Special Agent Anthony Salas End of Watch



On Friday, Jan. 21, 2022, around 7:30 p.m., Special Agent Salas was conducting tactical operations in Maverick County as part of a DPS Special Operations Group working jointly with the US Border Patrol BORTAC when he was involved in a tragic accident near Eagle Pass. Local EMS personnel transported him to Fort Duncan Regional Medical Center and later he was airlifted to University Hospital in San Antonio. Special Agent Salas passed away just after 11 a.m. on Jan. 22, 2022, with his family by his side.

Special Agent Anthony Salas, 37, joined the department in 2013 and was stationed in El Paso. He served as a Trooper with the Texas Highway Patrol before promoting to a Special Agent in the department's Criminal Investigations Division. Special Agent Salas was a member of the DPS West Texas Special Response Team, and he served in the United States Marine Corps before joining the department.



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

Some people don't realize how many fish are caught every day in Galveston, Trinity, and West Bay. Guides put a lot of pressure on the fish in this area, also catch and release of undersize fish. The survival of these fish is very low as most people don't know or care how to handle those fish so they die. Come on, Parks and Wildlife restock our bays.

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

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

San Leon MUD Update



Questions about the District?

While social media is good for engaging with members of the community, it can become a rather confusing space when looking for answers to technical questions, such as how a municipal utility district operates or what regulations they're held to under State law. In light of some recent questions and misstatements about the District, we wanted to take a moment and provide some facts about the District, as well as reiterate what's well known about the information heard through the grapevine: it may not always be the most reliable, so get your information straight from the source!

What is a MUD?

Municipal utility districts (or MUDs) are local governmental entities established by the State of Texas to provide public services to communities that are outside city limits. MUDs have a defined boundary and are typically established through an election process, though some (including San Leon) are established through legislative action. There are various types of districts with different purposes: water control and improvement, wastewater control, groundwater conservation, levee improvement, stormwater control, irrigation, and many more. San Leon was actually established by the legislature with the name "San Leon Municipal Utility District" but with the responsibilities and authority of a WCID (water control and improvement district) which sometimes results in confusion.

How does the MUD pay for things?

While day-to-day operations are handled through the monthly water bills and a portion of the District's property taxes, larger infrastructure projects are financed using municipal bonds. Municipal bonds are long-term funding mechanisms that are paid back over several decades with a very low interest rate that's based on the municipality's credit rating. San Leon is currently rated as a mid-level, long-term investment, strengthened by the District's continued on-time payments of previously issued bond debt. Bonds are authorized via community vote and issued by the District when specific infrastructure improvements are necessary. The bonds are reviewed by several state agencies prior to approval for sale, and all estimates for the projects are thoroughly vetted for accuracy and relevance. The most recent bond sale in 2019 financed the mandatory wastewater plant expansion. Once it's complete, the District will work with our engineer and the state regulatory agency to identify additional infrastructure projects that could be addressed with the remaining funds.

Can Texas City annex San Leon?

While Texas City does have extra-territorial jurisdiction (ETJ) over San Leon, they are no longer able to forcibly annex San Leon. House Bill 347, signed into law by Governor Abbott on May 24th, 2019, prevents forced annexation of unincorporated communities without the consent of the residents and businesses of that community.

How does the MUD handle accounts?

When a new account is set up, there is a security deposit placed on file to begin service. When a customer no longer needs service, that deposit is applied to the final bills for that account. If there's a credit, a check is then issued to the account holder. If there's still a remaining balance, a final bill is sent instead. If this final bill isn't paid, it reaches a point where it is sent to a collections agency for follow-up. At this point, the District works with our annual auditing agency to adjust the District's balance sheet, writing off the balances as uncollectible until the future point when which payment is received, at which point it is brought back into the books and reconciled.

What can be done about increasing taxes?

While Galveston Central Appraisal District (GCAD) is the entity that assesses home values, you can always verify the exemptions you have on file with them as the District offers two exemptions to residents that can reduce the amount of your MUD taxes. Please contact the GCAD office for more details. By refinancing existing bonds and accounting for the increased development in the District, the MUD lowered the 2020 tax rate by \$0.07 to an effective rate of \$0.56 and even lowered the 2021 tax rate by an additional \$0.043 to an effective rate of \$0.5168 per \$100 of taxable value.

Don't forget! The MUD meetings are open to the public & are typically held on the third Tuesday of every month at 6:30 PM. Agendas can be found three days before the meeting at the MUD office or online at www.slmud.org

What was the outcome concerning the embezzled funds from San Leon VFD?

Unfortunately, several years ago an officer of the San Leon VFD took advantage of the chaos after Hurricane Ike and embezzled a large sum of money. Once discovered, he was prosecuted and is currently serving jail time; details of his plea deal are sealed so restitution is uncertain. Strong controls have been implemented by the VFD to prevent this sort of thing from happening again. SL VFD financial data is reviewed monthly by the MUD and certified audits are performed annually after a CPA prepares and reviews their income and expenditures during tax filings.

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
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
