RARE EF3 TORNADO CAUSES MAJOR DAMAGE

Clean up efforts have been underway since a powerful EF3 tornado ripped through the area on January 24th, bringing with it winds up to 140 miles per hour. Especially hard hit were the communities of Deer Park and Pasadena. Homes and businesses were leveled, a nursing home evacuated, an animal shelter heavily damaged and a train flipped on its side by the storm. It was on the ground for about 18 miles and is the strongest tornado to hit Harris County in almost 21 years. The City of Deer Park recommends that anyone wishing to donate should first go through nearby disaster relief organizations such as the American Red Cross, Salvation Army, Texas Baptist Men Feeding Organization, Adventist Community Services, and Second Harvest Food Banks. The Pasadena Animal Shelter was also heavily and is in need of assistance.



TORNADO RELIEF

The Pasadena Animal Shelter was destroyed by a tornado that hit the city on January 24th. All dogs, cats, and people are safe, but they will need help in the coming days.

We reached out to The Seabreeze News Department of Downsizing and this is the information they did some research on. First, let's talk about new or used. The air conditioner units have about a two-year warranty and cost \$1300.00 or more to replace. BUY USED! Take a travel trailer technician with you when you choose a unit. His name will probably be Timmy the TT Tech and he will charge \$35.00 an hour. Oh, and when both air conditioners go out in the same week, that technician will charge you \$600.00 to install the units and it takes 3 hours. Damn, the kitchen has a leak. Here comes \$35.00 an hour Timmy!

You need to be able to move the unit. We live on the coast. During an evacuation there is nobody wanting to move your travel trailer. They are in evacuation mode also, except for Timmy. Yep! Timmy is going to steal what he can! The travel trailer is equipped with battery power for when the power goes out and you will have lights and a refrigerator till the battery dies. NO AC! but you will have propane heat till the battery dies. The thermostat is battery powered. Due to global warming, we are now having about three days a year like a Butternut, Wisconsin winter.



Snapchat- sharing photos, videos, and messages with other people. Once you view a message it is automatically deleted.




Holla- is an app that matches users with random strangers for video chat.

What is a MUD?

Municipal utility districts (or MUDs) are local governmental entities established by the State of Texas to provide public services to communities that are outside city limits. MUDs have a defined boundary and are typically established through an election process, though some (including San Leon) are established through legislative action. There are various types of districts with different purposes: water control and improvement, groundwater conservation, levee improvement, stormwater control, irrigation, and many more. Fun fact: San Leon was established by the legislature with the name "San Leon Municipal Utility District" but with the responsibilities and authority of a WCID (water control and improvement district).

Trash and Recycling Issues

The District is aware of the recent decline in service from Texas Pride and will be meeting with them to review our contract and ensure appropriate levels of service occur going forward.





HOWARD SEWELL






