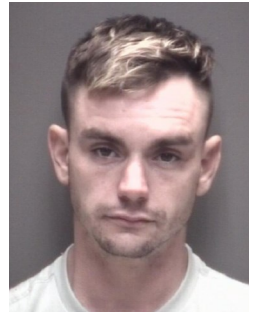

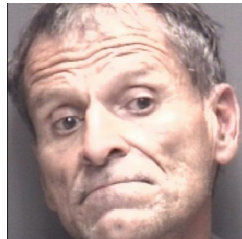

On Saturday, June 27, 2020 we headed out of Kemah, TX and thought how cool it would be to trailer our little CraigCat starting in Galveston, hugging the Gulf coast, stopping at every back road bait camp and boat ramp we could find, with no true itinerary other than to meet local people and businesses and ask one question . . . “Where?s the Fish.” We boarded the Galveston/Bolivar Ferry, depending on which side you board, with the North Jetty being our first stop. What a cool place to drop your boat in the water, fish, or just walk down the Jetty itself. We saw many people pulling wagons and coolers towards the end hoping for that one dream catch.

We left the North Jetty and headed for Sabine Pass. Now remember, we had no itinerary and no clue what we would find along the way. We googled Sabine Pass and followed the arrows. This drew us to a Public Boat ramp that was full of activity with people loading and unloading their boats. Instantly we started inquiring , “Where?s the Fish?” We decided to unload the Cat and find some cool fishing spots. This ramp was two miles from the Gulf Coast and we were told of stops along the way to wet a line. Unfortunately, the Cat had other alternatives. After paddling for an hour we were towed in.

We decided to attempt to continue our journey in the hopes that the Cat only had a minor fuel problem, setting our sights on Hackberry, LA. Lucky for us, we made the right choice, because we got to interview a legend guide, Capt. Cajun Phil Broussard. While in Hackberry we decided to give the Cat one more chance and launched her in a small waterway, but as luck would have it, she simply wasn’t up for the task.



Unfortunately, our beloved Cat needed a rebuild and we had to leave her in Iowa, LA. The show had to be postponed for two long weeks. We put the Cat in the hands of Power Implements and anxiously awaited for her to be restored. Power Implements did a fantastic job and we

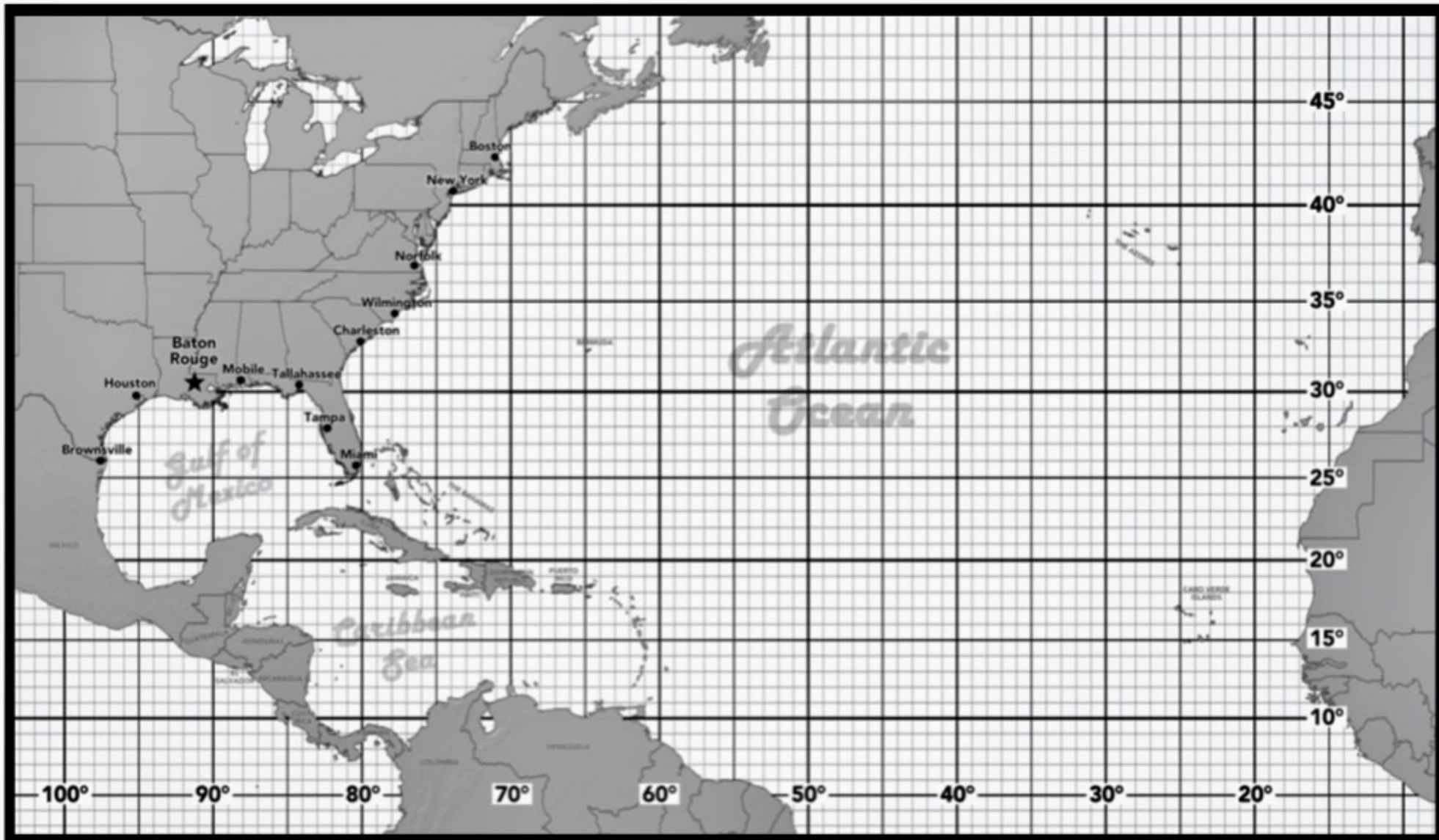

In other words, we find a spot that has calm waters.

Off we go again and now we are headed to Cameron, LA, but along the way decided to make a stop in Grand Chenier to try our luck on the Mermentau River. This is quite a unique river to fish simply because one side is freshwater, while the other end is saltwater. This means you could actually stay in the middle of the river and catch both salt and fresh water fish. Remember, no itinerary and no clue where to stop and fish so we had to be sure there was a Hotel/Motel, or some place we could stay the night. Being that we were traveling such remote areas, several places we stopped to fish either had limited choices, or did not have a place where we could stay. Luckily, we found a cool little place to eat that evening called Anchors Up Grill, in Cameron, LA. We interviewed the family who own the business. They told us of a place we could stay.



The next morning we continued our journey down remote back roads and discovered so many really cool places, off the map, with boat ramps, or landings as the locals called them, to fish and meet local people, and the businesses they run. All we met had a deep passion for not only fishing, but their community, their way of life, as well as the businesses they run or own. Over the course of this journey we also made stops in Morgan City, fishing at Morgan City’s Bayou Beouf Locks, Grand Isle LA, Shell Beach, LA, Fort Pike/Rigolets Marina, which is just North/Northwest of New Orleans, Baton Rouge, and Breau Bridge/Henderson, LA. Basically we fished the Gulf of Mexico.

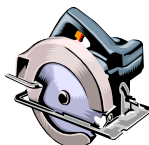

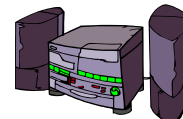
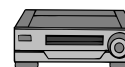
