MAYES MIDDLETON TO RUN FOR TEXAS SENATE


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

Dear Readers:

I want all our readers to be aware of this stuff called FENTANYL! This is very dangerous stuff because you may not know it's in your drug of choice. Some of us know people that get high, they don't bring it around us, but we know they get high. Fentanyl is a whole new game changer!! One of my friends passed away on December 8th. He died from a drug overdose, or so we all thought, until the toxicology report came back. He shot up some heroin that was laced with fentanyl! He did not OD. He was poisoned! There is now a serious criminal investigation ongoing into the matter.

Some of you wonder what is fentanyl? Why are people dying from this? How is it getting in drugs that have been around for years?" Fentanyl is similar to oxycontin or morphine, but fentanyl is 10,000 times stronger than morphine. It is used in the most extreme cases of pain management. A quarter of a teaspoon is enough to kill a person that has a low tolerance of pain killers.

In the last 10 years or so, the drug enforcement and law enforcement agencies have cracked down on doctors prescribing painkillers like oxycontin and hydrocodone. An individual can become addicted to painkillers within about 2 weeks. With the painkillers not being easily available, many people are turning to heroin. It is cheap and easy to find. Heroin dealers have figured out that they can cut their product with fentanyl and to their drug stronger and they make more money off of less product. They're also cutting cocaine and meth with this stuff as well as putting it in counterfeit pills. Anyone that gets high is actually risking their life every time they eat street pills, snort a line, or shoot up.

This drug has also made it into street opiates. If you have a toothache, go to the dentist. Do not take some of your old antibiotics and ask Sally down the road if she knows where you can get some painkillers. Those painkillers could be laced with fentanyl and that one pill can kill you.

If you or someone you know is selling laced pills or heroin, you need to think about the consequences. The one that is selling this stuff will face murder charges if and when someone dies from their product. If you know someone that is selling this crap and don't do anything about it, shame on you. If you have an addiction to pills or heroin, it's time to get help. If you don't have insurance, there are free programs out there. Please keep in mind that one shot or that one pill could be a death sentence.

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
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
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


San Leon MUD Update



Groundwater vs. Surface Water

Surface water is water that’s found on the surface of the planet, such as in rivers, lakes, or oceans. Groundwater is water held underground in the soil or in the pores and crevices in rock. So, what’s the big deal? Well, there has been a shift in recent years to more efficiently utilize the state’s surface water due to significant subsidence, especially in the greater Houston area (see map).




Subsidence is the gradual sinking of an area, in this case caused by the amount of water drawn out of the ground exceeding the amount of water being redeposited into the ground. By switching to surface water, we allow the hydrologic cycle to replenish the aquifers underground, mitigate subsidence, and prevent more serious flooding due to the decreased elevation of the area. 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

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
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JOHN WESLEY REDFIELD




BRIAN McCORMICK, SR.

On Saturday, December 18, 2021, Brian McCormick Sr., loving husband, father of four children, and grandfather of 13, passed away at the age of 81.

Brian was born on April 15, 1940, in Belfast, Northern Ireland to Robert and Mary (Campbell) McCormick. He grew up in a strong Catholic household on St. Katherine's Road in Belfast where he was the second youngest in his family of 11 kids. He worked hard even as a kid to help his family doing many odd jobs including delivering coal with his donkey and walking greyhounds from the dog track. He loved dogs and often brought home strays, or well, dogs that he considered strays. His mother was often surprised in the morning when finding a stray sleeping under her kitchen table. (Sometimes they didn't like anybody but Brian.) He was a scrapper with a bit of a temper and fought hard to defend his religion and family. He left school at the age of "14" to join the work force only to find out that he was actually 13 (he knew that-he just wasn't telling the school) and was called back to school for another year-which he hated. Once again in the work force, he had an accident in the factory where he worked resulting in the loss of sight in his right eye which has never slowed him down. He left the factory and began work as a pork butcher at Belfast Food Products when he was 17.

He visited the United States for the first time in 1959 to visit his sister, Bridie, and fell in love with it. He immigrated permanently in 1962 to pursue the American Dream. He came through Ellis Island on the Queen Mary, and he began work as a butcher. In 1964, he met Betty Sassman. They were married on Friday, November 13, 1964. They had a small service at their local Catholic church. Since it was Friday the 13th they were told they could not have music. Their friends and family hummed "Here Comes the Bride" as Betty walked down the aisle. They settled in New Jersey, and he became a union electrician working in both New York and New Jersey. Eventually, they moved to California and the warmer weather. Together they raised four children: Brian Jr., Erin, Michael, and Seamus. In California he began working in the aircraft industry supporting the building of many famous aircraft including his favorite the B2. He worked at both Lockheed Martin and Northrop Grumman with top secret clearances.



Brian was the life of any and every party. He was loved by all and cherished for his sense of humor and religious devotion. He treasured his Irish heritage and instilled a love for all things Irish in his family. Many Friday or Saturday nights were spent at his sister Bridie's house in Covina singing Irish songs and reminiscing about the old country. He loved to sing! However, he was not blessed with the best voice-which didn't slow him down a bit. He sang loud and proud (the verses he could remember) waving his arms in the air and loving every moment. Finishing a fair number of choruses with "Bring me another beer!" His weekends always ended with the entire family piled into a pew at mass-where he continued to sing.

He was always up for an adventure- leaving his country: moving across his new country, traveling the world, enjoying over 20 cruises. Many of his trips were with his children and grandchildren. He traveled to Alaska, Las Vegas, Germany, Ireland, England, France, Italy, Vatican City, Amsterdam, Mexico, the Caribbean (to name a few) all the while entertaining his grandchildren and making everyone laugh.
