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SAN LEON MUD BOARD INCUMBANTS PREVAIL

After a very long and very contentious campaign, the citizens of San Leon made their voices known loud and clear and have elected the incumbent MUD Board Directors for a two-year term. Board President Kelly Neason, Board Treasurer Sheryl Hayslip-Bahena, and Board Director Curtis Anderson handed an embarrassing loss to the other candidates winning by a landslide. Each of the incumbents garnered just over 300 votes each with the next closest vote-getter, Spencer Markle, receiving 113 votes. Newcomer Caleb Cristofaro collected just 60 votes but has a very bright future perhaps in upcoming elections. David Jetelina and Phillip Haskett were able to only gather a meager 76 and 66 votes respectively. Jetelina and Haskett's smear tactics clearly were ineffective. Also on that ballot were two statewide proposals. Proposition 1, the Property Tax Limit Reduction for Elderly and Disabled Residents Amendment which supported amending the state constitution to authorize the state legislature to reduce the property tax limit for school maintenance and operations taxes imposed on the homesteads of elderly or disabled residents to reflect any tax rate reduction enacted by law from the preceding tax year. Proposition 2 the Increased Homestead Exemption for School District Property Taxes Amendment which supported increasing the homestead exemption for school district property taxes from \$25,000 to \$40,000. Both items passed overwhelmingly.

In another hotly contested race in the Texas runoff election held on May 23rd, Teri Leo Wilson won decisively over candidate Patrick Gurski with 15 percent more votes. Ms. Wilson campaigned tirelessly in her district, especially in the San Leon/Bayview area, and her win is well-deserved. She will be running in November against Democratic candidate Keith Henry to fill the District 23 Texas Representative seat vacated by Mayes Middleton. Mr. Middleton won his race and is now a Texas State Senator. Winners in the runoff also include Ken Paxton for Attorney General, Wayne Christian for Railroad Commissioner, Dawn Buckingham for General Land Office Commissioner, who will face Democratic opponents in November. Also winning her race for Precinct Chair 151 was San Leon resident, Robin Burke.

WHAT VOLUNTEER WILL PUT YOUR HOUSE FIRE OUT?

In Galveston County there are about 20 volunteer fire departments. Some of you might ask yourselves, what does a volunteer fire department do? I was able to speak to Chief Ken Keller at the San Leon Volunteer Fire Department and learned that there are five people on the Executive Board, four line officers, ten firefighters, two support personnel, and two cadets. Every one of those men and women are volunteers. No one is employed by The Volunteer Fire Department. These men and women have jobs that support them and their families, some are firefighters at other fire stations, some work for the water department, and some go to school. The cadets are not 18 years old yet so they can't go on fire calls yet. They are going through the training program so when they are 18, they will be trained firefighters. San Leon has had 100% volunteers since 1955. To become a member of the San Leon VFD, you must be at least 15 years old. 15- to 17-year-olds are considered Cadets. At age 18 you can become a regular member. You need to fill out an application and be a licensed driver in good standing with no felonies. After acceptance of your application, you can begin to join fire department functions until your training session begins.



There are two training periods per year. The training program is about six weeks long. After completing the training you become a probationary firefighter until you've completed a year of service and then you can become a firefighter.

The Chief told me that \$10.00 is applied to everyone's water bill monthly to support the cost of running the firehouse, maintaining the fire trucks, and purchasing updated equipment to keep the firefighters safe. \$10.00 a month is well worth someone's piece of mind knowing that some professional firefighters will be showing up to put a house fire out. Another piece of information that I was told by the Chief is that the average response time for them to drop what they are doing, get to the firehouse, and make it to a burning structure is six minutes. That is the average response time, there are probably some instances that it may take a little longer, but six minutes is pretty impressive.

During a structure fire the average person is running away from the fire. These men and women are running to the fire. It's not as easy as, "Just put some water on it!" (a comment that was posted on one of those nextdoor apps). The Seabreeze's response to that is stupid is as stupid does! There are many things to consider when the firefighters pull up to a structure fire, such as where's the nearest water source? Is there anyone in the structure? There is so much they have to do to make sure the firefighters are safe. There was a comment by someone that said, "If they would have been there three minutes earlier, they could have saved that RV." Beach, please. What are they going to do to save half of an RV? If you have an RV and it catches on fire, get your pets and get out!

If you live in these towns in Galveston County, you have a VOLUNTEER fire department. Bacliff, Bayou Vista, Crystal Beach, Dickinson Station 1 & 2, Friendswood, Gilcrest, High Island, Hitchcock, Jamaica Beach, League City Stations 1, 2, 3, 4 & 5, Santa Fe (Orchard), Port Bolivar, San Leon, and Tiki Island. Stop in and say hi, bring them some donuts, and go to their monthly meetings and get to know these wonderful men and women. Remember they are volunteers. They don't have to risk their lives to save yours. This is in their blood and their passion.

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

Brush Bundling & Debris Removal

With hurricane season here, be sure to clean up your property, removing any debris that may block drainage or become projectiles in the event of high winds. While Galveston County is not responsible for picking up brush or debris, Texas Pride will pick up brush that's placed in clear, individual piles measuring no larger than 3' x 3' x 3' or tied and bundled and under 50 pounds.





Recommended Items to Include in a Basic Emergency Supply Kit:

- Water and non-perishable food for several days
- Extra cell phone battery or charger
- Battery-powered or hand crank radio that can receive NOAA Weather Radio tone alerts and extra batteries
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- First aid kit
- Whistle to signal for help
- Dust mask, to help filter contaminated air and plastic sheeting and duct tape to shelter-in-place
- Moist towelettes, garbage bags and plastic ties for personal sanitation
- Non-sparking wrench or pliers to turn off utilities
- Can opener (if kit contains canned food)
- Local maps

FEMA's Ready Campaign educates and empowers Americans to take some simple steps to prepare for and respond to potential emergencies, including those from natural hazards and man-made disasters. Ready asks individuals to do three key things: get an emergency supply kit, make a family emergency plan, and be informed about the different types of emergencies that could occur and appropriate responses. Everyone should have some basic supplies on hand in order to survive several days if an emergency occurs. This list of emergency supply kit items is only a starting point. It is important that individuals review this list and consider the unique needs of their family, including pets, for items to include. Individuals should also consider having at least two emergency supply kits, one full kit at home and smaller portable kits in their workplace, vehicle or other places they spend time.




Atlantic Basin Hurricane Tracking Chart



OUTDOOR BURNING RULE & CHECKLIST (TITLE 30 TAC 111.201-111.221)

Exception Registration

Outdoor burning is prohibited in the State of Texas except under certain conditions. Please complete this checklist to determine if your proposed burn site will meet the stipulations of exemption. When completed, this document will be sent to the local fire and law enforcement officials having jurisdiction over your burn location to notify them that you intend to conduct an outdoor burn. Any variation from the conditions listed below will constitute an illegal burn and make the burner subject to fines for violating State Burning Laws. In all cases, the burner is ultimately liable for damages, injuries, or other consequences that may result from burning.

I will not burn electrical insulation, treated lumber, plastics, non-wood construction/demolition materials, heavy oils, asphaltic materials, potentially explosive materials, chemical wastes, and items containing natural or synthetic rubber. 
