Texas City Man Sentenced to 20 Years

On March 11th, 2020, Talvin Djuan Garley of Texas City was found guilty by a Galveston County jury of Aggravat-

ed Assault with a deadly weapon and Unlawful Possession of a Firearm by a felon. On June 11th, 2020, Judge John Ellison sentenced Mr. Garley to 20 years confinement at TDCJ. The charges stemmed from an event in March of 2018 when Mr. Garley approached the victim's vehicle and started an argument. Witnesses



testified that Garley was agitated, confrontational and called the victim derogatory names. They then observed Garley brandishing a firearm and fire at the vehicle approximately five times while the victim was in close proximity. Mr. Garley will be eligible for parole after serving 10 years in TDCJ.

BARS ORDERED CLOSED AGAIN

On June 26th, just one day after temporarily pausing reopening plans, Texas Governor Gregg Abbott issued an executive order at 10:00 a.m. that all bars in Texas would be required to shut down effective at 12 noon that day. The order came about as a result of the state experiencing a substantial spike in COVID-19 cases. "As I said from the start, if the positivity rate rose about 10% the State of Texas would take further action to mitigate the spread of COVID-19," Abbott said in a statement.

As well as bars, the order also includes activities such as rafting and tubing which must be closed immediately. Public gatherings of more than 100 or more people must be approved by local governments, with some unspecified exemptions. Religious services, local government operations, child-care services, and youth camps do not have occupancy limits. The 50% occupancy limit does not apply to personal care businesses that operate with at least six feet of social distancing between workstations such as hair salons, barber shops nails salons, tanning salons, tattoo studios, and piercing studios as well as others.

Restaurants who had been operating at 75% capacity may remain open but must now limit occupancy to 50% of total listed indoor occupancy. It is not known at this time when the order will be lifted.

San Leon Cemetery Turns 100

The San Leon Cemetery has been in existence since the 1890s when San Leon was known as North Galveston. Some of the earliest burials known include possibly several Mexican soldiers killed during the Battle of San Jacinto, Civil War Veterans, and victims of the 1900 and 1915 Storms. More recently, it is the resting place of soldiers from World War I, World War II, the Korean War and the Vietnam War.

In 1920, Joe Eagle deeded the old community burial grounds of the cemetery as well as the entire

Block 1 to the residents of San Leon for use as a community cemetery. After an attempt in the 1950s by one of Joe Eagle's family members to reclaim the cemetery as unused, the San Leon **Cemetery Committee** was formed with the help of the Galveston County Commissioner's Court. The committee is comprised of members of the community and their goal is to preserve the history of the cemetery as well as upkeep, maintenance and repairs. In a longstanding tradition, a fish fry is held once a year to raise funds. For many years the

fish was provided by local anglers who donated their catch.

As you stroll through the cemetery you will find many different unique and interesting markers and monuments. There are angels, a cross with military boots and helmet, a man fishing in a rowboat, a guitar case just to name a few. There are also many veteran's graves here as a testament to the patriotic nature of our local men and women. The Committee strives to recognize and honor them by placing flags at each grave on special days such as Memorial Day and Veteran's Day. You will also find many names you recognize or have heard before. The Janner family, The Garney family, and others. Very often multiple generations of families rest peacefully there.

Although the members of the committee change as time goes by, the desire to improve the cemetery stays the same. It was through committees that the ga-

zebo and pavilion were built, the driveway and sidewalk created, the memorial wall, new picket fencing along the front, and new vinyl coated chain link fencing along the 21st and 22nd Street sides. Every resident of San Leon may receive a burial plot at no charge. The only requirement is that you are a resident of San Leon for at least six months prior to passing.







San Leon MUD Update



San Leon and the nation are being impacted by COVID-19. The San Leon MUD is here to offer assistance to those in the community in this time of need. There have been no cut offs for non-payment in March, April & May, but cuts offs for non-payment have resumed as the nation and the county return to regular operations. Please contact the office to arrange payment if your account is not current.

Answers to Frequently Asked Questions

There have been a number of questions brought up to the District, both in person and online, so we wanted to take some time to address those in a broader forum in the event other residents in the community had similar questions or concerns.

Why are we expanding the wastewater treatment plant? Is it really necessary?

Chapter 305.126 of the Texas Administrative Code states: "whenever flow measurements for any sewage treatment plant in the state reaches 75% of the permitted average daily or annual average flow for three consecutive months, the permittee must initiate engineering and financial planning for expansion and/or upgrading of the wastewater treatment and/or collection facilities. Whenever the average daily or annual average flow reaches 90% of the permitted average daily flow for three consecutive months, the permittee shall obtain necessary authorization from the commission to commence construction of the necessary additional treatment and/or collection facilities." The District's flows have exceeded the state permitted discharge in 2017, 2018, and 2019. While the TCEQ worked with the District to allow time to reduce inflow and infiltration (I&I), the mitigation efforts were not enough due to growth in the community and deterioration of our aging system, so the expansion was deemed necessary.

Why did the cost estimates for the expansion differ so much from the bids?

The estimates to expand the treatment plant were developed by the District's engineering firm and confirmed to be accurate by an independent construction firm that was not bidding on the project. Those estimates came in at \$19,736,500 and resulted in a bond proposal last May to sell \$22,750,000 to cover the construction estimate and \$3,013,500 in capitalized interest, State and TCEQ fees, and insurance. The vote passed 64.69% for and 35.31% against, enabling the District to sell the bonds necessary to expand the treatment plant in compliance with State of Texas requirements. The District's tax rate was increased from \$0.45 to \$0.63 to offset the debt obligation incurred by the bond sale, an increase in \$0.18 per \$100 of taxable value. (Prior to that increase, the District tax rate had not

changed since 2007.) Sealed bids were opened on June 4, 2020, and vetting of the contractors was performed including construction cost analysis, completed project history, and general ability to successfully complete the project on time. After discussion with the contractors regarding the low bids, it was determined that the cost of construction materials had decreased since the initial estimates were performed, plus many companies were forced to lower their costs in order to stay in business and retain their experienced staff due to the COVID situation. The winning bid from LEM Construction Co, Inc. came in at \$12,187,876.20 compared to the original estimate of \$19,736,500.

What happens to the extra bond money that is no longer needed for the expansion?

Once the treatment plant is completed, the District will be able to apply to the TCEQ to reallocate those funds towards other projects in the District. Our capital improvement plan has projects lined out to improve our infrastructure and reduce our monthly I&I expense. The District could potentially even reduce our tax rate in the future by pre-paying some of the outstanding bond indebtedness at its September 1, 2026 call date.

What else is being done to improve the financial status of the District?

As mentioned in April's meeting, the District is moving forward with refunding the 2013 bonds, which will result in a savings of approximately \$700,000 in interest. More details will be available as the refunding process nears completion in the future. Director Tyson Kennedy is the Pricing Officer for this project.

Can anything be done about my increasing taxes?

While Galveston Central Appraisal District is the entity who assesses home values, you can always verify the exemptions you have on file with them as the District offers two exemptions to residents that can reduce the amount of your MUD taxes. Please contact Andrew at the MUD office for more details.

Is there a way to stay informed about District operations and meetings?

The District meetings are open to the public and held on the third Wednesday of every month at 6:30 PM. Agendas can be found three days before the meeting at the MUD office or online at www.slmud.org. Always be sure to check our website or Facebook page for the most accurate and up to date information.







SCOUTS & AMERICAN LEGION HOST FLAG RETIREMENT CEREMONY

Boy Scout Troop 2322 partnered with the American Legion Post 291 in San Leon on Flag Day for a Flag Retirement Ceremony. Flags were collected or dropped off at the American Legion for proper disposal.

The Ceremony for Disposal of Unserviceable Flags was first passed by a resolution in 1937 by the 19th National Convention of the American Legion in New York and has been a ritual since that date. The purpose of the resolution was to encourage proper respect for the Flag of the United States and to provide for disposal in a dignified manner. It was also recommended that Flag Day was the most appropriate day to hold the ceremony.

The following, taken from the American Legion Manual of Ceremonies, reads in part:

"A Flag may be a flimsy bit of printed gauze, or a beautiful banner of finest silk. Its intrinsic value may be trifling or great; but its real value is beyond price, for it is a precious symbol of all that we and our comrades have worked for and lived for, and died for a free Nation of free men, true to the faith of the past, devoted to the ideals and practice of Justice, Freedom, and Democracy.

Following the ceremony that included a color guard, and officers of the Post, Scouts from Troop 2322 each in turn draped the unserviceable flags, one at a time, over a metal rod and they were lowered into the fire pit. The event was open to the public and was well-attended by the community.


