Gracie made hair appointments for both ladies for June 15th with Gina Rivers out of Baytown. She is a stylist that does a lot of SHS ladies and donates her time when the SHS brothers and sisters shave their heads as part of a fundraiser for the Angels battling cancer.

In May, Saragin called Gracie to remind her to go to Bass Pro Shop to get her reel restrung. The ladies never discussed a fishing license because years ago they both started getting a year-to-date license in October which would cover both tournaments.

June 1st, Gracie calls Saragin and they discuss how they both got their reels restrung, the shirts were done, what they were getting done to their hair and nails. Oh yes, those girls get the mani-pedi, the whole nine yards. After all, the rest of the 100-plus women fishing the tournament are all getting their nails, toes and hair done too.

On June 15th, the ladies meet up and go to visit Gina at Texas Tangles in Baytown. They both got highlights with a few pink ones, which pretty much took all day. Saragin and Gracie decided to meet up at noon on the 16th to go get their manicures and gel nails put on. They went to Academy and went through the fishing section to look for cool new gadgets. On the 17th, they meet up for the captains meeting and Daryle and Darell are at the meeting. You see, Daryle and Darell are also on the fishing team. The two guys spent the day going over their fishing gear and buying beer.

The ladies told The Seabreeze News that they were very proud to fish the SHS tournament year after year. It is as money going to a good cause and they get to meet up and fish.

Conditions have really improved but still hot and dry. Lots of fish are being caught in deeper water due to the hot weather. Fishermen who are targeting flounder seem to be doing well both gigging and rod and reel, mostly around some type of structure. Live shrimp is always a good choice of bait. I use gulp white grub and do very well with it.

The jetties this time of year still seems to be a good choice for fishing. I like to fish around the boat cut inside and outside, check it out. The best time to go fishing is early morning or under lights. Be sure to drink lots of water while out in the sun, beer just won't do it.

Smart Irrigation Month

Yards can quickly die in the brutal Texas heat if not adequately watered, but overwatering can also drown the yard, resulting in shallow roots and decreased resilience. Most lawns only need about 1" of water per week to stay green and healthy. Place a few empty tuna cans around your lawn while you're watering and measure how long it takes your sprinkler to fill them with a half-inch of water. Then, try watering that amount of time twice a week, gauge how your landscape responds, and adjust based on weather conditions. Also, try to avoid watering in the middle of the day when the hot sun will evaporate much of the water before it can get to thirsty plants. For more tips, visit https://takecareoftexas.org/water


the love of her life, Roger Mack Traugott and they were blessed with three beautiful sons, Jason, Roger (Bubba), and Eric.




