





Texas Pride Collection

As we head into the holidays, now is as good a time as any to revisit the guidelines for pickup with Texas Pride. While Texas Pride provides recycling and trash bins to each residential property, you can also place additional waste in trash bags or personal containers so long as they are specifically built to be used as trash cans. You may use personal containers for recycling as well, just be sure they are clearly labeled (free labels available at the District's office). Drums or barrels are not allowed and may be disposed of. Two large items are allowed per pickup day; anything beyond that will need to be coordinated as a special pickup directly with Texas Pride. Be sure to have your bins out early as pickup can start as soon as 6 AM!


HOLIDAY TOURS OF THE 1892 BISHOP'S PALACE






